Enclosed please find a copy of Bill No. 528 (LS), "AN ACT TO ADD §§80117 AND 80118 TO CHAPTER 80, DIVISION 4, PART 2 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY TO SOLICIT AND/OR RECEIVE DONATIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS, GIFTS AND BEQUESTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING PATIENT CARE TO THE COMMUNITY, AND TO CITE THIS ACT AS THE, 'GMHA Donations. Contributions, Gifts and Bequests Utilization and Administration Act of 1998", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-176.

This legislation allows the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) to set up a separate fund to accept donations for specified items or services. This will allow donors to earmark their gifts for purchase of items or services that they have a personal desire to give, while at the same time allow the GMHA to solicit gifts for items and services that are needed.

This type of program is widely in effect in health care institutions in other locations. It brings the community into partnership with the health care institution by providing a method for people to give from their hearts to programs vitally needed by the community.

AN ACT TO ADD §§80117 AND 80118 TO CHAPTER 80, DIVISION 4, PART 2 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE **GUAM MEMORIAL AUTHORIZING** HOSPITAL AUTHORITY TO SOLICIT AND/OR RECEIVE DONATIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS, GIFTS THE **PURPOSE** AND **BEQUESTS FOR** THE **IMPROVING PATIENT** CARE TO COMMUNITY, AND TO CITE THIS ACT AS THE,

"GMHA Donations. Contributions, Gifts and Bequests Utilization and Administration Act of 1998."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM: 1 Legislative Findings. The Guam Legislature finds that 2 Section 1. government health care facilities, especially the Department of Public Health 3 and Social Services ("DPHSS"), the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority 4 ("GMHA") and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse 5 ("DMHSA") are potential recipients of donations, contributions, gifts and 6 bequests from philanthropists and the general public for whatever useful 7 8 purpose the donor may deem fit. Further, it is the finding of the Guam Legislature that among the 9 10 government health care facilities enumerated above, only the Administrator 11 of GMHA has no specific authority to solicit, receive and utilize contributions, :12 donations, gifts and bequests. Section 80112(b) of Title 10 of the Guam Code 13 Annotated provides that all monies received by the Hospital from whatever 14 source derived shall be deposited in the "Hospital Operations Fund," including 15 transfers from the government of Guam General Fund. There is no specific 16 recognition for donations, contributions, gifts and bequests, if any. 17 The DPHSS Director, on the other hand, has the authority, under Section 18 2112 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, which reads: 19 Gifts for Welfare Purposes. "Section 2112. The Director 20 is authorized to accept, on behalf of the government of Guam, gifts, 21 bequests and donations for welfare purposes, and may expend any

sums so received for purposes set out in this Chapter, in addition to the

2 regular appropriations made for such purposes."

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Moreover, the DMHSA Director is similarly authorized under §86106 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, which reads in part:

"Section 86106. Auxiliary Fund. There is established separate and apart from any other government funds, a Department Auxiliary Fund, in which monies and assets from fund raising activities and charitable contributions shall be deposited."

To adequately recognize contributions, donations, gifts and bequests received by GMHA, in fact, in order to encourage private parties to contribute, donate, give gifts and bequeath to the Hospital, a similar authority needs to be promulgated on GMHA's behalf.

Section 2. Legislative Intent. The Guam Legislature finds it necessary, therefore, and in light of the perennial funding insufficiency encountered by GMHA, for this government agency to be authorized to solicit and/or receive donations, contributions, gifts and bequests for the purpose of improving patient health care to the community. This intent could be served by adding a new §80117 to Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated in order to provide policy guidelines in the utilization and administration of such donations, contributions, gifts and bequests solicited and received.

Section 3. Title. This Act may be referred to as the, "GMHA Donations. Contributions, Gifts and Bequests Utilization and Administration Act of 1998."

Section 4. Section §80117 is hereby added to Chapter 80, Division 4, Part 2 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

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Solicitation, Acceptance, Utilization and "Section 80117. Administration of Donations, Contributions, Gifts, and Bequests for (a) The Administrator of the Guam Specific Purposes. Memorial Hospital Authority ('GMHA'), with the concurrence of the GMHA Board of Trustees, shall be authorized to solicit, accept, utilize and administer on behalf of GHMA, donations, contributions, gifts and bequests for any specific purpose relative to medical care, and may expend any sums so received for purposes intended by the giver, or donor, in addition to the regular appropriations made for such purposes. Such donations, contributions, gifts and bequests received, or income accrued on a continuing basis, shall, as a matter of policy, be reflected in the annual budget of the receiving agency as credit to offset the expense budget request for that agency for the fiscal year under consideration.

- (b) GMHA shall promulgate rules and regulations to reflect the purpose of this Act and shall periodically report contributions, donations, gifts and bequests actually received by the Governor and the Speaker of the Guam Legislature for proper acknowledgement purposes."
- Section 5. Section 80118 is hereby added to Chapter 80, Division 4,
 23 Part 2 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:
- "Section 80118. Receiving of Revenues from
 Vending Machine. GMHA is hereby authorized to install

vending machines or similar machines, which can be contractual, for the purpose of serving the Hospital and its employees and shall be entitled to all revenues from such activities. The Hospital Administrator shall use such revenues for the Hospital employees health or other services for the benefit of its employees." PL24-176

Committee on Health and Human Services Report on Bill No. 528

AN ACT TO RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY TO SOLICIT AND/OR RECEIVE DONATIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS, GIFTS, AND BEQUESTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING PATIENT CARE TO THE COMMUNITY BY ADDING NEW \$\$80117 AND 80118, CHAPTER 80, DIVISION TO TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO CITE THIS ACT AS "THE GMHA DONATIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS, GIFTS, AND BEQUESTS SOLICITATION, UTILIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION ACT OF 1998."

Public Hearing:

The Committee on Health and Human Services conducted a public hearing on Wednesday, March 11, 1998 at 9:30 a.m. to hear testimonies on Bill No. 528, "AN ACT TO RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY TO SOLICIT AND/OR RECEIVE DONATIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS, GIFTS, AND BEQUESTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING PATIENT CARE TO THE COMMUNITY BY ADDING NEW §880117 AND 80118, CHAPTER 80, DIVISION TO TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO CITE THIS ACT AS "THE GMHA DONATIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS, GIFTS, AND BEQUESTS SOLICITATION, UTILIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION ACT OF 1998." The public hearing was held in the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room.

Members Present:

The hearing was called to order by the Chairperson of the Committee on Health and Human Services, Senator Edwardo J. Cruz with Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr. in attendance.

Testimony:

Appearing before the Committee and presenting testimony in support of the passage and enactment of Bill No. 508 was Tyrone J. Taitano, Administrator, Guam Memorial Hospital. Mr. Taitano testified that the Hospital sully supports the passage and enactment of Bill No. 528. According to Mr. Taitano, the legislation is intended to extend the privilege to GMHA by offering an additional source of funding for the Hospital. In closing, Mr. Taitano informed the Committee that the Hospital stands ready to insure that revenues derived from vending machines benefit the employees.

It was also discussed that the proposed program would not interfere with the Hospital Volunteer Association programs in receiving donation for the Hospital.

According to the Senator, the program envisioned in Bill No. 528 is to augment, and on a larger scale, allow the Hospital to receive contributions from other sources.

In closing, the Chairperson informed the members that the Committee will try and submit its report for consideration at the next Legislative Session. There being no further witnesses, the Chairperson adjourned the Committee hearing on Bill No. 528.

Findings:

The Committee finds that:

- 1. Government health care facilities, especially the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA), and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (DMHSA) are potential recipients of donations, contributions, gifts, and bequests from philanthropists and the general public for whatever useful purpose the donor may deem fit.
- 2. Among all the government health care facilities, only the Administrator of GMHA has no specific authority to solicit, receive, and utilize contributions, donations, gifts and bequests. Section 80112(b) of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated provides that all monies received by the hospital from whatever source derived shall be deposited in the "Hospital Operations Fund," including transfers from the government of Guam General Fund. There is no specific recognition for donations, contributions, gifts, and bequests, if any.
- 3. The Director of Public Health and Social Services, on the other hand, has the authority, under §2112 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated which reads: "Gifts for Welfare Purposes. The Director is authorized to accept, on behalf of the government of Guam, gifts, bequests and donations for welfare purposes, and may expend any sums so received for purposes set out in this Chapter, in addition to the regular appropriations made for such purposes."
- 4. Also, the Director of Mental Health and Substance Abuse is similarly authorized under §86106 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated which reads in part: "§86106. Auxiliary Fund. There is established separate and apart from any other government funds, a Department Auxiliary Fund, in which monies and assets from fund raising activities and charitable contributions shall be deposited."
- 5. To adequately recognize contributions, donations, gifts and bequests received by GMHA, and to encourage private parties to contribute, donate, and in light of the perennial funding problems it is necessary to authorize the

Hospital to policy guidelines to in the utilization and administration of such donations, contributions and gifts.

Recommendation:

The Committee, having reviewed the testimonies presented at the hearing, does hereby recommend to the Guam Legislature that Bill No. 528, "AN ACT TO RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY TO SOLICIT AND/OR RECEIVE DONATIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS, GIFTS, AND BEQUESTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING PATIENT CARE TO THE COMMUNITY BY ADDING NEW §\$80117 AND 80118, CHAPTER 80, DIVISION TO TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO CITE THIS ACT AS "THE GMHA DONATIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS, GIFTS, AND BEQUESTS SOLICITATION, UTILIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION ACT OF 1998," be passed by the Guam Legislature.

ADMINISTRATION ACT OF 1998."

Co-Sponsors: Senator Felix P. Camacho.

Recommendation: To do pass.

Overview and Intent:

If passed, Bill No. 528 (LS) would authorize the Guam Memorial Hospital, like any other government health care agencies to solicit, receive, and utilize contributions, donations, gifts, and bequests under a special account separate from the Hospital Operations Fund. Presently, \$80112(b) of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated provides that all monies received by the Hospital from whatever source derived shall be deposited in the "Hospital Operations Fund." Creation of this special fund will enhance the Hospital's chance of receiving contributions, donations, gifts, and bequests from private parties which would help GMH in providing continued adequate health care while at the same time

enable government officials to appropriately recognize, on behalf of the Hospital and the people of Guam, such contributions, donations, gifts, and bequests actually received.

Section Analysis:

- Section 1. <u>Legislative Findings</u>. This section states that among the major health care facilities operated by the government, the Hospital is the only one that is not "officially" authorized to maintain a separate account for contributions, donations, gifts, and bequests. The Guam Legislature finds that the Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, as provided by §2112 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, "is authorized to accept, on behalf of the government of Guam, gifts, bequests and donations for welfare purposes, and may expend any sums so received for purposes set out in this Chapter, in addition to the regular appropriations made for such purposes." Also, on the other hand, the Director of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, is similarly authorized by §86106 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated which reads: "There is established separate and apart from any other government funds, a Department Auxiliary Fund, in which monies and assets from fund raising activities and charitable contributions shall be deposited." In light of these precedents, this section justifies the need for an equivalent special account for GMHA.
- **Section 2.** <u>Legislative Intent.</u> This section clearly states it is the intent of the Guam legislature to authorize the Hospital to solicit, receive, maintain a separate account, utilize and administer contributions, donations, gifts and bequests from private parties.
- **Section 3.** <u>Title.</u> Refers to Bill No. 528 (LS) as "The GMHA Donations, Contributions, Gifts, and Bequests Solicitation, Utilization and Administration Act of 1998."
- Section 4. <u>Amendment; New Section 80117</u>. This section proposes to add a new Section 80117 to authorize the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority Board of Trustees to "solicit, accept, utilization and administer donations, contributions, gifts, and bequests for specific purposes" on behalf of GMH and the people of Guam. Furthermore, this Section also requires GMHA to promulgate rules and regulations to reflect the intent and purpose of this Act and to periodically report to the Governor and the Speaker of the Guam Legislature all donations, contributions, gifts and bequests actually received so that appropriate acknowledgement could be initiated.
- **Section 5.** <u>Amendment; New Section 80118</u>. This section adds a new Section 80118 to Title 10, Guam Code Annotated authorizing the GMHA to install vending machines or similar machines, through contractual arrangements, for the purpose of providing needed revenue to the Hospital Employee Association and morale welfare.

Testimony of Tyrone J. Taitano
Hospital Administrator
Guam Memorial Hospital Authority
before the Committee on Health & Human Services
March 11, 1998

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. For the record, my name is Tyrone Taitano. I am the Hospital Administrator and I am here to present testimony in support of Bills 503 and 528.

Bill No. 503

Bill No. 503 is an act to authorize GMHA to negotiate with the Secretary of Defense to provide health services for those who are covered under the Compact of Free Association. The proposed legislation is based on the premise that GMHA is capable of providing services for medical referrals from the federated states, as the bill's authors recognize that GMH has, in fact, been providing such services. By authorizing GMHA to negotiate a contractual agreement to provide these services, Bill No. 503 would enable the Hospital to generate annual earnings of \$3.8 million. The legislation would also resolve the issues surrounding the delivery of care to patients who are covered by the Compact of Free Association.



The estimated cost of providing Hospital care for the FAS citizenry ranges from \$2.4 million to \$3.8 million as noted in Bill 503. The Authority will ensure that any negotiations pertaining to the delivery of hospital services will adequately address the high cost of care.

The \$85,000 appropriation for executing a legal agreement will enable GMHA to initiate the negotiations process, although the funding may be insufficient for completing the process. There is no guarantee that the federal government would be willing to negotiate with GMHA at this point in time. In fact, history suggests that getting the federal government to the negotiation table may be quite a feat—a lengthy process in and of itself. However, it is clear that we must proceed with the efforts to formally address the delivery of and compensation for healthcare under the Compact of Free Association. Therefore, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority supports the passage of Bill No. 503.

Bill No. 528

GMHA also supports the passage of Bill 528: an act to authorize the Authority to solicit and/or receive donations, contributions and gifts for the purpose of improving patient care. The bill's authors recognize that GMHA is presently the only government healthcare facility that is not allowed to do so. Bill 503 is intended to extend the privilege to GMHA and thereby offer an additional source of funding for the Hospital's patient care activities.

The Hospital agrees with the intent of Bill 503. We are prepared to establish the rules for administering the legislative provisions, specifically to ensure that all donations are consistent with the mission of the Hospital as well as with the guidelines for product and equipment standardization. In so doing, GMHA will protect and preserve the integrity of the proposed legislation.

The Hospital also supports Section 5 of Bill No. 528 which would allow GMHA to retain the revenues from the Hospital's vending machines for the benefit of GMHA employees. Again, the authors of the proposed legislation recognize an alternative source of funding. The use of such funding for the benefit of the Hospital's employees is most welcomed.

Fiscal Note Comments

Bill No. 528 is an act authorizing the Guam Memorial Hospitul Authority (GMHA) to solicit and/or receive donations, contributions, gifts, and bequests for the purpose of improving patient care to the community. It also authorizes GMHA to collect revenues from the installation of vending machines or other similar machines to be used for the purpose of benefiting the GMHA employees. As such, this Bill, if enacted, will have a positive financial impact to GMHA especially if significant donations and contributions are granted. The impact, therefore, would be dependent on the amount of revenues collected and donations, contributions, gifts, etc. received by GMHA within a specific time period.

The General Fund revenues available for appropriation, as adopted in Public Law 24-59, is \$353,292,790 (includes \$7,600,000 Autonomous Agency Fund, \$7,000,000 Use Tax and \$36,000,000 in Section 30 funds). The appropriations for FY1998 in P.L. 24-59 is \$346,128,092 plus continuing appropriations for debt service of \$2,504,141 for a total appropriation against of \$348,632,234. Pursuant to P.L. 24-59, surplus FY1998 revenues available for appropriations is \$4.6M.

However, it should be noted that the expected combined collection from both the Autonomous Agency Fund and the Use Tax is only \$3.0M, a reduction of \$11.6M (\$14.6 - 3.0 = \$11.6). As such, \$341,739,919 in revenue less \$348,632,234 in appropriations leaves an <u>expected shortfall of (\$6,892,315) as of P.L. 24-59.</u>

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
