AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF GOVERNMENT OWNED LAND IN AGAT, TO OCCUPANTS MR. EDWARD T. RIOS AND MS. ELVINA REYES RIOS.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings. Since 1970, Mr. Edward T. Rios
- 3 has been occupying Lot Number 20, Block 27, Tract 120 in New Agat Village,

Guam, an area of approximately 880 ± square meters. Mr. Rios filed his application to purchase this property on January 28, 1980. The government failed to expedite this sale and Mr. Rios still does not have title to the land. On April 26, 1988, the acting Director of the Department of Land Management recommended that the selling price for Lot Number 20 be Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00), the same as similar lots sold by the government in the more developed areas of Pagachao or Pigua. Since this lot has been continuously occupied by Mr. Rios and his mother, Elvina Reyes Rios, for the past twenty six (26) years or more, it is only appropriate that the government complete the sale of this land to those whom they promised so many years

Section 2. Authorization to Sell. The Governor of Guam is authorized to sell government owned real property described as Lot Number 20, Block 27, Tract 120, Municipality of Agat, Guam containing an area of 880 ± square meters, as shown on Drawing Number C4-70T529, to Mr. Edward T. Rios and Ms. Elvina Reyes Rios for the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00).

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Section 3. Terms and Conditions. The government of Guam and the Rios family shall enter into a contractual agreement relative to the sale of Lot Number 20, Block 27, Tract 120, Agat, Guam, wherein applicable terms and conditions to govern the sale shall be formulated by the Director of the Department of Land Management. The buyers are prohibited from selling, transferring, reassigning or in any way relinquishing title to said property for a period of ten (10) years after the completion or full consummation of the land sale authorized herein. The Director of the Department of Land

- 1 Management shall ensure that all terms and conditions governing the sale are
- 2 met by the buyers prior to transferring title to said property.
- 3 Section 4. Sale Proceeds to Go to Chamorro Land Trust
- 4 Commission. Proceeds from the sale approved by this Act shall be
- 5 transferred to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission to cover administrative
- 6 and operational expenses.

PUBLIC NOTICE:

Pursuant to the requirements of the Standing Rules, notice of the Public Hearing on Bill No. 211 was published in the Pacific Daily News on June 12, 1997.

PUBLIC HEARING:

The Committee on Finance and Taxation conducted a public hearing on Thursday, June 12, 1997 to hear testimonies on Bill No. 211 The public hearing was held in the Legislative Public Hearing Room.

MEMBERS PRESENT:

The hearing was called to order by the Chairperson of the Committee on Finance and Taxation, Vice Speaker Anthony C. Blaz. Committee members present were:

BACKGROUND:

Vice Speaker Blaz addressed all individuals interested in providing testimony on Bill 211.

Elvina Rios testified in support of the bill.

James Diaz, Acting Administrative Director, Chamorro Land Trust Commission, testified in support of the bill. In his written testimony, he emphasized that Bill 211 is purely a housekeeping bill that will resolve an issue which should have been addressed sometime between 17 and 26 years ago.

Carl Aguon, Director Land Management submitted written testimony supporting the intent of the bill. However he questioned Section 4 of the bill stating that since DLM's resources will be used to formulate the terms and conditions of the sale, he suggested that it would be more appropriate that the proceeds should go to the Department of Land Management.

FINDINGS:

The Committee finds that:

- The Rios family has been occupying Lot No. 20, Block 27, Tract 120 in New Agat Village since 1970.
- The government failed to expedite sale of the land in since Mr. Rios filed his application on January 28, 1980.
- On April 26, 1988, the Department of Land Management recommended a selling price for Lot No. 20 be \$2,500.00 (same as similar lots sold by the government in the more developed areas of Pagachao or Pigua)

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

The Committee, having reviewed the testimonies presented at the hearing, does hereby recommend to the Legislature the following:

To Do Pass Bill 211, "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF GOVERNMENT OWNED LAND IN AGAT, TO OCCUPANTS EDWARD T. RIOS AND ELVINA REYES RIOS."

Mr. Chairman, on behalf of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission I wish to thank you for this opportunity to testify in favor of Bill No. 211.

Mr. Chairman, as the Commission sees it, Bill No. 211 in purely a housekeeping bill resolving an issue which should have been addressed sometime between 17 to 26 years ago.

Please allow us to be clear on one point, however. If this were a situation whereby the landowner would not have otherwise been entitled to acquire the lot in question pursuant to a preexisting legal process, then, the Commission would be opposed to the sale of this lot. In such a situation, we would respectfully request that Legislature instead require the occupants to conform to the applicable rules and regulations of the Commission.

Hafa Adai Senadot Blaz:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on proposed Bill Nos. 211, 212 and 219. Overall, the Department of Land Management has no objections to any of the bills referenced and is in full support of their passage. I would however like to bring one item to the attention of the Legislature pertaining to Section 4 of Bill No. 211.

This section states that the proceeds of the sale of Lot No. 20, Block 27, Tract 120 shall be transferred to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission to cover administrative and operational expenses. This same bill requires the Director of the Department of Land Management to formulate the terms and conditions that will govern the sale of this lot. It also stipulates that "The Director of the Department of Land Management shall ensure that all terms and conditions governing the sale are met by the buyer prior to transferring title to said property". During this time of budgetary constraints and cutbacks, I feel it would be more appropriate that the proceeds should go to DLM, as it is DLM's resources that will be used.
