Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 512 (COR), "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE MAYORS' COUNCIL TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES AND SERVICES NOT TO EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) WITHOUT COMPLYING WITH NORMAL GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES.", which I have signed into law today as **Public Law No. 24-184.** 

The mayors of our villages are on the front line of many emergencies and situations which need quick response. The procurement laws of Guam are burdensome and do not allow for small amounts of money needed immediately. Substitute Bill No. 512 solves some of these problems by allowing our mayors to use telephonic quotes to purchase items under \$1,000, and to use up to \$500 for purchases without the need of going through procurement laws. This is analogous to the use of \$500 from a petty cash fund for unanticipated needs, as is done in most businesses.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE MAYORS' COUNCIL TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES AND SERVICES NOT TO EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) WITHOUT

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# COMPLYING WITH NORMAL GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES.

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### **1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

Section 1. Legislative Findings. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the 2 Mayors are the first line government officials the people of Guam look to for 3 services and assistance and, in many instances, their needs are of an 4 immediate nature that require instant solution. However, the procurement 5 procedures of the government of Guam sometimes do not provide the 6 flexibility to respond to immediate needs of the people they serve, placing the 7 Mayors in a very difficult situation of being forced to procure needed supplies 8 9 or services at their own expense, or by circumventing the procurement procedures of the government of Guam or follow the procedures and fail to 10 respond to an immediate need. In this respect, I Liheslaturan Guahan intends 11 12 to correct this difficult situation by specifically exempting the Mayors' Council from the procurement procedures of the government of Guam for purchases 13 of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or less. 14

Section 2. Section 11 of Chapter IV of Public Law Number 24-59, as re enacted by Section 16 of Public Law Number 24-143, is hereby repealed and
 re-enacted to read as follows:

"Direct Purchase. The Mayors' Council is hereby authorized
 to purchase equipment, supplies and services not to exceed One
 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per purchase, provided the Mayors'
 Council solicits a minimum of three (3) informal written or telephonic
 quotations from vendors able to supply the equipment, supplies or

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services sought provided; however, for purchases under Five Hundred 1 Dollars (\$500.00), the Mayors' Council is authorized to procure 2 equipment, supplies or services without the necessity of going through 3 the normal government procurement procedures. Mayors shall ensure 4 5 that none of the purchases under this Section shall be artificially divided 6 to meet the requirements of this Section. Any violation by any Mayor shall cause that Mayor to lose the right to purchase under this Section. 7 A determination of whether a violation of this Section occurred will be 8 9 made by the Chief Procurement Officer of the government of Guam's

### COMMITTEE REPORT POWER, FOREIGN AFFAIRS & GENERAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES

### BILL NO. 512

"An Act Authorizing the Mayors' Council to Purchase Equipment, Supplies and Services Not to Exceed Five Hundred (\$500.00) Without the Necessity of Going Through Normal Government Procedures."

### I. <u>PUBLIC HEARING</u>

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & Government Services (CPFA&GGS) held a public hearing on Tuesday, April 14, 1998 at 9:00 a.m. to hear testimony on Bill No. 512(COR), "An Act Authorizing the Mayors' Council to Purchase Equipment, Supplies and Services Not to Exceed (\$500.00) Without the Necessity of Going Through Normal Government Procedures."

The hearing was called to order by Senator Felix P. Camacho, Chairman of CPFA&GGS. Members present included Senators A. C. Lamorena V, Vicente C. Pangelinan and Francisco P. Camacho with Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr. as guest.

Present to testify were: Mr. Lorenzo C. Aflague, Chief Procurement Officer, General Services Agency representing Mr. Michael Reidy, Director of the Department of Administration; Dededo Mayor Jose A. Rivera and Mr. Frank J. C. Camacho, Executive Director, both representing the Mayors' Council.

### II. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

The Mayors' Council has been appealing consistently and urgently for the Guam Legislature to grant the Council procurement flexibility in view of their limited staff and time sensitive needs to better serve their constituency.

Specifically, the request entails allowing as well three (3) telephonic quotations from vendors for procurement of equipment, supplies or services not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and authorizing a waiver of normal procurement procedures for equipment and services in addition to supplies valued under Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

Necessary legislation in the form of Bill 512(COR) must repeal Section 11 of Chapter IV of Public Law No. 24-59 as re-enacted by Section 16 of Public Law No. 24-143.

### III. <u>TESTIMONY</u>

**Mr. Lorenzo Aflague**, Chief Procurement Officer, General Services Agency, representing Mr. Michael Reidy, Director of the Department of Administration, provided brief written testimony against the Bill. He indicated the proposed procurement provisions were not necessary and that

flexibility can be still realized under current law. He recommended changes which were already included in a substitute version of the Bill if it were to be passed.

**Mayor Joe Rivera** explained the purpose of the Bill as noted earlier under Item II of this report and described the problems experienced by the Mayors' Council with ineffective and seriously slow procurement actions. He emphasized the need for flexibility and better capacity to procure much needed equipment, supplies and services at the village level where the needs for services are immediate and direct with constituents. He emphasized that because of limited staffing and other resources, the capacity for timely procurement processing is essential. The Mayors' Council strongly support the passage of Bill No. 512(COR) as substituted.

**Mr. Frank Camacho**, Executive Director of the Mayors' Council, basically reiterated the points made by Mayor Rivera and cited specifically the need to allow telephonic quotations as well as written and to include equipment and services with supplies on the waiver for items valued under five hundred dollars (\$500.00).

### IV. <u>FINDINGS</u>

The Committee finds that Bill 512(COR) as originally introduced is in need of technical changes based on testimonies and therefore has developed substitute Bill 512(COR).

### V. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services hereby reports out Bill No. 512(COR), as substituted by the Committee with the recommendation *TO DO PASS*.
