This will allow more qualified nurses to attain licensure.

BILL #352 AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR VALIDATING COMPETENCY IN THE NURSING PRACTICE BY ADDING A NEW ITEM (11) TO 10 GCA SECTION 12307

PREFACE

The Committee on Health, Welfare & Senior Citizens convened on Friday, October 20, 1995 at 2:30pm in the Legislature Public Hearing Room to receive testimony on Bill #352. The hearing was called to order by the Chairperson, Senator Lou Leon Guerrero. Senator Ben Pangelinan, Vice-Chairperson and Senator Carlotta Leon Guerrero were also present.

PURPOSE

This legislation was heavily solicited by the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners ("GBNE"). The intent of the bill is to allow GBNE to use continuing education units ("CEU's) as a means of validating competency in order to continue or re-enter the nursing profession.

DISCUSSION

Present to give written and/or oral testimony were: Roger Cauley, Chairman, Guam Nurses Association ("GNA") Legislative Committee, Mrs. Tina Blas who represented herself, Ms. Margaret Gay, representing herself, Ms. Helen Ripple, Administrator of Guam Memorial Hospital and Dr. Barbara Brown, editor of Nursing Administration Quarterly and invitee to Guam by Ms. Helen Ripple.

Mrs. Teofila Cruz submitted written testimony on behalf of GBNE.

Senator Lou Leon Guerrero stated that the GBNE and the GNA have constantly debated over the competency question and who should measure or judge competency. Is knowledge competency enough versus the clinical competency? The Senator is of the position that competency should be measured at the employer's level - at the level of where the nurse works. It is the opinion of the Senator that GBNE's role is to safeguard the community by making sure that the applicant's requirements meet the qualified standards. GBNE has, in the past, put in stringent rules and regulations that, at times, obstruct or sometimes deter nurses from being licensed on Guam because of clinical competency. Is the solution to go towards continuing education as

some kind of measurement that approves this individual based on clinical performance?

Senator Lou Leon Guerrero supports the concept that CEU's are needed to ensure that the applicant has the knowledge or is up to date in the nursing profession and translate that into clinical performance at the site of employment.

Dr. Barbara Brown stated that there are two factors in measuring competency (1) CEU's and (2) certificate exams. There should be more focus on the clinical specifications. Clinical testing should NOT be GBNE's responsibility - it is the employer's responsibility.

Mrs. Helen Ripple added that she agreed that competency should be determined in the environment. It is the responsibility of the employer to orient its employee.

Senator Carlotta Leon Guerrero asked if there were risks involved when having the employer determine competency. Mrs. Ripple responded that this is why the employer does competency tests and evaluation, so that the employee may have to demonstrate their skills. Dr. Brown mentioned that a probationary period to evaluate "hands on" performance is also done by the employer.

Mrs. Tina Blas felt that the GBNE is responsible for the initial step for licensure - it is up to the employers and individuals to maintain level of competency, unless there becomes a question of incompetency. Then the GBNE will investigate accusations.

Ms. Margaret Gay stated that Public Health's manual for nurses state that each nurse is responsible for their ongoing CEU's to assure scientific knowledge and skills to be performed. She supports requiring CEU's for new license and re-entry of the nursing profession. However, it is very difficult to measure competency.

Senator Lou Leon Guerrero stated that once this bill is signed, the GBNE would create the rules and regulations. In these rules and regulations, the questions of number of CEU's required and how monitored will be addressed. In previous years, it was difficult for a nurse to get CEU's - now it is more available and easier to accomplish. She further feels that there should be a mandate that ALL licensed nurses become members of the GNA to be informed of CEU's available on Guam.

Senator Ben Pangelinan commented that competency should not be used as a basis for CEU's.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

After discussion of written and oral testimonies, it is the finding of the Committee that GBNE is to exclude the word "competency" as a basis for CEU's.

The new title of Bill #3352 will read as follows:

AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL CRITERIA TO NURSE LICENSURE BY ADDING CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS AS A MEANS FOR VALIDATING LICENSURE.

RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Health, Welfare & Senior Citizens recommends **TO DO PASS** as substituted by the Committee.

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

Bill No 352, An act to provide additional criteria for validating competency in the Nursing Practice by adding a new item (11) to 10 GCA §12307, Article 3, Chapter 12.

Madam Chairman and members of the Committee on Health, Welfare, and Senior Citizens, my name is Teofila P. Cruz, Administrator of the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners. Increasingly, consumer advocates challenge licensing bodies to assure the public that continuing competence is an accompanying factor in continuing licensure. The issue of competence has become one of the most controversial topics in meetings, health care settings, classrooms, forums and legislatures in Guam and around the country. Competence has been discussed in relation to consumer protection, quality assurance, continued competence, the effects of disability on practice, and the disciplinary process Madam Chairman and members of the committee, for boards of nursing, the driving force underlying this debate is the obligation to protect the public through the development and enforcement of reasonable and uniform standards for nursing education and practice. The public perceives that "a current license means current competence" while the reality is "a current license means that at the point of entry the nurse demonstrated competence through graduation from a nursing education program and NCLEX, and has maintained an unencumbered license." Continued competence mechanisms, e.g. continuing education, may be involved in maintaining a license, but does this mean equal competence assurance?

The Guam Board of Nurse Examiners is in support of the intent of the proposed amendment 10 GCA, Article 3, Chapter 12, §12307 and may have been instrumental in the solicitation to include continuing education as one of the methods to validate "competency". Bill 352 added a new item (11) to §12307 (b) which may be interpreted as an additional requirement. The following changes to the amendment is recommended to add to item (10) "... or re-enter practice may include nursing continuing education units.

The Guam Board of Nurse Examiners Administrative Rules and Regulations, Article 1, Section 23: Continued Competency Requirements states:

- "A. Nurses shall submit to the Board evidence that they actively practice nursing a minimum of four months within the renewal period to be eligible for license renewal or endorsement.
- B. Nurses who do not meet the above (A.) requirements, upon submission of the required documents, shall be issued a conditional license for a period of 6 (six) months of supervised nursing experience. A satisfactory evaluation of the experience shall be submitted to the Board for approval, prior to issuance of a full license." (Attachment Λ)





At the time of the writing of the Board's administrative rules and regulations in 1988, the above requirements were consistent with the national level. The Board felt it was necessary to establish "some" guidelines to determine competency which generally stated "practice" requirements. The requirements as stated did not included continuing education (CE) hours because CE's were not readily available or provided in Guam. Unlike physicians or dentist, nurses are not as financial healthy to travel off-island to attend CE's.

Throughout the years some nurses felt these rules and regulations were discriminatory, that one must be continuously working as a nurse to maintain their license. Does competence mean working as a nurse? The NCSBN (April 1995) defined competence as "the ability of a nurse to apply interpersonal, decision-making, and psychomotor skills at the level of knowledge expected for the nurse's current nursing practice role". Competence is universal in concept but is specific in application. The standards for competence determined by the Board is when a nurse:

- 1. Apply knowledge and skills at the level required for a particular practice situation.
- 2. Implement personal guidelines reflective of professional, ethical and legal standards of practice.
- 3. Assure that clients' welfare prevails, and empower clients to participate in health care decisions and outcomes.
- 4. Implement professional development activities needed for nursing practice decisions and actions.
- Demonstrate responsibility and accountability for nursing practice decisions and actions.
- 6. Exercise sound nursing judgment.
- 7. Use collaborative and interdependent activities to coordinate client health care.
- 8. Acknowledge the effect of a nurse's cognitive and functional abilities on the nurse's practice.

In 1994, the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc., Nursing Practice and Education Committee, conducted a survey to monitor the use of continued competency mechanisms which included the use of peer review and measurement of continued competency mechanisms by boards of nursing. Sixty-two (62) Member Boards responded to the questionnaire with the following results: (Attachment B)

- No Member Boards reported the use of peer review or client review;
- Twenty-eight (28) Member Boards reported the use of periodic refresher courses, with various conditions, for reentry into active practice after a prolong absence from practice;
- Twenty-six (26) Member Boards reported the use of continuing education mechanisms;
- Four (4) Member Boards reported the use of a competency mechanism; and





• Twenty-four (24) Member Boards reported the use of a minimum practice requirement for renewal of license. The continued competence mechanisms being used the most, continue to be refresher courses, continuing education and practice requirements.

It is therefore concluded that although the Board recommended the amendment to 10 GCA, the Board believes that the amendment is more appropriate in the administrative rules and regulations, rather than with 10 GCA.

- d. Before January 1951 (before the implementation of a national nursing exam) successfully wrote a state-constructed examination with the established passing score in the original state of licensure, and such license has never lapsed.
- 2. Canadian nurse graduates who:
 - a. Were licensed between 1949-1974 and are currently licensed in a state or territory of the United States, or successfully wrote NLN-SBTPE with a minimum score of 350 in each of the 5 nursing areas.
 - b. Were licensed after 1971 shall be considered as a foreign nurse graduate.
- 3. Foreign Nurse Graduates who:
 - Were licensed in the Territory of Guam prior to May 1, 1970 and are currently licensed and active in the practice nursing.

- D. Licensure by equivalency for practical nurses

An applicant for practical nurse licensure by endorsement based on equivalency must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Have successfully written the national licensure examination, and
- Hold a license in another state or territory of the U.S. based on successful completion of course content and clinical experience equivalent to an approved practical nursing program and furnish evidence thereof, and
- Submit official transcript/course description that the minimum nursing courses completed include the following:

- c. Grades on the above courses must be a "C" or better.
- Be able to demonstrate fluency in speaking, writing and comprehension of the English language.
- 5. Demonstrate continued competency.

SECTION 22: SPECIAL LICENSURE SITUATIONS

- A. Nurses transporting patients in and out of Guam shall be currently licensed in the jurisdiction in which they are employed.
- B. Nurses from other U.S. jurisdictions or its territories attending or providing short (90 days or less) continuing education courses or participating in clinical preceptorship experiences shall hold a current license to practice in at less one U.S. jurisdiction or its territories.
- C. Licensed nurses from other U.S. jurisdictions or its territories who provide care during an official declared emergency or disaster situation shall not be required to obtain a Guam license to practice nursing.

SECTION 23: CONTINUED COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS

- A. Nurses shall submit to the Board evidence that they actively practiced nursing a minimum of four months within the renewal period to be eligible for license renewal or endorsement.
- B. Nurses who do not meet the above (A.) requirements, upon submission of the required documents, shall be issued a conditional license for a period of 6 (six) months of supervised nursing experience. A satisfactory evaluation of the experience shall be submitted to the Board for approval, prior to issuance of a full license.
- C. Nurses who have not been actively practicing nursing five years or more and are unable to document yearly two months of licensed practice during the five (5) years immediately preceding the date of application shall satisfactorily complete a formal refresher program approved by the Board to include theory and 160 hrs. of clinical learning under the direct supervision of an RN, before resuming active practice. An evaluation, of the clinical experience, shall be submitted to the Board.
- D. Nurses moving from one specialty area to another or from a general area to a specialty area shall complete a formal refresher program which reflects knowledge and skills necessary to maintain competency in the respective area.
- B. Nurses participating in either a formal refresher program shall apply for a temporary work permit. They shall be subject to the same requirements as new graduates.


SECTION 24: RENEWAL OF LICENSE

- A. Registered and Practical nurse licenses shall be renewed biennially by September 30 of odd numbered years.
- B. The ticensee shall submit to the Board a completed renewal application form, verification of continuing competency as requested, renewal fee and other required documents, on or before the expiration date of the license.

RELATIVE TO AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR VALIDATING COMPETENCY IN THE NURSING PRACTICE BY ADDING A NEW ITEM [11] TO 10 GCA SECTION 12307.

GOOD AFTERNOON MIDAM CHAIRPERSON AND MEMBERS OF THE 13RD LEGISLATIVE COMMETTEE ON HEALTH, WELFARE, AND SENIOR CITIZENS. MY MAME IS TIME T. BLAS. THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY ON EILL 330.

I WOULD LIKE TO START MY TESTIMONY WITH A QUESTION: IS HAVING THE MNOWLEDGE TO PERFORM THE BASIS FOR COMPETENCY? WHILE I SUPPORT THE INTENT OF THE BILL, I FEEL THAT THE ISSUE OF VALIDATING COMPETENCY IN NURSING IS MORE COMPLEX THAN MERE ATTENDANCE AT CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMS. WHAT TOPICS/SUBJECTS WILL BE CONSIDERED APPROPRIATE FOR VALIDATING COMPETENCY IN NURSING? WHAT OF WHICH SPONSORING ENTITY WILL BE ACCEPTABLE FOR VALIDATING COMPETENCY? WHO WILL VALIDATE WHICH CONTINUING EDUCATION IS ACCEPTABLE? WHAT CRITERIA WOULD THE VALIDATING ENTITY USE TO VALIDATE COMPETENCY? WILL FORCING ATTENDANCE AT CONTINUING EDUCATION MAKE SOMEONE A PETTER PRACTITIONERS.

WITH THE ADVANCEMENT IN HEALTH CAPE TECHNOLOGIES, ONE CANNOT BE OBLIGATED NOR EXPECTED TO BECOME PROTICIENT IN ALL CLINICAL AREAS OF NURSING. HOWEVER, THE LEVELO OF COMPETENCY MUST BE CONSIDERED WHEN EVALUATING THE COMPETENCY OF A NURSE, SUCH AS, THE FERFORMANCE OF A SEMERALISED PROFESSIONAL NURSE AS COMPARED TO A NURSE SPACTITIONER OF THE CLINICIAN AS COMPARED TO THE ADMINISTRATOR. AS A RETIRED PERSON, I DO NOT HAVE TO PRACTICE MY

CLINICAL NURSING SKILLS BUT MUST CONTINUE TO CHALLENGE AND DEVELOP MY NURSING JUDGEMENT ABILITY TO MEET UP WITH THE CHANGING TIMES AND BE CURRENT IN MY PROFESSION.

TRENDO; HOWEVER, UNLESS APPLICATION OF NEW SKILLS AND UTILIZATION OF TECHNOLOGY ARE CARRIED OUT APPROFRIATELY, THERE STILL REMAIN THE QUESTION OF COMPETENCY AND AT WHAT LEVEL OF COMPETENCY. AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR VALIDATING COMPETENCY IN THE NURSING PRACTICE BY ADDING A NEW ITEM (11) TO 10 GCA §12307.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. The Nurse Practice Act and the Guam Board of Nurse Examiner rules and regulations do not allow for nurses who are not actively practicing to use Continuing Education Units (CEUs) as a means of validating continued competency in order to continue or re-enter nursing practice. There are many nurses on island who are precluded from re-entering the practice because of this restriction. This pool of nurses can be tapped on to reduce the critical nursing shortage Guam is experiencing.

Section 2. Items (11) to (18) of subsection (b) of §12307, Article 3, Chapter 12, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, as codified prior to enactment of this Act, are renumbered (12) to (19);"

Section 3. A new item (11) is added to subsection (b) of §12307, Article 3, Chapter 12, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

 $^{\prime\prime}(11)$ use Continuing Education Units (CEUs) to validate competency to continue or re-enter nursing practice."
