THE **GUAM** ACT TO **AUTHORIZE** ANMEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY, WITH THE TO **CONCURRENCE OF** THE GOVERNOR, WITH THE **SECRETARY OF NEGOTIATE** DEFENSE, OTHER FEDERAL **DEPARTMENTS** AND AGENCIES, AND OTHER GOVERNMENTS THE FREELY ASSOCIATED STATES OF

MICRONESIA FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF \$105(k) OF THE COMPACT OF FREE ASSOCIATION ACT OF 1985 FOR PROVIDING HEALTH CARE SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

The Department of Defense 2 Legislative Statement. Section 1. Secretary is authorized by the Compact of Free Association Agreement to use 3 Department of Defense health facilities to provide health care services to the 4 people covered under the Agreement. The available facility, Guam Naval 5 Hospital, has repeatedly expressed that they cannot provide health care 6 service in spite of the provisions contained in the Compact of Free Association 7 8 Agreement. The Guam Legislature is of the opinion that the Guam Memorial 9 Hospital Authority ("GMHA") can provide health services for those patients referred for treatment. Tripler Army Hospital in Hawaii is accepting patient 10 11 referrals from the Compact of Free Association Agreement, but limited only to 12 tertiary patient care and tropical diseases. Furthermore, GMHA and the 13 medical staff, in alignment with its mission statement and commitment to 14 delivering quality health patient care, can satisfy the intent of §105(k), Title 1, 15 48 USC §1681 of the Compact of Free Association Act of 1985 and should 16 negotiate a contractual agreement to provide these health care services and 17 not only realize over Three Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars 18 (\$3,800,000) per year of patient revenue services, but resolve the issue of 19 medical referral for patients that are covered under the provisions of the 20 Compact of Free Association Act of 1985.

Section 2. Section 80104(s) is hereby added to Chapter 80, Division 2 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"(s) With the concurrence Negotiate with appropriate Federal official (Secretary of Defense, officials of Tripler Army Hospital, etc.) for the implementation of §105(k) of the Compact of Free Association Act of 1985 with the Freely Associated States of Micronesia.

All terms of the agreement shall be negotiated by the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority in the best interests of the people of Guam. The agreement must be submitted to the Governor for his review and approval."

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform and Federal Affairs held a public hearing on Tuesday, March 10, 1998 at 10:35 a.m. in the conference room of the Chairman of the Committee on Rules, Government Reform and Federal Affairs. Public Notice of the hearing was announced in the March 5th, 6th, 8th, and 10th, 1998 issues of the Pacific Daily News.

Senators in attendance were:

Senator Mark Forbes, Chairman Senator Edwardo J. Cruz, Member Senator Frank Blas Aguon Jr.

There being no individuals present to testify on the bill, the Chairman declared the bill formally heard. The Chairman indicated that the Committee would accept any written testimony on this bill during the next few days. Mr. Tyrone J. Taitano, Hospital Administrator of the Guam Memorial Hospital, submitted written testimony in support of Bill 503.

II. SUMMARY OF WRITTEN TESTIMONY

Mr. Tyrone J. Taitano, Administrator of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, submitted written testimony in support of Bill 503 as amended by the author (attached).

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee finds that Bill No 503, as amended by the author would enable the Guam Memorial Hospital to generate additional annual revenues of at least \$3.8 million. The Committee further finds that the legislation would resolve the issues surrounding the delivery of health care to patients who are covered by the Compact of Free Association. Moreover, the Guam Memorial Hospital is prepared to establish the rules and regulations for administering the provisions being mandated by the Guam Legislature.

Accordingly, the Committee on Rules, Government Reform and Federal Affairs, to which Bill No. 503 was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to the Twenty-fourth Guam Legislature **TO DO PASS Bill No. 503 as amended by the author** "An act to authorize the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority with the concurrence of the Governor to negotiate with the Secretary of Defense, other federal departments and agencies and other governments of the Freely Associated States of Micronesia for the implementation of Section 105(k) of the Compact of Free Association Act of 1985 for providing health care services."
