Enclosed please find Bill No. 459 (COR), "AN ACT TO AMEND §§15603(c) AND 15604(a) OF ARTICLE 6, CHAPTER 15, DIVISION 3 OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXPANDING THE ELIGIBILITY FOR THE JOHN F. QUAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP.", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-187.

This legislation expands the course of study for which the John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship can be applied. The late Senator John F. Quan was very interested in promoting the ocean resources of our island, and the John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship was instituted in his memory to promote the study of ocean science to preserve and protect our ocean resources.

In order to promote this scholarship, this legislation expands the eligible courses of study to include fisheries, maritime industries, and maritime law. All of these studies will promote the preservation and protection of our ocean resources, and scholarships granted for their study would continue to be a fitting memorial to the late Senator.

AN ACT TO AMEND §§15603(c) AND 15604(a) OF ARTICLE 6, CHAPTER 15, DIVISION 3 OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXPANDING THE ELIGIBILITY FOR THE JOHN F. QUAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings. *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that the John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship was established to commemorate the leadership of the late Honorable John F. Quan as an advocate of Guam's ownership rights to the ocean resources surrounding the Island, and to help advance Guam's scientific understanding of its ocean resources . *I Liheslaturan Guahan* further finds that there is a need to expand on the noble goals of the scholarship to include deserving Guam students who wish to further their understanding and training in the fishing and maritime industries.

- **Section 2.** Section 15603(c) of Article 6, Chapter 15, Division 3 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "(c) The applicant must present to the Board, prior to the granting of the award, satisfactory proof that of admission to an accredited U.S. university, college or professional or technical institute, as a full-time student to pursue a program of study in ocean resource science, or fisheries, maritime industries or maritime law, including studies in:
    - (1) living resources;
    - (2) non-living resources, such as hard seabed materials, geothermal venting, precious minerals, submarine currents and other non-living resources;
      - (3) ocean resource technology;
      - (4) pollutant mitigation technology;
      - (5) fishing and maritime industries; and
  - (6) maritime law."

1	Section 3. Section 15604(a) of Article 6, Chapter 15, Division 3 of Title 17
2	of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	"(a) Payment of tuition, fees and related field research costs shall be
4	as follows:
5	(1) Undergraduate Scholarship Award: Associate Degree, for a
6	period not to exceed two (2) scholastic years. Technical training
7	certificate, for a period not to exceed two (2) scholastic years.
8	Bachelor's Degree, for a period not to exceed four (4) scholastic years.
9	(2) Graduate Scholarship Award: Master's Degree, for a period
10	not to exceed two (2) scholastic years. Doctoral Degree, for a period
11	not to exceed four (4) scholastic years. Juris Doctor Degree, for a
12	period not to exceed four (4) scholastic years."

# COMMITTEE REPORT PUBLIC HEARING Bill No. 459 Thursday, March 12, 1998

### **Public Hearing**

The Committee on Education convened for a public hearing at 9:00a.m Thursday, March 12, 1998 to hear testimony on Bill No. 459: "AN ACT TO AMEND 17 GCA §15603 (c) AND §15604 (a) TO EXPAND THE ELIGIBILITY FOR THE JOHN F. QUAN MEMORIAL SHCOLARSHIP FOR OCEAN RESOURCE SCIENCE AND RESEARCH."

The hearing was called to order by the Chairperson of the committee, Senator Lawrence F. Kasperbauer. Also present were committee members Senators Edwardo J. Cruz and Francisco P. Camacho.

#### **Background**

Mrs. Marie Nelson, Chairperson of the Scholarship Committee of the University's Board of Regents was present to offer oral testimony in support of Bill 459. Mrs. Nelson stated that the Scholarship Committee has not had the opportunity to award the Quan scholarship. She further stated that the scholarship has never been announced to the students and that there are probably only a few students who may have knowledge of the scholarship. To conclude her testimony, Mrs. Nelson reiterated her support for the bill and encouraged that the bill be passed as soon as possible so that the Committee may properly announce the scholarship to the public once it becomes law.

**Dr. Jose T. Nededog,** President of the University submitted written testimony in full support of the enactment of Bill 459. The President stated that the amendment to the existing scholarship recognizes the island's need for expertise in ocean resource science, fisheries, maritime industries, and maritime law. He further added that tapping Guam's ocean resources and taking advantage of the island's geographical location for fishing and maritime industries provide great potential for diversifying Guam's tourism industry. Dr. Nededog also mentioned that since the inception of the John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship, the University has neither received and application nor award a scholarship under the program. He believes that the expansion of the scholarship will provide for greater incentive and opportunity for students to apply for the scholarship and pursue studies in an area that could be vital to Guam's future economy

Mr. Jesse A. Leon Guerrero, Acting Chairman of the University's Board of Regents also submitted written testimony in favor of the passage of Bill 459. Mr. Leon Guerrero stated in his testimony that the expansion of the Scholarship to include areas of Ocean Resource Science and Research would continue to prepare our local people to meet the demands of a new field that may one day become a vital part of Guam's economy.

Mr. Phil Protasio, President of the University's Student Government Association was also present to offer his oral support for the bill.

Chairman Lawrence F. Kasperbauer concluded the testimony on Bill 459 by reiterating the unanimous support for the implementation of the bill.

### Findings and Recommendations:

The Committee on Education finds that since the inception of the John F. Quan Memorial Scholarship no one has applied for or been awarded a scholarship under this limited program. The Committee further finds that the expansion of the Scholarship to include training in the fishing and maritime industries will provide more of an incentive and opportunity for students to apply for the scholarship and pursue studies in this area.

Therefore, the Committee on Education, to which was referred Bill No. 459: "AN ACT TO AMEND 17 GCA §15603 (c) AND §15604 (a) TO EXPAND THE ELIGIBILITY FOR THE JOHN F. QUAN MEMORIAL SHCOLARSHIP FOR OCEAN RESOURCE SCIENCE AND RESEARCH," herein reports back with its findings and recommendation TO DO PASS.

Fiscal Note Comments: Bill No. 459

The Bureau is unable to ascertain the financial impact of this Bill due to unavailability of information.

The General Fund revenues available for appropriation, as adopted in Public Law 24-59, is \$353,292,790 (includes \$7,600,000 Autonomous Agency Fund, \$7,000,000 Use Tax and \$36,000,000 in Section 30 funds). The appropriations for FY1998 in P.L. 24-59 is \$346,128,092 plus continuing appropriations for debt service of \$2,504,141 for a total appropriation against of \$348,632,234. Pursuant to P.L. 24-59, surplus FY1998 revenues available for appropriations is \$4.6M.

However, it should be noted that the expected combined collection from both the Autonomous Agency Fund and the Use Tax is only \$3.0M, a reduction of \$11.6M (\$14.6 - 3.0 = \$11.6). As such, \$341,739,919 in revenue less \$348,632,234 in appropriations leaves an expected shortfall of (\$6.892,315) as of P.L. 24-59.
