



AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (b) TO §8106 OF  
TITLE 7 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED,  
RELATIVE TO THE JURISDICTION OF COURT  
MARSHALS OVER THE JUDICIARY PREMISES, ITS  
PARKING LOTS AND ON ESPERANZA STREET.

1        **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**

2        **Section 1. Purpose.** The purpose of this Act is to grant Marshals of the  
3 Supreme Court and Superior Court of Guam jurisdiction over the Court premises,  
4 its parking lots and Esperanza Street, which fronts the Judiciary Complex, and on  
5 which persons using the Courts park, in order to regulate traffic, parking and to  
6 generally keep the peace at such places.

7        **Section 2.** Title 7 Guam Code Annotated §8106 is amended by adding the  
8 following:

9            “(b) The Chief Marshal of the Supreme Court, Chief Marshal of the Superior  
10 Court and deputies, while on any premises occupied by the Courts of Guam, parking  
11 lots controlled by the Courts of Guam, or on Esperanza Street, and acting within  
12 their official capacity, shall have the power of a peace officer to enforce applicable  
13 traffic laws and rules and regulations, including parking and parking for persons  
14 with disabilities, as provided in Title 16 of this Code (Vehicles). The Chief  
15 Marshals and Deputy Marshals shall obtain proper training in law enforcement, as  
16 evidenced by a certificate of completion from an accredited law enforcement  
17 academy or institute. The cost for training will be paid for by the Judicial Branch.  
18 Persons who have received the appropriate training are not required by this  
19 Subsection to repeat it. Traffic citation forms shall be distributed to the Chief  
20 Marshals and Deputy Marshals by the Traffic Violations Bureau Clerk of the  
21 Superior Court of Guam for use in enforcement of this Act.”
