(b) The appropriation of \$20,436,889 in subsection (a) herein, shall be included as part of the FY 1995 budget amount for purposes of calculating the average budget for the preceding three years pursuant to 17 GCA §3102(i).

Section 2. Audit. The Office of the Public Auditor shall cause an independent audit to be performed on the Department of Education. The audit shall cover the period of Fiscal Years 1993, 1994 and 1995. The Office of the Public Auditor shall request the assistance of the Department of Defense in providing the results of any audit, statement, or report completed with reference to Department of Defense funds during Fiscal Years 1993, 1994 and 1995, to the Department of Education. The Office of the Public Auditor shall determine the amount necessary to accomplish the audit and such sums are hereby appropriated from the revenues to be collected during Fiscal Year 1996. A report of the results of the audit shall be transmitted to the Legislature within 30 days of completion of the audit.

Section 3. Austerity Plan. (a) The Board of Education shall submit to the Legislature an austerity plan to streamline the services of the department. The plan shall contain measures which develop and delineate cost-cutting and/or cost containment measures, to include reorganization, which are

aimed at eliminating waste, abuse or misallocation of resources that are charged or allocated to the Department of Education. The plan shall be prepared and submitted to the 23rd Guam Legislature for the purpose of analyzing future Department of Education expenditures and budget requirements. The austerity plan shall be incorporated into the Department of Education's Fiscal Year 1996 budget request and transmitted on or before July 31, 1995.

(b) The Department of Administration, the Bureau of Budget & Management Research and the Civil Service Commission shall conduct a joint review with the Department of Education on its procurement, personnel, payroll and accounting functions. The findings and recommendations shall serve as the basis for instituting greater efficiency and accountability in each of the functions. The review shall be completed within sixty (60) days of the enactment into law of this legislation. A copy of the findings and recommendations shall be transmitted to the 23rd Guam Legislature on or before August 15, 1995.

Section 4. Five Percent (5%) transfer authority. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for Fiscal Year 1995 the Governor is authorized to transfer from one appropriation of the Executive Branch to another appropriation of the Executive Branch; provided, that not more than Five Percent (5%) of the funds of any department or agency shall be transferred out of the department or agency; provided, further, that notice of each transfer and justification therefore are delivered by the end of the month in which the transfer takes place to the Speaker of the Legislature and that no transfer shall be permitted in which funds are transferred out of the budgets for the Department of Education, the Guam Community College, and the University of Guam."



Dear Speaker Parkinson:

Attached please find a draft bill that was prepared to address the concerns of the educational community regarding the budget crunch which is now upon us for the remainder of Fiscal Year 1995.

Unfortunately, Substitute Bill No. 8 combined educational appropriations with a highly controversial hiring freeze. Although the needs of education, as presented in Substitute Bill No. 8, have had a public hearing, the provisions of the hiring freeze did not. Additionally, Substitute Bill No. 8 was irregularly transmitted to the Executive without the necessary eleven (11) votes as required by law.

Before my return to island I had planned to call a Special Session to address the needs of education. I also planned to address the call for a hiring freeze, however this concept still needs public hearing.

I understand that the Legislature now has another bill, Bill No. 272, which will address the needs of education as previously set out in Substitute Bill No. 8. The attached bill is transmitted for the Legislature's consideration in addressing the educational issue.



The Office of the Public Auditor shall determine the amount necessary to accomplish the audit and such sums are hereby appropriated from the revenues to be collected during Fiscal Year 1996. A report of the results of the audit shall be transmitted to the Legislature within 30 days of completion of the audit.

Section 3. Austerity Plan. (a) The Board of Education shall submit to the Legislature an austerity and reorganization plan to streamline the services of the department. The plan shall contain measures which develop and delineate cost-cutting and/or cost containment provisions which are aimed at eliminating waste, abuse or misallocation of resources, human or otherwise, that are charged or allocated to the Department of Education. The plan shall be prepared and submitted to the 23rd Guam Legislature for the purpose of analyzing future Department of Education expenditures and budget requirements. The austerity plan shall be incorporated into the Department of Education's Fiscal Year 1996 budget request and transmitted on or before July 31, 1995.

(b) The Department of Administration, the Bureau of Budget & Management Research and the Civil Service Commission shall conduct a joint review with the Department of Education on its procurement, personnel, payroll and accounting functions. The findings and recommendations shall serve as the basis for instituting greater efficiency and accountability in each of the functions. The review shall be completed within sixty (60) days of the enactment into law of this legislation. A copy of the

- findings and recommendations shall be transmitted to the 23rd
- Guam Legislature on or above August 15, 1995.
