





AN ACT TO AMEND RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**

1 **Section 1. (a) Authority for Department of Parks and Recreation to**
2 **promulgate rules and regulations for the operation of motorized water**
3 **recreational craft usage.** Subsection (f) of Section 26017 of the Government
4 Code authorizes the Department of Parks and Recreation to promulgate
5 rules and regulations providing for formulating a comprehensive plan and
6 policy for the operation of motorized water recreational craft.

7 **(b) Submission of rules and regulations in bill form.** Public Law 22-96
8 requires that rules and regulations proposed by a government agency, after
9 submission to the Governor, be transmitted to the Legislature in bill form for
10 the convenience of the Legislature. After the passage of Forty-five (45)
11 calendar days plus Seven (7) legislative days, the rules and regulations are
12 approved.

13 **(c) Approval of amendment to rules and regulations provided by the**
14 **Department of Parks and Recreation for Recreational Water Usage**
15 **Management Plan.** The following amendment to rules and regulations for
16 Department of Parks and Recreation is approved:

17 **"Operation of jet ski or motorized water recreational craft within the**
18 **reef or channel.** No person shall operate a Jet Ski or any Motorized Water
19 Recreational Craft within the reef or channel from (Area 4) Mannel Channel
20 to (Area 5) Pati Point, Yigo as shown in Key Map DPR95-1001 A RWUMP 003.

21 Specially permitted competitive or sporting events held in conjunction
22 with village fiestas, or for the purpose of local, national, or international
23 competition, may be exempted by discretion of the Director of the
24 Department of Parks and Recreation.

25 All MWRC Crafts shall have access to enter and exit areas outside the
26 reefs from any designated launching area or ramp facility, and only by the

- 1 most direct route consistent with safety consideration and shall be permitted
- 2 within this corridor at a speed limit not to exceed Five (5) miles per hour.





COMMITTEE REPORT**

on

Bill 572

"An act to amend rules and regulations for the Department of Parks and Recreation relative to the Recreational Water Use Management Plan (RWUMP)"

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Youth, Labor, Parks & Recreation having jurisdiction over matters relating to the Department of Parks and Recreation conducted a Public Hearing on Bill 572 *An act to amend rules and regulations for the Department of Parks and Recreation relative to the Recreational Water Use Management Plan (RWUMP)* on Wednesday, April 3, 1996 in the Public Hearing, Temporary Legislative Building in Agana. Notice was published in the Pacific Daily News. Chairman vicente c. pangelinan presided and the following members were in attendance: Senators Hope Cristobal, Tom Ada, Lou Leon Guerrero, Judith Won Pat-Borja, Mark Charfauros, Joanne Brown, and Ted Nelson.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

A. Written Testimony

No written testimony received.

B. Oral Testimony

Chairman Pangelinan opened the Public Hearing for oral testimony. Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation, Mr. Sonny Shelton began testimony in support of Bill 572. He indicated that amendments to the RWUMP were a result of various village hearings and the input derived from the community on how best to handle the eastern sea board of the island. He added that areas 4

and 5 of the plan, stretching from the Mannel Channel in Merizo to Padi Point, comprise the eastern sea board and are the focal points of the bill.

Mr. Shelton further stated that the basic amendment to the Bill prohibits the operation of personal water crafts or jet skis in the area with the exception of specially permitted events held in conjunction with fiestas or local, national or international competition. He cited the recent passage of law prohibiting the use of jet skis in the Pago Bay coupled with this present legislation would in actuality, encompass the entire eastern sea board and prohibit all types of jet ski activities, whether it be commercial or private.

Chairman Pangelinan questioned the clarity on the entity responsible for the placement of anchors or buoys for water craft operations as indicated in the Rules and Regulations of the plan. According to Mr. Shelton, commercial operators in general water areas see the need for buoys to delineate their course resulting in the actual anchoring being the responsibilities of GPD, DPR or the Army Corp of Engineers. However, Bill 572 is specifically for operations in the eastern portion of the island. The placement of markers would not be applicable. Mr. Shelton also added that the bill supports the efforts of the Division of Fish and Wildlife in addressing the natural resources of the Territory.

Sen. Mark Charfauros inquired as to extending the prohibition throughout the island except for the areas where the RWUMP has been established. He indicated that the western sea board area is especially problematic. Unrestricted operations on western side poses potential problems for the area's many fishermen, divers, other individuals using the water and poses dangers to marine life in the area. Mr. Shelton responded that while there is a diminishing number of areas for the operation of personal water crafts, the number of sales have increased. He added that by year's end, the plan for the western sea board will be completed. Mr. Shelton also mentioned that there is a the lack of safety training requirements for first time buyers of water crafts and posed the possibility of implementing a requirement to mimic that of the requirements of a drivers license.

Sen. Hope Cristobal brought forth questions regarding the lack of safety requirements in the management plan. In response, Mr. Shelton indicated that devices such as buoys require the approval of the Army Corp of Engineers. He further added that DPR has exerted a large effort towards safety. Hazardous surf signs, water current signs have been place throughout out public beaches, in addition to the publishing of a water safety calendar and stressed that safety is of extreme importance to the department.

Mr. Roy Brown also testified and stated problems occurring in the Apra Harbor area. The absence and lack of enforcement by police officers and park rangers have led to numerous accidents in the area. According to Mr. Shelton, budgetary constraints as well as the unclear authority of park rangers need clarification. In the Apra Harbor area, he stated for the Committee that the territorial boating safety law applies therefore, the responsibility falls under the jurisdiction of GPD.

Mr. Shelton concluded his testimony indicating his support for the passage of Bill 572 and stated that additional funding sources for personnel to ensure the safety of individuals using Guam's water area would be investigated.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Youth, Labor, Parks and Recreation having heard public testimony regarding Bill 572 "An act to amend rules and regulations for the Department of Parks and Recreation relative to the Recreational Water Use Management Plan" wishes to submit the Committee Report. With the recommendations voiced during the public hearing largely concentrating on the completion of the management plan for western sea board of the island, and the findings indicating the amendment to the rules and regulations of the Recreational Water Use Management Plan would in effect largely promote safety and the preservation of the natural water resources, the Committee further recommends **TO DO PASS** Bill 572.

Specially permitted competitive or sporting events held in conjunction with village fiestas, or for the purpose of local, national, or international competition, may be exempted by discretion of the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation.

All MWRC Crafts shall have access to enter and exit areas outside the reefs from any designated launching area or ramp facility, and only by the most direct route consistent with safety consideration and shall be permitted within this corridor at a speed limit not to exceed five (5) miles per hour.
