Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find a copy of Substitute Bill No. 373 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §18124.1, AND TO REPEAL §3110, BOTH OF TITLE 16 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO DRIVING WITH SUSPENDED LICENSES.", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-124.

Thank you to Senator Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson for this legislation designed to help keep people off of the road who drink and are under the influence of substances which make driving unsafe. This legislation clarifies the offense of "driving with suspended license", in an effort to encourage those who drink, drive, and are apprehended to stay off of Guam roads until their condition is resolved. Current law provides that a first offense for driving with a suspended license is a misdemeanor and subsequent offenses are Third Degree felonies.

This legislation clarifies that a suspended driver's license means operator's licenses, chauffeur's licenses, and other driving privileges, which would include learners permits or other types of privileges. The new penalty contained in this legislation calls for a punishment of a misdemeanor or a fine of up to \$1,000, or both. In aggravated cases, the court could order additional suspensions for up to 5 years.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §18124.1, AND TO REPEAL §3110, BOTH OF TITLE 16 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO DRIVING WITH SUSPENDED LICENSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new §18124.1 is hereby added to Article 1, Chapter 18 of

1 Title 16 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 18124.1. Driving While License Suspended. (a) No person shall drive a motor vehicle on a highway in Guam while knowing or having reason to know that his or her driver's license is suspended.

- (b) As used in this Section, 'suspended driver's license' means an operator's license, chauffeur's license, or driving privilege that has been suspended or revoked by judicial or administrative action, or seized by a police officer pursuant to law.
- (c) In any prosecution for driving while license suspended, competent evidence that defendant's license was surrendered to a police officer, or was suspended or revoked by order of a judge in open court, or that written notice of the suspension was mailed to defendant's last known address by the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall be prima facie evidence of defendant's knowledge of the suspension or revocation.
- (d) Driving while license suspended is a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or both. In addition to any other penalty imposed upon a conviction, the sentencing court may order the defendant's driver's license to be suspended for an additional consecutive period of up to five (5) years."

Section 2. Section 3110 of Article 1, Chapter 3 of Title 16 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby repealed.

Committee Report

on

Bill No. 373: AN ACT TO ADD A NEW 16 GCA §18124.1, AND TO REPEAL 16 GCA §3110, RELATIVE TO DRIVING WHILE SUSPENDED.

I. SUMMARY

The Committee on Judiciary, Public Safety and Consumer Protection held a public hearing on Bill No. 373 (substitute by the author) at the Legislative Public Hearing Room at 2:00 PM, Tuesday, October 21, 1997. Public Notice was published in the October 14 and October 21, 1997 editions of the Pacific Daily News.

Providing Public Testimony on the Bill:

Captain James M. Marques, Acting Chief of Police, oral and written (See Attachment)

Purpose:

The purpose of the bill is to repeal an obscure existing statute and to create new provisions prohibiting the major traffic offense of driving while suspended. The bill also enacts new statutory evidentiary provisions regarding the driver's requisite knowledge of the suspension or revocation of the license in committing the offense. The bill provides for severe additional sanctions on persons who continue to knowingly drive on Guam's highways after their license has been suspended or revoked for the commission of a serious traffic offense or other prior violation of the law.

Relationship to Existing Law:

Most of the bill's provisions are new.

Section 1 adds a new 16 GCA §18124.1 to the Vehicle Code Rules of the Road.

<u>Subsection (a)</u> describes the material elements of the offense of Driving While Suspended and specifically requires the culpable mental state of knowledge of the suspension on the part of the driver.

Subsection (b) defines the term, "suspended driver's license".

<u>Subsection (c)</u> provides for *prima facie* evidence of the requisite knowledge if there is competent evidence that the license had been surrendered by the driver, suspended or revoked in open court, or if notice was mailed to the defendant.

<u>Subsection (d)</u> classifies the offense as a misdemeanor, punishable by a maximum of one (1) year's imprisonment or by a One Thousand Dollar (\$1,000) fine, or both. In addition the court may order an additional suspension of the defendant's driver's license up to an additional consecutive five-year period.

<u>Section 2</u> of the bill repeals the existing statute, 16 GCA §3110.

SUMMARY of TESTIMONY

James M. Marques, Acting Chief of Police

Chief Marques testified that he and the management team members of the Guam Police Department concur with and fully endorse Bill No. 373 as drafted.

THERE WAS NO STATED OPPOSITION TO THE BILL.

III. FINDINGS and RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Judiciary, Public Safety and Consumer Protection finds strong support for the passage of Bill No. 373 as substituted by its author, Senator Barrett-Anderson and presents this report to the Twenty-Fourth Guam Legislature with its recommendation **TO DO PASS**.

On behalf of the men and women of the Guam Police Department, I would like to take this opportunity to express my sincerest Si Yuus Maase to you and your committee for your untiring and continuous efforts aimed at improving the quality of life for the people of Guam through meaningful, just and comprehensive legislation.

Copies of Bill Nos. 370, 371, 372, 373, and 374 have been staffed by management team members of the Guam Police Department and with the exception of just some very minor adjustments, it is the consensus of management that we are in concurrence with the overall context of the bills and endorse it fully, as to form.

The recommended changes are as follows:

AN ACT TO AMEND 16 GCA §§18121 and 18122, RELATING TO POSSESSION OR STORAGE OF MARIJUANA IN A MOTOR VEHICLE

COMMENTS:

Section 1. §§18121

Possession of marijuana is already a misdemeanor. Including it is not necessary.

Section 2, §§18122

Drug Free Guam Para Todos

Need to provide definition of usable quantity - amounts over one ounce are still usable.

AN ACT TO ADD NEW SECTIONS TO 16 GCA, RELATIVE TO ELUDING A POLICE OFFICER

COMMENTS:

Section 1. "§3301.2. Definitions

Visual command could mean hand signals when approaching a vehicle on foot such as when conducting stationary radar enforcement, etc.

Section 3. "§3301.3.

If included, sub-section (m) may allow those persons who are drugged or intoxicated a means of avoiding an otherwise valid charge.

AN ACT TO AMEND 16 GCA §181201(d), RELATIVE TO PROVIDING THE RESULTS OF BLOOD ALCOHOL OR TESTS TO POLICE OR PROSECUTORS

COMMENTS:

- 1. As a consideration, it may be helpful if the proposed legislation include urine samples.
- 2. There is no guidance as to when the blood test shall be conducted, at whose request or under what conditions, and whether doctors may refuse. Mandatory blood or urine testing for all victims of accidents would certainly bolster efforts at prosecuting repeat offenders who realize the implications of the tests.
