AN ACT TO ADD NEW §§1614 THROUGH 1616 TO TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING AN ADVISORY GUAM CODE COMMISSION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Intent. Since the final titles of the Guam Code
- 3 Annotated will be published in 1995, and since final legislative approval of a

1	Supreme Court of Guam has been given, and since technology is changing
2	rapidly, in the near future offering the possibility of having Guam's laws and
3	rules and court reports on computer, the Legislature believes that the time
4	has come to reexamine the delivery of the laws and regulations and their
5	physical form. In order to best accomplish this task, the Legislature wishes to
6	involve representatives of all interested groups while not reinventing a
7	structure that now works. Therefore, this Act will create an Advisory Guam
8	Code Commission to look into the best ways to make available, and easier to
9	find, Guam's laws, rules and regulations, and court decisions.
10	Section 2. New §§1614 through 1616 are added to Title 1, Guam Code
11	Annotated, to read:
12	"§1614. Advisory Code Commission. (a) Creation and
13	Membership. There is hereby created an Advisory Guam Code
14	Commission to consist of the following members:
15	(1) The Attorney General of Guam;
16	(2) Two members from the Judicial Branch, one to be
17	appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court and the
18	other by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam. Should
19	there be no justices of the Supreme Court when the first
20	appointment is to be made, then the Presiding Judge shall make
21	the second appointment, whose term shall end upon the
22	appointment of a person by the Chief Justice;
23	(3) Two Legislators to be appointed by the Speaker. One
24	Legislator shall be from the majority and the other shall be from
25	the minority;

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- (4) Two members to be appointed by the President of the Guam Bar Association from among the active membership of that Association;
- (5) One member to be appointed from among the attorneys of the Public Defender's Office by the Public Defender;
 - (6) The Compiler of Laws.

Those members who are to be appointed by another official shall be so appointed within 30 days of enactment of this section. Such members shall hold office for a term of two years or as long as they hold the position which qualified them for appointment, whichever is shorter. Such persons may be reappointed. Appointment of Legislators shall terminate upon the termination of the Legislative term during which they were appointed.

Any vacancy in the Commission shall be promptly filled in the same manner and by the same official who made the original appointment.

The members of this Commission shall receive no stipend, but may be reimbursed for any expenses incurred in Commission business, provided money is available for this purpose.

§1615. Commission's Purpose. The Commission shall:

1) Conduct a review of the structure of Guam's laws, rules & regulations, and court reports and recommend ways by which these materials may be more readily available to users thereof, and the contents thereof more easily researched. The Commission should consider all means, paper and electronic, of distribution and research.

1	2) Recommend to the Attorney General ways by which the
2	changes can be implemented, both as to editorial and production
3	issues.
4	3) Recommend to the Legislature any legislation which may
5	be necessary to implement the recommendations of the
6	Commission.
7	§1616. Commission Support. Support for the Commission shall be
8	provided through the Compiler of Laws Division of the Department of Law
9	and any assistance required by the Commission, or hearing to be held is
10	authorized in accordance with this subchapter."

The Committee finds that a reexamination of the condition of Guam's Codes and Administrative Regulations is needed. The Committee finds that Bill 357 as further substituted by the Committee would establish a much needed Advisory Guam Code Commission. The Committee finds that this Commission would review the structure of Guam's laws, rules and regulations and recommend ways by which these materials may be made more available to its users. The Committee further finds that Bill 357 as further substituted by the Committee has received support of the Compiler of Laws and the authors.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 1658 OF TITLE 1 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED TO RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE GUAM CODE COMMISSION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

SECTION 1. Legislative Intent. It is the purpose of the 3 4 Guam Legislature to establish the Guam Code Commission for the 5 purpose of examining the condition, efficiency, organization and distribution of Guam's Codes and Administrative 6 Regulations currently published, and distributed. In 1982 the work of the 7 former Law Revision Commission was disbanded by legislation, and 8 the work of compiling, publishing and distributing Guam laws was 9 transferred to the Compiler of Laws under the jurisdiction of the 10 Attorney General of Guam. Over the past fourteen years the task of 11 publishing Guam's Codes and Administrative Regulations has become 12 more complex, and there exist a need within the legal community to 13 14 reexamine such growth in relation to increased technological advancements and achievements in printing, publication and multi-1.5

- SECTION 2. A new Section 1658 is added to Title 1 Guam Code
- 2 Annotated to read:
- 3 "SECTION 1658. ESTABLISHMENT, MEMBERSHIP, AND
- 4 COMPENSATION. (a) The Guam Code Commission is hereby created
- 5 and shall consist of the following members:
- 6 (1) The Attorney General of Guam, who shall serve as a
- 7 permanent member and Chairperson of the Commission;
- 8 (2) Two (2) members appointed from the Judicial Branch as
- 9 follows: one (1) members appointed by the Chief Justice of the
- 10 Supreme Court of Guam; one (1) member appointed by the Presiding
- 11 Judge of the Superior Court of Guam. If at the time of the first
- 12 appointment of the Commission the Supreme Court has not been
- 13 constituted, such appointment by the Chief Justice shall be made by
- 14 the Presiding Judge.
- 15 (3) Two (2) members appointed from the membership of the
- 16 Legislature designated by the Speaker;
- 17 (4) Two (2) members appointed by the President of the Guam
- 18 Bar Association from among the active membership of the Guam Bar.
- 19 (5) One (1) member appointed by the Attorney General from
- 20 among government full time attorneys of the Department of Law,
- 21 and one (1) member appointed by the Executive Director of the
- 22 Public Defender Corporation from among the full time attorneys of
- 23 the Public Defender Corporation.
- 24 (b) Except for the position of Chairperson, Commission
- 25 members shall be appointed within thirty (30) days after the
- 26 enactment of this Section, shall hold office for a term of two (2)
- 27 years, and may be reappointed to successive terms. Appointments of

- 1 members of the Guam Legislature shall terminate automatically upon
- 2 expiration of the members present term of office.
- 3 (c) Any vacancy in the Commission membership shall be
- 4 promptly filled in the same manner and proportions as the initial
- 5 appointments.
- 6 (d) Commission members shall be paid in accordance with the
- 7 Uniform Compensation for Boards and Commissions provision 5 GCA
- 8 §1109, such funds to be appropriated by the Legislature to the
- 9 Department of Law as stipends to the members of the Commission.
- 10 No other incidental cost or expenses shall be allowed.
- 11 SECTION 1658.1. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY. The Compiler of
- 12 Laws shall function as the Executive Secretary to the Commission.
- 13 The Executive Secretary shall have such duties and responsibilities,
- 14 in addition to the position of Compiler of Laws, as may be directed
- 15 from time to time by the Commission. The Executive Secretary shall
- 16 serve without additional compensation. The employees of the
- 17 Department of Law, Compiler's Division, shall serve as the
- 18 administrative body for the work of the Commission.
- 19 SECTION 1658.2. COMMISSION POWERS. The Commission shall
- 20 have the following powers and responsibilities:
- 21 (a) To meet regularly on a monthly basis subject to the Open
- 22 Government Law for the purpose of reviewing Guam's Codes and
- 23 Administrative Regulations to determine the organization,
- 24 effectiveness, structure, usability, accessibility and distribution
- 25 thereof. Special meetings may be called by the Chair person.
- 26 (b) To recommend to the Attorney General methods to improve
- 27 access to, and greater use and distribution of Guam's Codes and

- Administrative Regulations both locally and nationally for the benefit
- 2 of the legal community and the general public;
- 3 (c) To recommend to the Guam Legislature legislation to
- 4 improve public access to, and greater use and distribution of, Guam's
- 5 Codes and Administrative Regulations;
- 6 (d) To determine a five year program for printing, publication,
- 7 and distribution of Guam's Codes and Administrative Regulations;
- 8 (c) To determine requirements for printing, publication, and
- 9 distribution of the next series of Guam Reports, designating to the
- 10 Compiler of Laws certain trial opinions and decisions that are of
- 11 significant importance to the legal community to require publication;
- 12 (f) To coordinate with the Guam Judicial Council, and the Chief
- 13 Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam in the printing, publication and
- 14 distribution of the Guam Supreme Court Reports;
- 15 (g) To utilize the services of the Guam Bar Association,
- 16 professional associations and organizations, other state Commissions
- 17 empowered to develop and improve their state's code system in
- 18 order to fulfill the objectives of the Commission.
- (h) To review all bid specifications, or requests for proposals,
- 20 for the procurement of printing, publication and distribution of
- 21 Guam's Codes and Administrative Regulations, and judicial reports.
- 22 SECTION 1658.3. COMMISSION RESPONSIBILITIES. The
- 23 Commission shall:
- 24 (a) Conduct a continuing, comprehensive and expeditious
- 25 examination of Guam's Code system in order to identify and resolve
- 26 any defects in the organization and effectiveness of the present
- 27 system to respond to the needs of the legal community, and the

- 1 concerns of the general public in understanding how to research and
- 2 find Guam laws;
- 3 (b) Conduct such public hearings as are essential and necessary
- 4 to obtain public input, and to accept suggestions from the members
- 5 of Guam's legal community, the public sector, and the business
- 6 community;
- 7 (c) Recommend to the Legislature the repeal of any statute
- 8 which has been held inorganic or unconstitutional by a court of final
- 9 appeal, and to further recommend such statutory changes in the
- 10 adoption of local laws that will improve Guam's Code system;
- 11 (d) Implement, through the Attorney General, such changes in
- 12 the compilation, codification, printing, publication and distribution of
- 13 Guam's Codes and Administrative Regulations, and judicial reports.
- 14 (c) To do all that is necessary and appropriate to accomplish
- 15 and fulfill the objectives of the Commission as stated in subsection
- 16 1658.2 hereof.
- Section 1658.4. ACTS OF THE COMMISSION. A minimum of five
- 18 (5) members shall be required to constitute a quorum of the
- 19 Commission; a majority vote of the quorum shall be required to pass
- any act of the Commission.
- 21 SECTION 3. This law shall take effect on enactment.

- 2) Two members from the Judicial Branch, one to be appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court and the other by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam. Should there be no justices of the Supreme Court when the first appointment is to be made, then the Presiding

Judge shall make the second appointment, whose term shall end upon the appointment of a person by the Chief Justice.

- 3) Two Legislators to be appointed by the Speaker.
- 4) Two members to be appointed by the President of the Guam Bar Association from among the active membership of that Association.
- 5) Two members, one each to be appointed from among the attorneys of the Department of Law and Public Defender's Office, respectively, by the Attorney General and the Public Defender, respectively.
 - 6) The Compiler of Laws.

Those members who are to be appointed by the another official shall be so appointed within 30 days of enactment of this section. Such members shall hold office for a term of two years so long as they hold the position which qualified them for appointment, whichever is shorter. Such persons may be reappointed. Appointment of Legislators shall terminate upon the termination of Legislature during which they were appointed.

I wish to testify today in opposition to Bill No. 357, establishing a Guam Code Commission. There are several problems with this bill and, I believe, better means to address the clear and present problems of the Division.

First, I wish to give you an update on the Compilers' activities. We have finalized an agreement with West Publishing Company for the production of the Guam Code Annotated, Session Laws, Appellate Division Decisions and, possibly, Ninth Circuit decisions from Guam on CD ROM. This week, I have sent off the diskettes containing this material. Likewise, by the end of this week, we will have sent to William S. Hein the latest Guam Code Annotated updates, current through October 1, of last year. We are currently working on a recodification of the Administrative Rules. We have just begun distribution of the Current Laws of the 23rd Legislature (this one) which are complete with an Index and tables. I am looking into what can be placed on the Internet, but resources and technology are such that this project is not of immediate priority. We badly need to create a complete paper index of the Guam Code Annotated in its final form, but lack the resources for this project. I have received estimates that such a project will cost about \$125,000 and take over a year. However, the CD ROM will provide electronic indexing, which will greatly ease year attempts to find what you are looking for.

The Bill, as written, makes the Commission directory. This structure does not fill well, either practically or legally, into the present structure. The Legislature determined to place the Compiler of Laws within the Executive Branch. Thus, it is not proper to have the Judiciary and Legislature directing the Attorney General and Compiler through means not permitted for such bodies. Several years ago, the Supreme Court declared unconstitutional the airport authority governing Washington National Airport because the law required that certain Representatives "in their individual capacities" be on the Board. This, said the Court, violated the separation of powers.

In addition, the Guam Supreme Court is well on its way to an operation al status. Within the staffing pattern submitted to the Legislature as part of the Rules, recently approved, was the position of Revisor of Statutes. It will be that position, along with the adoption of Rules on the subject by the Court, which will determine the form of the Opinions of that Court. As the law stands, I will publish their output, but in the form the Court directs. The mechanism for publishing such decisions is already set in law – there is no need to change now.

On the Legislative side, I believe that you must make some fundamental decisions that only Senators can make. For instance, you need some guidance as to what is to be codified and what is not to be codified. Apart from general principles contained in Title 1, GCA, and in budget bills, I have no way of knowing whether permanent laws, such as the "Doc Sanchez" Scholarship program, should be codified, since the Legislature enacted it as sections of a Public Law. I have codified it because it is clearly permanent and ongoing, and it was hard to find in its original form. Still, the Legislature needs to provide its own guidance. Hawaii has a system – when a bill is not amending or repealing an existing part of the Code (Revised Statutes), the Legislature simply enacts the Bill in Section form, and in a separate section, directs the Revisor of Statutes to place that bill in its proper place in the HRS. Of course, Hawaii also has the "single subject rule", which we lack, so, in some cases, more precise guidance would be necessary.

Also, the Administrative Adjudication Law needs revision. Since the last amendment governing submission to the Legislature, it has become impossible for me to determine when a given rule has become effective. In the past, I received all rules submitted from the Legislative Secretary, with a notation as to the date submitted. Since calendar days were involved, finding the effective date was easy. I have received no rules, other than those passed by Public Law, sin this Legislature.

Finally, there is the question of resources. With the publications we have, keeping up with just two word processing operators is not possible. To keep current for the laws, codes, rules and court reports, we need at least three word processing operators, and ideally, four. There is no way to index the entire codes except by contracting out the job. This is not unusual. Hawaii has done this, as do many other states. This is the only practical way, since this is a one-time job. The updating can be done locally once the overall indexing is done.

So, there is much that can be done, but an additional commission is not the way to do it. Particularly, not the operating Commission created by Bill No. 357. If the Legislature must create a Code Commission, I suggest creating an advisory Commission, to include the Compiler of Laws as a Member. This latter inclusion was first made in the original Law Revision Commission and worked very well. It should be continued. However, I urge that no commission be created, rather the various branches of government use the structure available to them to decide matters which each must decide on its own.

Definitely, I would like to work with each branch to address not only overall issues, but ones unique to each branch of government. I welcome the Guam Bar§s input, but I have noticed that Bar activity has not been all that obvious lately. However, that organization, of which I am a member (mandatory), is quite capable of organizing its own committees to address its interests. I would welcome working with such a group. As always, resources do limit, and it is up to the Legislature to decide the level of activity of this Division.

I am attaching for your consideration a Bill I was requested to draft by Senator Santos. While it will have little effect on the net General Fund – purchases by line agencies must be appropriated from the same source as funds for this Division – it will assist this Division in our activities. On Guam, by far the greatest number of Session Laws distributed is to the government.

The Governor of Guam;

The Lieutenant Governor of Guam:

Judges of the Superior Court

Judge of the District Court of Guam and the Judge of the District Court of the

Northern Mariana Islands;

Guam's Delegate to Congress

All Department Heads of the Government of Guam;

A reasonable number of copies to be used by those Departments and agencies of the government which require them in their regular business; and

Such agencies of state, territorial, trust territory and local governments (other than of Guam) which provide their publications free of charge to Guam.

All other persons, whether within or without the government of Guam, shall be required to pay for such publications in accordance with the price schedule established by the Compiler of Laws.

(c) Notwithstanding any other law, any department, agency of branch of the Government of Guam which receives money from the General Fund may purchase publications of the Compiler of Laws using any funds whatsoever which have been appropriated for the operations of that office,"

- 4. Two members to be appointed by the President of the Guam Bar Association from among the active membership of that Association.

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5. Two members, one each to be appointed from among the attorneys of the Department of Law and Public Defender's Office, respectively, by the Attorney General and the Public Defender, respectively.

6. The Compiler of Laws.

Those members who are to be appointed by another official shall be so appointed within 30 days of enactment of this section. Such members shall hold office for a term of two years so long as they hold the position which qualified them for appointment, whichever is shorter. Such persons may be reappointed. Appointment of Legislators shall terminate upon the termination of the Legislature during which they were appointed.

Any vacancy in the Commission shall be promptly filled in the same manner and by the same official who made the original appointment.

The members of this Commission shall receive no stipend, but may be reimbursed for any expenses incurred in Commission business, provided money is available for this purpose.

§1615. Commission's Purpose. The Commission shall:

Conduct a review of the structure of Guam's laws, rules & regulations and court reports and recommend ways by which these materials may be more readily available to users thereof, and the contents thereof more easily researched.
