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Section 1. A new §33103.1 is hereby added to Article 1, Chapter 33 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 33103.1. Non-application to Court Reporters and Other Court Officers. None of the provisions of this Chapter applies to any certification by official court reporters of transcripts of trials or other Court proceedings, or to the authentication of Court documents by other ministerial officers of the Court pursuant to statute or Court rule."

Bill No. 424: AN ACT TO ADD A NEW 5 GCA §33103.1,

RELATING TO THE MODEL NOTARY LAW'S NON-APPLICATION TO COURT REPORTERS AND OTHER MINISTERIAL OFFICERS OF THE

COURTS.

I. SUMMARY

The Committee on Judiciary, Public Safety and Consumer Protection held a public hearing on Bill No. 424 on Wednesday, November 12, 1997 at 9:00 AM at the Legislative Public Hearing Room. Public Notice was published in the October 26 and November 5 editions of the Pacific Daily News.

Committee Members Present:

Senator Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Chairperson Senator John C. Salas, Vice Chairperson Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr.

Purpose:

The bill is for the purpose of making it clear that the provisions of the Model Notary Law requiring certain formal notarization procedures for the certification and authentication of documents by notaries public do not apply to such acts performed by court reporters or other court officers with respect to trial transcripts and other official court papers.

Relationship to Existing Law:

The Model Notary Law codified in 5 GCA Chapter 33 is intended to apply only to the activity of Guam notaries. The bill adds a new §33103.1 to specifically state in the notary law itself that it does not apply to court reporters and other court officers who, pursuant to statute or court rule, certify and authenticate official court documents.

7 GCA Chapter 8 contains statutes covering "Ministerial Officers of the Court" and provides for the appointment of such officers and their official duties. "Official court reporters" is a statutory term of art used to designate persons appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court or the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court pursuant to 7

GCA §8102. The duties of the reporters are set forth in §8103 and include the official certification of the original records of court proceedings and transcripts thereof. Supreme Court and Superior Court Clerks also may certify certain papers and records filed in their respective courts. Their authority to certify court records stems from their individual enabling laws and requires no notarization in order to authenticate such records.

II. SUMMARY of TESTIMONY:

Charles H. Troutman, Compiler of Laws

Mr. Troutman testified that he agreed with the purpose of the bill, but he questioned whether the new provisions should be placed in the Notary Law itself.

Anthony P. Sanchez, Administrative Director, Superior Court of Guam

Mr. Sanchez told the Committee that the Presiding Judge supports the bill because it will remove the possibility of challenges to the authenticity of court documents that are certified by court officers in the course of their official duties. He later submitted a letter to the Chairperson affirming the Superior Court's support of the measure. (See attached)

There was no stated opposition to the bill.

III. FINDINGS and RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Committee on Judiciary, Public Safety and Consumer Protection finds support for the passage of Bill No. 424 as introduced by Senator Barrett-Anderson and presents its report to the Twenty-Fourth Guam Legislature with a recommendation **TO DO PASS**.
