AN ACT TO REPROGRAM AND APPROPRIATE THE RESIDUAL AND EXCESS HIGHWAY FUNDS FOR USE TO PLAN, DESIGN, EXPAND AND RECONSTRUCT ROUTE 15, MORE POPULARLY KNOWN AS, "BACK ROAD TO ANDERSEN."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings, Declarations and Intent. I Liheslaturan
Guahan finds that, in its present condition, Route 15, better known as, "Back Road
to Andersen," is one of the most dangerous roads on Island.

Further, *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that, within the past eight (8) years, as many as fourteen (14) individuals perished in motor vehicle accidents on this road. In the first five (5) months of 1998, approximately four percent (4%) of total accidents and twenty-one percent (21%) of total fatalities have occurred on Route 15.

Just this year a father transporting his daughter to a Catholic Church Doctrine ("CCD") class at Yigo on Route 15 were involved in a motor vehicle accident that took both their lives. Also, a few years ago a husband, his wife and their two (2) children were involved in a motor vehicle accident that took the lives of the entire family of four (4). Every year since 1990 someone gets killed in a vehicle accident and so far this year, three (3) people have lost their lives on this road. Very recently, a young motorist ran into a cement truck head-on and perished on this road.

I Liheslaturan Guahan declares that, without question, the dangerous situation existing on Route 15, because of its present unsafe and inadequate condition, warrants urgent attention and immediate actions. Additionally, I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that, ever since Route 15 was first constructed by the military in the early 1960's, well over three (3) decades ago, the road has never been upgraded nor reconstructed to accommodate the high traffic use of this highway today.

I Liheslaturan Guahan further declares that it is the government of Guam's responsibility to do everything possible to eliminate this unsafe condition existing on Route 15 and reconstruct this road to a level where it can adequately and safely

1 accommodate the type of traffic using this highway today and into the future.

This area supports most of the coral rock quarry used in the construction of most, if not all, of the major development today. Also, certain industrial activities are located in this area. As a result, large construction and industrial vehicles use this highway on a daily basis.

Also, this area is accommodating certain tourism-related recreational facilities, such as the Mangilao Golf Course, requiring frequent use by tour buses, as well as increased traffic-related to the tourism industry. We must not wait until a serious accident occurs involving tour buses.

Additionally, because of the heavy congestion occurring during peak commuting hours daily on Marine Drive, Route 15 has become the only alternate highway access available to commute between the central and southern parts of the Island, Dededo and Yigo.

I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that, while one (1) golf course development project was started several years ago but stopped when the Japanese economy suffered its first contraction, recent indications surfaced that the golf course project might be revitalized very soon, and that other major development plans slated for this area of the Island are being dusted off and we will start seeing their re-commencement to materialize very soon.

The areas serviced by Route 15 are experiencing the most rapid development in the past ten (10) years. Many hundreds of families have moved into this part of the Island and built their homes. As a result, many hundreds of school children live in this area, requiring the need for many school buses to travel this very dangerous road to pick-up and drop-off school children. It is urgent that this road be reconstructed before a catastrophic accident occurs involving school buses full of school children.

Section 2. Authorization and Appropriation of Reprogrammed Funds.

I Liheslaturan Guahan hereby authorizes I Maga'lahi to reprogram all excess and unused highway funds, including, but not limited to, those funded locally, or jointly with Federal Highway Administration funding, to fund, in phases if necessary, the design, plans, expansion and reconstruction of Route 15, from the intersection of Route 10 in Mangilao to the back gate of Andersen Air Force Base.

I Maga'lahi shall report to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guahan the exact amount of funds reprogrammed and what accounts were the funds reprogrammed from seven (7) days prior to committing such funds to accomplish the intent of this Act. I Liheslaturan Guahan hereby authorizes and appropriates up to Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000) from the reprogrammed excess and unused highway funds, including, but not limited to, those funded locally, or jointly with Federal Highway Administration, funding for the design, plans, expansion and reconstruction of Route 15 from the intersection of Route 10 in Mangilao, Guam to the back gate of Andersen Air Force Base as authorized in this Act.

Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act, or its application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions, sections or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable. In the event that any appropriation of this Act is found contrary to Federal law, all portions not so found shall remain valid.
