2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 3 finds that, in some cases, public preschool testing has been negatively affected 4 by the recent decision of the Interim Governing Board to move up the school 5 calendar by approximately three weeks, causing an unintended form of discrimination on children whose 4th birthdays do not meet current testing 6 7 age requirements. I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds their needs to be flexibility beyond that which currently exists in the eligibility requirements for 8 9 enrollment of children into the Gifted and Talented Education Preschool 10 Variations from year to year in the starting date for the 11 commencement of classes makes it difficult for parents to plan for enrollment 12 of their children. Further, without such flexibility, changes in the starting date 13 of classes may result in the exclusion from the program of certain students 14 who would otherwise be eligible.

It is the intent, therefore, of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to ensure that ample opportunity be afforded our children for participation in the GATE Preschool Program.

Section 2. Section 6104 of Article 1, Chapter 6, Division 2 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:

20 "Section 6104. Early Entrance Date; Public Schools: Gifted Children.

The Board shall establish identification and enrollment policies for children who are academically gifted. The policy shall provide that a child who is academically gifted may be enrolled even though he or she has not reached the age required by §6103 of this Title, but not lower than age four (4)

Bill No. 671 (COR): AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 6104 OF CHAPTER 6, TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING BOARD POLICY THAT SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE IDENTIFICATION AND ENROLLMENT OF A CHILD WHO IS ACADEMICALLY GIFTED, ALLOWING HIM OR HER TO ENROLL EVEN THOUGH HE OR SHE HAS NOT REACHED THE AGE REQUIRED BY SECTION 6103 OF THIS TITLE, BUT NOT LOWER THAN AGE FOUR (4) BY THE END OF THE MONTH THAT CLASSES ACTUALLY COMMENCE OF THE YEAR THE CHILD IS ENROLLED.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education held a public hearing on Monday, July 20, 1998 at 9:00 a.m. at the Legislative Public Hearing Room. Public Notice of the hearing was announced in the July 13 issue of the Pacific Daily News.

II. Testimony

Ms. Ginny Caceres, GATE Tester. Ms. Caceras testified in favor of the Bill noting the inequality caused by fluctuating school starting dates. She pointed out that moving up the school starting date in 1998 and pushing it back in 1999 would create a situation where certain children will be too young for the GATE Preschool Program in 1998 and too old for it in 1999. Ms. Caceres stated that the passage of the Bill would remedy this situation.

Dr. Joseph L. De Torres, Chief of Staff, Sen. Won Pat Borja's Office. Dr. De Torres testified in favor of the Bill.

Mr. Roland L.G. Taimanglo, Director of Education. Mr. Taimanglo testified in favor of the Bill. He noted that passage of the Bill would allow academically gifted students to be enrolled in the GATE Preschool Program.

Mr. Dave Fegurgur, Parent. Mr. Fegurger testified in favor of the Bill. He explained that because of the starting date for school being moved up to August 4th of this year, his child would be ineligible for the GATE Preschool Program.

III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee on Education finds in some cases, public preschool testing has been negatively affected by the recent decision of the Interim Governing Board to move up the school calendar by approximately three weeks, causing an unintended form of discrimination on children whose 4th birthdays do not meet current testing age requirements. The Committee further finds there needs to be flexibility beyond that which currently exists in the eligibility requirements for enrollment of children into the Gifted and Talented Education Preschool Program. Variations from year to year in the starting date for the commencement of classes makes it difficult for parents to plan for enrollment of their children. Further, without such flexibility, changes in the starting date of classes may result in the exclusion from the program of certain students who would otherwise be eligible.

It is the recommendation of the Committee on Education that Bill No. 671 (COR) As Substituted by the Committee on Education be reported out with the recommendation **TO DO PASS**



Dear Senator Kasperbauer:

Thank you for giving our department the opportunity to provide testimony on Bill 671 (COR).

We are grateful to Senator Judith Won Pat-Borja, Senator Vicente Pangelinan, and Senator William Flores for introducing this bill. This bill was developed with direct input and involvement of the Department of Education, especially the Division of Special Education, Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) program personnel.

The problem is adequately enumerated in Section 1 of Bill 671 (COR) and thus does not need to be restated. This problem was created by the language of P.L. 24-26, which specified that to attend a pre-school program for academically gifted students, an eligible student must be four years of age by the opening of the school year.

The simple amending language that is being proposed will meet the intent of P.L. 24-26 in that only students who are fours years old will be eligible for this pre-school program for academically gifted students. By specifying that the eligible student must be four years old by the end of the month that classes actually commence on the year that the child is enrolled, we will have taken care of any future problems in relation to who is a four year old if the opening of the school year changes from the beginning of the month to the end of the month the following school year.

Testimony in Support of Bill 671 Relative to Changing the Cut-off Date for GATE Preschool Testing

July 15, 1998

From: Ginny Caceres, GATE Tester

I am testifying in writing in support of Bill 671 because I will be off-island from July 19-29, 1998. I believe Bill 671 remedies the inequality of having the cut-off date for GATE Preschool Testing tied to the first day of school, which fluctuates from year

to year.

This school year, SY 1998-99, calls to attention the problem with the cut-off date being the first day of school. Let us say for argument's sake, that school in 1999 will begin August 24, and this year it begins August 4. The children who were born between August 5 and August 24, 1994 will never meet the age requirements to be tested for GATE Preschool. GATE often receives phone calls from parents of children who are too young for testing. To them we say, "Sorry. You'll have to wait a year to have your child tested for GATE. Please call us back next year." This year, however, is another story. It is very difficult to tell these parents that their children will never be the right age for GATE Preschool testing, because this year they are too young (not yet four by August 4) and next year they'll be too old (they'll be five by August 24). I believe this bill remedies this inequality.

As the GATE Tester, I believe our program can handle this influx of children to be tested. I personally could test these children the first few days of school, and if they qualify, they could be accepted into the GATE Preschool immediately. (If there are no slots available, they would be placed on our waiting list.) GATE believes the number of children in this group would be 10-15, and perhaps only 4-6 might qualify after testing. We have kept a list of children born between August 4-31, 1994 in the hopes that the Legislature would remedy this particular

inequality.

GATE is in full support of making an unfair situation fair for all those affected.

Senators, please ratify this measure.
