

Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find Bill No. 686 (COR), "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FROM THE TOURIST ATTRACTION FUND TO THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR UNIFORMED SERVICES ("NAUS") FOR THE COST TO REPAIR THE VANDALIZED NAUS MEMORIAL AT ASAN POINT, DEDICATED TO THE FIGHTING MEN OF THE UNIFORMED SERVICES WHO GAVE THE SUPREME SACRIFICE FOR THE DEFENSE OF THEIR COUNTRY AND THE RECAPTURE OF GUAM DURING WWII", which I have signed into law today as **Public Law No. 24-265**.

It is well known from the news reports that an act of vandalism took place at the National Association for Uniformed Services memorial located at Asan Point. It is unfortunate that memorials to deceased fighting men of the uniformed services can be treated in such a fashion. It is beyond the resources of private groups to restore this memorial completely, since the damage was extensive in the removal of metal plaques. The \$45,000 appropriated in this legislation will ensure that the memorial is restored to an appropriate condition to remember those who lost their lives on the beaches of Asan and other locations during the recapture of Guam during World War II.



**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FROM THE TOURIST  
ATTRACTION FUND TO THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION  
FOR UNIFORMED SERVICES ("NAUS") FOR THE COST  
TO REPAIR THE VANDALIZED NAUS MEMORIAL AT  
ASAN POINT, DEDICATED TO THE FIGHTING MEN OF  
THE UNIFORMED SERVICES WHO GAVE THE SUPREME  
SACRIFICE FOR THE DEFENSE OF THEIR COUNTRY  
AND THE RECAPTURE OF GUAM DURING WWII.**

1           **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2           **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds  
3 that in 1994, the National Association for Uniformed Services (“NAUS”)  
4 dedicated the *Golden Salute Memorial to War Veterans* at Asan Point, Guam,  
5 commemorating fifty (50) years since the recapture of Guam by members of the  
6 Uniformed Services from Japanese occupation. Located at Asan Beach on the  
7 west-central shores of Guam where U. S. forces actually landed on July 21, 1944,  
8 the memorial is a ten feet (10’) by fifteen feet (15’) cube of polished gray marble  
9 that rises six feet (6’) above the broad, four (4) - tiered octagonal base, finished in  
10 washed pebble effect. An engraved wreath in raised relief and bearing the  
11 legend “50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary” adorns the front panel, and the side and rear panels  
12 bear similarly engraved insignias of the U. S. military units that participated in  
13 the liberation of Guam. Above the wreath and emblems, a commemorative  
14 message in two (2) languages, English and Chamorro, wraps the memorial in a  
15 ribbon of ten inch (10”) engraved letters saying, “*A Grateful Chamorro Remembers:*  
16 *Libra Para I Tano Chamorro: Honor to Heroic and Gallant Effort of U. S. Armed Forces:*  
17 *Onra I Mane’luta.*”

18           This monument is a memorial to peace. It is dedicated to all those who  
19 fought in the Great War and made the ultimate sacrifice so that the generations  
20 to come may find peace. This memorial is a living testament to the sacrifices  
21 made by both sides of the war and the Island people who were caught in  
22 between as patriotic victims in a global conflict.

23           *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* additionally finds that NAUS, Guam Chapter, on  
24 their own without any government financial assistance, undertook this memorial  
25 project at a cost of over Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), which

1 was solicited and collected from the respective war veterans and members of the  
2 community at large, a truly monumental undertaking and generous contribution  
3 to this community, in general, and the government in particular because such  
4 worthwhile project should have been the sole and exclusive responsibility of this  
5 government.

6 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that, in addition to the damages inflicted  
7 by Super Typhoon Paka, a natural disaster, on the *Golden Salute Memorial to War*  
8 *Veterans*, “a phenomenon more unnatural than any we can think ...”, echoed by  
9 NAUS’s members, struck on June 18, 1998 when the memorial was desecrated by  
10 vandals damaging one (1) of the marble panels and ripping off the embedded  
11 bronze plaques from the walkway leading up to the monument itself.

12 Because of the deep feelings associated with this monument, its historic  
13 value to the community and the message it conveys to the general public in  
14 honoring the war veterans, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* intends to appropriate sufficient  
15 funds to repair the damages inflicted on this very important monument and  
16 appeals to the Island’s law enforcement officers to use whatever means possible  
17 to apprehend these vandals and inflict upon them the fullest measure of the law  
18 as punishment and send a message to the community that this type of senseless,  
19 wanton and meaningless destruction of property will not be tolerated.

20 **Section 2. Appropriation.** Forty Five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00) is  
21 appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the National Association for  
22 Uniformed Services (“NAUS”) for the cost of the repair of the vandalized *Golden*  
23 *Salute Memorial to War Veterans* at Asan Point dedicated to the fighting men of the  
24 Uniformed Services who gave the supreme sacrifice for the defense of their

- 1 country and the recapture of Guam. The appropriation made in this Section shall
- 2 be continuing until the total amount appropriated is expended completely.

**BACKGROUND:**

**A.P. Sgambelluri, President, (NAUS)**, asked for a favorable passage of Bill No. 686 (COR). He informed the committee that NAUS, Guam Chapter, has contributed over half a million dollars in projects for the island community, and the forty-five thousand dollars requested pales in comparison to the overall contribution NAUS has made, less than 10 %.

**Ron McNinch, (UOG)**, supports Bill No. 686 (COR) citing that the "efforts to restore the NAUS memorial at Asan Point is a worthy and just cause".

**John Blaz, VA**, opposes the fund source but not the intent of the bill; he cites that over 183 veterans have not received their veteran's bonus to date. When asked by the Chairman why this information hasn't been transmitted to his Committee, Mr. Blaz responded by saying that he had given this information to the Guam Legislature.

### FINDINGS:

The Committee finds that:

- The Guam NAUS Chapter has contributed over one half million dollars in community projects to the island community;
- The vandalized NAUS Memorial at Asan Point requires immediate repair and restoration to provide the fallen heroes of WWII a lasting tribute for their courage and sacrifice; to provide a visit point for the many thousands of school students who use the memorial as a field trip site; and to provide a visit site for the thousands of visitors who stop by the site during their visit to Guam;
- The repair and restoration will require an appropriation of forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000.00) to complete the project

**Comments to Bill No. 686 (COR)**

Bill No. 686 (COR) appropriates the sum of \$45,000 from the Veteran's Bonus Fund to the National Association for Uniformed Services (NAUS) for the cost of the repair of the vandalized Golden Salute Memorial to War Veterans monument at Asan Point.

According to the NAUS, the monument sustained an estimated \$30,000 in damages inflicted by Typhoon Paka. Funding assistance to cover the cost of the repair through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) was not approved. Subsequently, an additional cost estimated at \$15,000 is needed for the repair and restoration of damages to the monument caused by vandalism. Thus, the \$45,000 appropriation will be adequate to cover the intent of Bill No. 686.

It should be noted that the current fund balance of the Veteran's Bonus Fund according to the Division of Accounts, Department of Administration as of 7/17/98 is \$48,385. However, there are a total of \$261,666 in continuing appropriations made against the Fund which results in an overappropriation or fund deficit of \$213,281. As such, there are no current revenues available under the Veteran's Bonus Fund for appropriation.
