Dear Speaker Nelson:

Enclosed please find a copy of Amended Bill No. 115 (LS), "AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (a) OF \$2107, TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBSECTION (b) OF \$2107, AND TO AMEND \$\$2704 AND 2705, ALL OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, PERTAINING TO THE INCREASE OF CERTAIN PENALTIES FOR WELFARE AND FOOD STAMP FRAUD", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 23-57.

The legislation increases the penalties from a misdemeanor to a felony of the third degree for obtaining public assistance payments through fraud; for willfully failing to report a change in status affecting a person's eligibility for public assistance; or for knowingly obtaining or otherwise taking prohibited actions with food stamp coupons or authorization-to-participate cards for food stamps. It also applies these increased penalties to amounts in question of \$100, whereas prior to this legislation the misdemeanor penalty applied only to amounts in question of \$500 or more.

It is intended that these increased penalties and the new applicability of penalties to smaller amounts in question will have a deterent effect on persons who try to obtain public funds when they are really not in need and are not eligible.

AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (a) OF §2107, TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBSECTION (b) OF §2107, AND TO AMEND §§2704 AND 2705, ALL OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, PERTAINING TO THE INCREASE OF CERTAIN PENALTIES FOR WELFARE AND FOOD STAMP FRAUD.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of §2107 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated,	is
hereby amended to read as follows:	

"§2107. Frauds: Penalties. (a) Any person who, by means of a willfully false statement or representation, or by impersonation or other fraudulent device, obtains or attempts to obtain, or aids or abets any other person to obtain, public assistance to which he is not justly entitled, or a larger amount of assistance than that to which he is justly entitled, or any recipient who buys or disposes of real property or any person who knowingly aids or abets a recipient in the purchase or sale of real property without the consent of the Director, in order to qualify for public assistance, shall be guilty of a felony of the third degree."

- **Section 2.** Subsection (b) of §2107 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
 - "(b) Reporting Change of Status. A person receiving assistance under this Subchapter who willfully fails to report to the Department a change in his status which affects his eligibility, within ten (10) days of that change, is guilty of a misdemeanor."
- **Section 3.** §2704 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - "§2704. Reporting Change of Status. A person receiving assistance under §2702 of this Subchapter who willfully fails to report to the Department a change in his status which affects his eligibility or the amount of payment for which he is eligible, within ten (10) days of that change, is guilty of a felony of the third degree."
- **Section 4.** §2705 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - "§2705. Penalties. A person is guilty:

- (a) of a felony of the third degree if he knowingly makes a false statement for the purpose of influencing the action of the Department in connection with its responsibilities under the Federal Food Stamp Act of 1977, with respect to the certification of households applying for participation in the food stamp program and the issuance under such program of food stamp coupons to households;
- (b) of a misdemeanor if he knowingly uses, transfers, acquires, alters or possesses food stamp coupons or authorization-to-participate cards in any manner not authorized by the Federal Food Stamp Act of 1977 or the Federal or territorial regulations issued pursuant to this Act and the face value of the food stamp coupons or the authorization-to-participate card is One Hundred Dollars (\$100) or less;
- (c) of a felony of the third degree if he knowingly uses, transfers, acquires, alters or possesses food stamp coupons or authorization-to-participate cards in any manner not authorized by the Federal Food Stamp Act of 1977, or the Federal or territorial regulations issued pursuant to this Act and the face value of the food stamp coupons or the authorization-to-participate card exceeds One Hundred Dollars (\$100);
- (d) of a felony of the third degree if he knowingly uses, transfers, acquires, alters or possesses blank authorization-to-participate card of the Department in any manner not authorized by the Department;
- (e) of a felony of the third degree if he knowingly counterfeits, forges or alters any authorization-to-participate

3	(f) of a felony of the third degree if he knowingly alters,

AN ACT TO ADD NEW §§60515 THROUGH 60519 TO TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO ALLOW FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF THE 1993 GUAM GEODETIC NETWORK.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative intent. Since 1963, surveys have been done
- 3 according to the 1963 Guam Geodetic Triangulation Network system. The
- 4 Department of Land Management has contracted with the South Australian

Government for satellite surveying of new primary, secondary, and tertiary control stations. Upon completion of the surveying, a new geodetic system will be in place to replace the 1963 network.

It is the intent of the Guam Legislature that this new system must have legislation to protect the marked primary, secondary, and tertiary control points that will be established.

Section 2. A new 21 GCA §60515 is added to read:

"§60515. Establishment of the 1993 Guam Geodetic Network.

- (a) The Director shall progressively replace the 1963 Guam Geodetic Network with the 1993 Guam Geodetic Network.
- (b) For this purpose, appropriate monumentation that is intended for the establishment of the 1993 Guam Geodetic Network shall be erected by the Director, or may be designated by him, as primary, secondary and tertiary network marks and shall be referred to as the 1993 Guam Geodetic Network for use in locating and describing land within the territory.
- (c) The 1993 Guam Geodetic Network shall be established to control the standards prescribed in the Federal Geodetic Control Committee's (FGCC) publication Geometric Geodetic Accuracy Standards and Specifications for Using GPS Relative Positioning Techniques, Version 5.0 (Reprinted 1 August 1989) and as updated as necessary."

Section 3. A new 21 GCA §60516 is added to read:

"§60516. 1993 Guam Geodetic Datum and Map Grid.

(a) The 1993 Guam Geodetic Network shall adopt the North American Datum of 1983 (NAD83 Geodetic Datum) as the Coordinate Reference System.

1 (b) The Guam Map Grid, with the following parameters, shall 2 be adopted for surveying application in Guam: 3 Central Meridian and 4 Longitude of Origin 144°45′ East Longitude 5 Latitude of Origin 13°30′ North Latitude 6 Easting of Origin 100,000 Meters 7 Northing of Origin 200,000 Meters 8 Central Scale Factor 1.000000. 9 **Section 4.** A new 21 GCA §60517 is added to read: 10 "§60517. Proclaimed Survey Areas. 11 (a) The Director shall declare areas of Guam where the 1993 12 Guam Geodetic Network has been established as Proclaimed Survey 13 Areas. 14 (b) The Director shall make notification of the declaration of Proclaimed Survey Areas by advertising in the local newspaper and 15 advising the Guam Board of Registration for Professional Engineers, 16 17 Architects and Land Surveyors. 18 (c) When carrying out a survey of land boundaries in a 19 Proclaimed Survey Area, surveyors shall connect to a minimum of three 1993 Guam Geodetic Network marks. 20 21 (d) If the Territorial Surveyor, based upon reasonable grounds, 22 questions a survey plan as to form and accuracy, which includes definition of boundaries, as shown on a survey plan in a Proclaimed 23 24 Survey Area, by reason of the survey not being carried out in 25 accordance with this law or regulations issued under this law, the 26 Territorial Surveyor may require the surveyor responsible to

undertake additional work, or to provide additional information in

27

relation to the survey in order for the Territorial Surveyor to verify the survey plan as to form and accuracy, including definition of the boundaries. The Territorial Surveyor shall not approve the plan until satisfied that the requirements of this law are met.

- (e) The surveyor must comply with any such requirement within fourteen (14) days or such longer period as allowed by the Territorial Surveyor.
- (f) The Territorial Surveyor shall approve or disapprove, in writing, all survey plans within forty-five (45) days of submission. Failure of the Territorial Surveyor to disapprove in writing a survey plan submitted shall deem such plan approved. Such approval shall not waive the rights of the property owners or the surveyor to challenge such approval in any manner prescribed by law."

Section 5. A new 21 GCA §60518 is added to read:

"§60518. Extension of the 1993 Guam Geodetic Network.

- (a) Subdivisions of land in Proclaimed Survey Areas carried out pursuant to Chapter 62, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated (Subdivision Law) shall comply with these requirements.
- (b) The Territorial Planner shall forward a copy of all tentative plans of subdivisions to the Territorial Surveyor.
- (c) The Territorial Surveyor shall indicate, on the tentative plans of subdivisions in Proclaimed Survey Areas, the locations of new marks to be included in the 1993 Guam Geodetic Network and return a copy of the tentative plan to the surveyor.
- (d) The marks shall be placed by the surveyor carrying out the subdivision at the completion of all major site works to the specifications set by the Territorial Surveyor. The Territorial Surveyor

shall be advised when the marks have been placed. The subdivision map shall not be approved until the marks are placed by the surveyor and certified to by the Territorial Surveyor or his designee.

- (e) The surveyor shall relate all marks placed pursuant to this section, and all 1993 Guam Geodetic Network marks located on a survey, in both distance and direction to the closest boundary corner.
- (f) The Territorial Surveyor shall connect the marks to the 1993 Guam Geodetic Network and recover any cost from the surveyor or the developer carrying out the subdivision."

Section 6. A new 21 GCA §60519 is added to read:

"§60519. Protection of 1993 Guam Geodetic Network Marks.

- (a) A person must not, without the approval of the Territorial Surveyor, destroy or damage a 1993 Guam Geodetic Network mark. A penalty of \$5,000 will be incurred if a person destroys or damages a 1993 Guam Geodetic Network mark.
- (b) Where a person proposes to carry out any work in a Proclaimed Survey Area likely to destroy or damage a 1993 Guam Geodetic Network mark, that person shall give notice to the Territorial Surveyor, who shall take all necessary steps to safeguard the mark, and the proposed work shall not commence until such steps have been taken.
- (c) The cost of any work carried out by the Territorial Surveyor pursuant to subsection (b) above shall be recovered from the person carrying out the work.
- (d) When the Court finds a person guilty of willfully destroying or damaging a 1993 Guam Geodetic Network mark, in addition to the punishment imposed by the Court, the person shall pay the

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Environmental Affairs scheduled a public hearing on May 22, 1995 at 9:30 a.m. at the Legislative Public Hearing Room. Public notice was announced on the May 21, 1995 issue of the PDN. Members present were:

Appearing before the Committee to testify on the bill was:

Mr. Charles Stake, Dept. of Public Health and Social Services, oral.

II. SUMMAR OF TESTIMONY

Mr. Charles Stake, of the Department of Public Health, testified in support of Bill 115. He stated that there are several ways to commit a crime in regards to welfare fraud and food stamps fraud. One is the applicant will lie on the application, and the other is that he gains resources after such application which would make him ineligible for the benefits, yet he fails to report such gains. Mr. Stake stated that the bill would fight welfare fraud and food stamp fraud by upgrading misdemeanor penalties to felony penalties. The advantage is it provides three year statute of limitations in which it conducts the investigation rather than misdemeanor statute of limitations which is one year. He further stated that the problem with the statute of limitations being one year is that the statutes on Guam runs from the date of commission of the crime, and not the date of discovery of the crime, so an offense won't be discovered until six months after the statute is already in effect. He stated that if you have a one year statute it makes it difficult for the investigator to complete an investigation. With the three year statute, it offers plenty of time to complete the investigation, which should lead to more successful prosecutions.

III. FINDING AD RECOMMENDATION

The Committee finds that welfare and food stamp fraud have been on the rise in recent years. The Committee also finds that the need to successfully prosecute such crimes is necessary to deter the commission of such crimes. The Committee finds that increasing the penalties for these crimes should help investigators in relation to the statute of limitations, and provide a deterrent that should send a message to all welfare and food stamp abusers.

Accordingly, the Committee on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Environmental Affairs, to which was referred **Bill No. 115**, does hereby submit its findings and recommendation to the Twenty-Third Guam Legislature **TO DO PASS Bill No. 115** "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION (a) OF SECTION 2107, TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBSECTION (b) TO SECTION 2107, TO AMEND SECTION 2704 AND 2705 ALL OF TITLE 10, GCA, PERTAINING TO THE INCREASE OF CERTAIN PENALTIES FOR WELFARE AND FOOD STAMP FRAUD."






