Dear Speaker Nelson:

Enclosed please find a copy of Substitute Bill No. 266 (LS), "AN ACT TO AMEND §8170(a) OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE GUAM LEGISLATURE", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 23-33.

This bill has been signed into law with the understanding that subsequent legislation will provide corrections to the language clarifying the intent of the bill.

The intent of the bill is to base the retirement annuity of senators, as is done for other government of Guam employees, on their Average Annual Salary computed as an average of their three (3) highest years of government service, whether or not served as a senator. This replaces the former provisions of law which allowed senators to accrue retirement credit based on the salary of the Director of the Department of Administration. Since former senators paid into the Retirement Fund based on the salary of the Director of the Department of Administration rather than their salary as senator, the intent is to offer current and former senators the option of using the salary of the Director of the Department of Administration in the computation of the Average Annual Salary, or using the actual salary received as a senator in this computation.

This bill is essentially the same as Substitute Bill No. 127, previously passed by the Legislature and vetoed on May 31, 1995 because the bill's language did not take into account the situation of former senators who have not yet retired from government service.



Although language has been inserted into Substitute Bill No. 266 to include former senators, there is still a lack of clarification concerning the reference point in time to apply the provisions of the bill to former senators, since the provisions upon which they contributed to the fund as senators would be repealed at the time of their subsequent retirement.

In order to rectify any misconceptions of the intent of this legislation, three changes need to be made, which are set out below.

- 1. The Executive recommends that the following language be inserted in Subsection (a) of §8170 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, either in item (3) as contained in this legislation, or as a separate item (5):
 - "Anyone who is not currently a senator but who has served as a senator prior to the effective date of this Subsection may, at their option at the time of their retirement, have their Average Annual Salary computed based on the amount of contributions based on the salary of the Director of the Department of Administration which they paid in according to the provisions of Subsection (a) of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, prior to the effective date of this Subsection, or may have their Average Annual Salary computed based on the provisions of this Subsection."
- 2. The Executive also recommends that item (4) of Subsection (a) of §8170 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, amended in this legislation, be further amended to read:
 - "(4) The Retirement Fund shall allow any [former or] incumbent Legislator who desires not to receive the benefits [as vested under 4 GCA §8170(a) prior to the effective date of this Act,] of having retirement credit for time served as a senator prior to the effective date of this Subsection to be computed based on the salary of the Director of the Department of Administration to permanently and irrevocably divest himself or herself thereof. Any election to divest must be in writing and, at the option of the incumbent Senator, may be effective retroactive either to [dates appropriate to the Legislator] the date that the incumbent senator first took office, or to January 2, 1995. Nothing herein shall have the effect of divesting [a former or] an incumbent Senator of any rights without his or her consent."
- 3. Last, the Executive recommends that language be included which clarifies that senators elected in the future, after enactment of this legislation, would not have the option to base their Average Annual Salary upon the salary of the Director of the Department of Administration. A new item should be added to read:



"(6) Any person who becomes a senator for the first time after the effective date of this Subsection shall have their Average Annual Salary computed as provided for in item (3) of this Subsection."

I am happy that the Legislature has attempted to follow the sentiment of the voters in paring down those items in legislation which are more costly than necessary. This legislation would alleviate some small part of the burden on the Government of Guam Retirement Fund.

I await the amendments to this legislation as outlined above, to fully implement the legislative intent.



4) The Retirement Fund shall allow any past or incumbent Legislator who desires not to receive the benefits vested under Title 4 GCA Section 8170(a) to permanently and irrevocably divest himself thereof. An election to divest must be in writing and may be effective retroactive to dates appropriate to the Legislator. Nothing herein shall have the effect of divesting past or incumbent Senators of any rights without his or her consent.

Dear Speaker Parkinson:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 127 (LS), "AN ACT TO AMEND \$8170(a) OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE GUAM LEGISLATURE", which I have vetoed.

This bill changes the base salary upon which the retirement of senators is calculated. Presently, senators retirement annuity is based upon the salary of the Director of the Department of Administration, if that is higher than another salary upon which the individual senator can base his or her retirement benefits.

The goal of this legislation is in keeping with public sentiment concerning salary and benefits of senators, and I am in favor of the bill. Unfortunately, I am unable to approve and sign this bill into law because of inequities contained within the bill with regard to former senators who are not yet eligible for retirement due to lack of required years of government service. The bill contains provisions to take care of those persons who are current senators. Regretfully, it neglects to make provision for those persons who are not yet retired and who are former senators.

Over the years, former senators, while they were current senators, have paid personal contributions into the Government of Guam Retirement Fund

at a rate equal to that required of the Director of the Department of Administration. At the time that they were senators, this was the correct and legal rate. This bill makes no provision to handle the situation of former senators, and subjects these former senators to possible legal disputes regarding the calculation of their future retirement annuities.



A Public Hearing was held on Thursday, March 23, 1995, at 10:00a.m. by the Committee on Ways & Means to discuss Bill #127. The hearing was held in the Public Hearing Room in the Legislative Building in Agana.

WITNESSES PRESENT

Michele B. Santos, Acting Director, Government of Guam Retirement Fund, Mr. Joseph Torres, Acting Deputy Director, Government of Guam Retirement Fund, and Mr. Lorenzo Quichocho, General Accounting Supervisor, Government of Guam Employees Retirement Fund.

TESTIMONY/QUESTIONS/COMMENTS

Mrs. Michele B. Santos offered both written and oral testimony on behalf of the Retirement Fund Division in support of Bill #127, stating that it would right an injustice and an inequity in the application of retirement benefits afforded only to members of the Legislature. She stated that the Retirement Fund premises are based upon actual earnings and that no exceptions should be made in order for it to be equitable to all Government of Guam employees.

On April 3, 1995, Senator Francis E. Santos recieved a letter from Senator Joanne Browne, the principal sponsor of Bill #127 requesting that the original bill be substituted with an ammended version of the bill, as prepared by Senator E. Barrett-Anderson.

RECOMMENDATION

Based on these findings the Committee on Ways and Means recommends that the ammended version of Bill #127 be reported out to the full Legislature with the recommendation to pass.

The Retirment Fund is authorized by rule and regulation to adopt procedures to allow any incumbent Legislator who desires not to 21 receive the benefits as vested under 4 GCA §8107(a), to permanently 22

divest themselves thereof. Any election to divest may be effective

retroactive to dates appropriate to the incumbent Legislator."

## AN ACT TO AMEND 4 GCA OF 8170(a) RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE GUAM LEGISLATURE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Title 4 Guam Code Annotated Section 8170 is hereby amended to read:

"Section 8170. Members of the Legislature. The provisions of this Chapter shall apply to any person who has served as a member of the Legislature or who shall hereafter serve as such a member and any such person shall be considered a member of the Fund entitled to all the benefits of a member based upon the following additional provisions: to any person who holds an elected office in the Guam Legislature;

a. Definitions and Rules of Construction. For purposes of this Chapter, the following definitions and rules of constructions shall apply to members of the Legislature:

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- 1) Legislature means the Guam Legislature created by the Organic Act of Guam;
- 1) <u>Legislator means any person who holds an elected</u>
  17 <u>office in the Guam Legislature.</u>
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2) Service as a member of the Legislature during regular session for any one (1) calendar year shall be deemed a full year of service, regardless of the length of the session;

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Average annual salary for any member of the Legislature shall mean the average of the three (3) highest annual salaries received by a -member Legislator during his years of credited service, whether or not with the Legislature .or an amount equivalent to the annual compensation paid the Director of Administration at the time the Legislator applies for benefits, whichever is greater; provided, however, that effective January 1, 1978, whenever the annual compensation of the Director of Administration exceeds the annual compensation of the members of the Legislature, the contributions of the Legislators shall be based on the annual compensation of the Director of Administration. Any Legislator holding office for the first time on the effective date of this act shall, by written election filed with the Government of Guam Retirement Fund within 30 days of enactment, of this law, elect whether or not to continue under the benefits of the prior law. Any Legislator who at the time of enactment of this law, has served in any prior term, or any Legislator who is subsequently reelected into the Legislature after having served in any prior term, shall be deemed vested under the prior law,

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Section 2. This Act shall become effective nun pro tunc to January 2, 1995, and any election made pursuant to Section 1 shall take effect on the same date. The Government of Guam Retirement Fund shall make any necessary adjustments to comply with this statute.

Dear Mr. Chairman:

My name is Michele B. Santos, Acting Director of the Retirement Fund, and I appear before you today to testify against the passage of Bill No. 127, on behalf of the Retirement Fund Division.

Bill No. 127 proposes to simplify the language of Section 8170 and attempts to right the inequity afforded only to the elite minority as to retirement credits. The Retirement Fund opposes any legislation that would allow Government of Guam employees, whether it be legislative, executive, or judicial branch, to be provided with an option to receive retirement credit for compensation not received or entitled to.

While Bill No. 127 proposes to simplify the language of Section 8170(a) and attempts to right the inequity only afforded the legislators, the proposed bill, as written, closes the door on all future elected legislators yet provides the current legislators and past legislators upon re-election, with a side-step avenue called "option" to continue receiving retirement credits to an amount equivalent to the annual compensation paid to the Director of Administration, which is higher than compensation paid the legislators.

The Retirement premises are based upon years of service, actual earnings and contributions paid. The language contained in this bill circumnavigates the actual compensation earned premises.

Once again, the Retirement Fund Division strongly opposes the passage of Bill No. 127, as written.

#### Comments on Bill No.127:

While the bill's proposal appears to be administrative in nature, a fiscal impact nonetheless, would be eminent, in the form of reduction in contributions to the Government Retirement fund.

Actual impact would be premature at this time, since the Bill would make a legislator's membership in the retirement system, optional.

With regards to the de-linking of legislators' salary from that of the Director of Administration's (DOA) salary for the purposes of annuity computations, this would appear to be a wash between those members that would qualify for higher annuities (than a DOA Director-based annuity) and those that are limited to the legislature's current salaries.

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TESTIMONY ON BILL NO. 127. "AN ACT TO AMEND 4 GCA OF 8170(A) RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE GUAM LEGISLATURE."

At the request of Ms. Rowena Perez, Chief of Staff of Senator Joanne Brown's office, I am submitting testimony in favor of this bill, although I would recommend different language to achieve the same or similar effects. The favorable effects of this bill are as follows:

## 1. ELIMINATES A DISCRIMINATORY PROVISION WHICH BENEFITS ONLY ONE CLASS OF EMPLOYEES.

The current provision, allowing members of the legislature to contribute to the Retirement Fund at the salary rate of the Director of Administration, rather than on the actual salary of the legislative Member or Senator, is highly discriminatory. I suspect, although I am not certain, that it violates ERISA provisions regarding highly compensated employees, as well certain IRS and DOL provisions regarding the same topic. Although governmental units are exempt from many of the provisions of ERISA, IRS and DoL, I believe that the trend is to bring more aspects of public pension plans within the reaches of these laws. At the very least, these laws and the case law emanating from them are persuasive in cases before the courts involving pensions. It appears that a law that provides for preferential treatment of one class of employees is facially in violation of the Equal Protection clause of the U.S. Constitution.

The practical effect of this provision is that it allows Members of the Legislature, who have served for three years or a term and a half, to use a salary base in the defined benefit formula or computation that would give them a higher annuity than they actually earned. In the case of those Members who have served in the government for at least 25 years, their annuity will be higher than their salary during their years of active membership. This is quite unusual.

#### 2. OTHER METHODS ARE AVAILABLE.

Numerous systems attempt to provide special compensation for elective positions but this method is not one of them. It is highly unusual to index someone's contribution rate to someone else's salary. Other more logical methods would be to increase the actual salary of Members because the position is honorary, like a judge; or to shorten the period of service required before full retirement, like with judges or uniformed personnel. The analogy here is that one position is honorary and difficult to attain, since most people would agree that it is not easy to be elected once and even more difficult to repeat that feat many times over; while in the case of

uniformed personnel, the position is inherently hazardous; so both are rewarded by shortening the length of service required before full retirement, which is best defined as a percentage of set salary or average rather than the current language, without any reductions. Other deferred compensation programs can be offered to Members that would offer tax deferment and the potential to earn a second, possibly higher retirement annuity. The area of other deferred compensation programs that could be offered to GovGuam employees as additional incentive has heretofore been largely ignored or neglected. Some systems use these programs as an alternative to COLA.

### 3. ELIMINATES A BUDGETARY PROBLEM.

The funding requirement in a defined benefit plan is specified as a percentage of covered payroll or salary. When the legislative committee or budget officer draws up the legislative budget, if the actual salary of the Members is used in computing the benefits (e.g. retirement contributions - government and employees' shares), there will be a shortfall of close to a million dollars (plus or minus \$200,000) for the two year period or one term (using the figure of \$74,000 for the DoA Director's salary and \$55,000 for each senator's salary and using the rate of roughly 17.70% for government contribution rate and 9.5% for employee's share).

## OTHER COMMENTS REGARDING THE SUGGESTED LANGAUGE:

1. If you repeal the definition of "legislature" and replace it with "Legislator", you have to go back and clean up the rest of the language in Section 8170 and any other section referring to the Members of the Legislature. Rather, I would add another word to be defined after the first definition of Legislature:

Section 8170. Members of the Legislature.

(a) (1) Legislature means the Guam legislature created by the OrganicAct of Guam. "Member", "Senator", "Legislator" are synonyms referring to a person gaining a seat in the Legislature as a result of a general or special election.

I would add another word to define, "elected officials" to mean any person elected to a public office, except for a delegate to constitutional convention, a member of the Board of education or other elective Board or Commission, in accordance with an election duly held in the Territory; provided that the person receives compensation, pay or salary for such office.

The word elected official is used n 2 GCA 1120 (b).

As for the last part of the bill [ definition of average annual salary and effective date of the act], I would like to submit my testimony at a later date, a few days after the hearing so that I can work on different language and provide rationale.

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Average annual salary for any member of the Legislature shall mean the average of the three (3) highest annual salaries received by a member Legislator during his years of credited service, whether or not with the Legislature. or an amount equivalent to the annual compensation paid the Director of Administration at the time the Legislator applies for benefits, whichever is greater; provided, however, that effective January 1, 1978, whenever the annual compensation of the Director of Administration exceeds the annual compensation of the members of the Legislature, the contributions of the Legislators shall be based on the annual compensation of the Director of Administration.

4) The Retirement Fund shall allow any past or incumbent Legislator who desires not to receive the benefits vested under Title 4 GCA Section 8170(a) to permanently and irrevocably divest himself thereof. An election to divest must be in writing and may be effective retroactive to dates appropriate to the Legislator. Nothing herein shall have the effect of divesting past or incumbent Senators of any rights without his or her consent.
