BE ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

**Section 1.** Section 67103.1 of Chapter 67, Subarticle 11, Article 7 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

### "Section 67103.1. Guam Veterans Cemetery, Eligibility For.

The Guam Veterans Cemetery shall be used for the burial of persons who served honorably in the armed forces of the United States, the Insular Guard, the Guam Militia, the Guam Scouts, the Guam Combat Patrol or who were employed in a civil capacity on Wake Island on December 7, 1941, United States Merchant Marine vessels and other duties in direct support of the United States government at war and their spouses and dependents."

## COMMITTEE REPORT POWER, FOREIGN AFFAIRS & GENERAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES

#### **BILL NO. 448**

"An Act to Repeal and Reenact §67103.1 of Title 10 Guam Code Annotated Relative to Eligibility For Burial at the Guam Veterans Cemetery."

#### I. PUBLIC HEARING

Pursuant to §2103, Title 2, Guam Code Annotated, the presiding officer of the Legislature may certify that emergency conditions exist, and may waive the requirement for a public hearing on a bill. And in light of the existing conditions the island has faced in the wake of Supertyphoon Paka, the urgency to facilitate the passage of certain measures during Session on January 2, 1998 has arisen. Therefore, notwithstanding the provisions contained in Chapter 8, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Public Law 24-109, and Sections 7.01 and 7.01.01 of the Twenty-Fourth Guam Legislature's Standing Rules, no public hearing was held for Bill 448.

#### II. BACKGROUND

Pursuant to existing law, the Guam Veterans Cemetery shall be used for the burial of persons who served honorably in the armed forces of the United States, the Insular Guard, the Guam Militia, the Guam Scouts, the Guam Combat Patrol or who were employed in a civil capacity on Wake Island on December 7, 1941. The law also provides for burial, at the Guam Veterans Cemetery, for their spouses and dependents. Statutory provisions, however, do not afford the same benefits to those who served on United States Merchant Marine vessels, as well as those who served in other duties in direct support of the United States government while at war. Bill 448 was formulated for such a purpose, and seeks to acknowledge the intrepid spirit and dedicated service of these individuals. The measure also seeks to afford said benefits to their spouses and dependents.

#### IV. TESTIMONY

There being no public hearing for Bill 448, no written or oral testimony was provided.

#### IV. FINDINGS

The Committee finds that existing statutory provisions, for burial at the Guam Veterans Cemetery, are silent in regards to those individuals who served on United States Merchant Marine vessels and to those who served in other duties in direct support of the United States government while at war. The Committee also finds that these individuals

exhibited as much courage and valor as others involved in wartime conflict, and because of honorable service while in the employ of the United States Government during such trying times, they should be acknowledged, and should receive said benefits. The Committee further finds that their spouses and dependents be included, and receive the same.

#### **V. RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services hereby reports out Bill No. 448, with recommendation **TO DO PASS**.
