Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 713 (LS), "AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §§9113 AND 4104, AND AMEND §9109, OF TITLE 3 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS", which I have signed into law today as **Public Law No. 24-273**.

This legislation appropriates a total of \$32,200 from the General Fund to the Guam Election Commission for upgrading existing balloting machines and paying for the extra time that precinct workers will be working at the polls. The legislation also provides that the polls open 1 hour earlier than previously, at 7:00 a.m. instead of 8:00 a.m. The polls will close at the same time as before, 8:00 p.m.

This time change will be beneficial since Election Day for the general election takes place on a weekday, which is a working day for most people. Having the polls open at 7:00 a.m. will allow better access because many people will be able to cast their vote on the way to work, rather than waiting until lunchtime or after work, when the polls are traditionally quite crowded. The legislation increases voter access to the polls.

The second issue that the legislation addresses is the situation where a school is used as a polling place and the entrance gate to the school is defined as the closest point where electioneering can take place. In some

places, this means that the closest point of electioneering is a great deal farther than the 100 feet usually required. In other cases, this means that those who may want to participate in the electoral process by electioneering on election day would have to stand in the road or other unsafe areas, due to the particular configuration of a polling place. This legislation will allow the Guam Election Commission to deal with certain polling places on a case-by-case basis.



**AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §§9113 AND

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

1 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guahan*
2 finds that during election day supporters of the candidates oftentimes gather
3 around polling places. The Guam Election Commission ("Commission") is
4 tasked with the responsibility of designating convenient and safe sites for
5 voters on Island to participate in the election process, however, the limited
6 availability of sites oftentimes creates difficulties in uniformly exercising the
7 existing one hundred foot (100') electioneering setback requirement.

8 It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to grant the Commission greater
9 flexibility in enforcing the election law, given the interests of the voters in
10 expeditiously casting their vote and the interests of the candidates' campaign
11 teams in exercising their freedom of speech and association rights. It is the
12 further intention of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* that the exception granted by the
13 Commission be limited to each election, and that each exception be
14 reevaluated for each election by the Commission.

15 *I Liheslaturan Guahan* further finds that although the Commission has six
16 (6) balloting machines, the equipment requires upgrading to make the
17 processing and transfer of balloting data faster and with more flexible
18 reporting options to the public. The existing machines currently use dot
19 matrix printers and require manually transferring magnetic tapes to an
20 accumulator for final ballot tallying. The manufacturer of the Commission's
21 balloting machine presently offers an upgrade package which will continue to
22 use the existing equipment, but permit faster data transfer, on-line computer
23 reporting and integration with laser printers.

1 **Section 2.** Section 9113 of Chapter 9 of Title 3 of the Guam Code
2 Annotated is hereby *repealed and reenacted* to read as follows:

3 **“Section 9113. Electioneering at Polling Place Prohibited.**

4 No person shall do any electioneering on election day within one
5 hundred feet (100’) of any entrance and/or exit of any polling place. In
6 the case of a school, the entrance is defined as the entrance gate, if the
7 school is fenced. The Commission may, on a case-by-case basis, limited
8 to the election then forthcoming, create an exception to this Section
9 through resolution in order to safely conduct the election, so long as
10 notices identifying the newly set perimeter are also clearly posted at the
11 polling place(s) affected.”

12 **Section 3.** Section 4104 of Chapter 4 of Title 3 of the Guam Code
13 Annotated is hereby *repealed and reenacted* to read as follows:

14 **“Section 4104. Members and Compensation of Precinct**
15 **Boards.** To each and every polling place designated, the Commission
16 shall appoint a Precinct Board consisting of an inspector, two (2) judges
17 and two (2) clerks.

18 The concurrence of two (2) members shall be necessary for any
19 ruling of the Precinct Board. The two (2) clerks shall have no vote.

20 All members of the Precinct Boards shall be paid One Hundred
21 Seventy Dollars (\$170.00) each for services rendered for each election.”

22 **Section 4.** Section 9109 of Chapter 9 of Title 3 of the Guam Code
23 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

24 **“Section 9109. Time for Opening and Closing Polls.** The
25 polls shall be opened at 7 o’clock a.m., of the day of an election and shall

1 be kept open until 8 o'clock p.m. of the same day, after which time the
2 polls shall be closed except as provided in §9150."


3 **Section 5. Appropriation for Extended Election Hours.** The sum of
4 Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) is hereby authorized and appropriated
5 from the General Fund to the Guam Election Commission for the purposes of
6 funding §§3 and 4 of this Act for the 1998 General Election.

7 **Section 6. Appropriation for Upgrading Machines.** The sum of
8 Twenty-five Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$25,200.00) is hereby
9 authorized and appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Election
10 Commission for the purpose of upgrading their existing balloting machines.



19 ruling of the Precinct Board. The two (2) clerks shall have no vote.

20 All members of the Precinct Boards shall be paid One Hundred
21 Seventy Dollars (\$170.00) each for services rendered for each election.”

22 **Section 4.** Section 9109 of Chapter 9 of Title 3 of the Guam Code
23 Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

24 **“Section 9109. Time for Opening and Closing Polls.** The
25 polls shall be opened at 7 o’clock a.m., of the day of an election and shall

1 be kept open until 8 o'clock p.m. of the same day, after which time the
2 polls shall be closed except as provided in §9150."

3 **Section 5. Appropriation for Extended Election Hours.** The sum of
4 Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) is hereby authorized and appropriated
5 from the General Fund to the Guam Election Commission for the purposes of
6 funding §§3 and 4 of this Act for the 1998 General Election.

7 **Section 6. Appropriation for Upgrading Machines.** The sum of

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform and Federal Affairs held a public hearing on Friday, September 11, 1998 at 10:00 a.m. at I Liheslaturan Guahan. Public notice of the hearing was announced in the August 21st, September 6th, 7th and 11th, 1998 issues of the Pacific Daily News.

Senator Larry Kasperbauer, Member

Appearing before the Committee:

Mr. Carlos Pangelinan, Speaker, Guam Youth Congress

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Mr. Carlos Pangelinan, Speaker of the Guam Youth Congress, testified before the Committee **in favor** of Bill No. 713. Mr. Pangelinan stated that an extra hour of voting before people go to work would increase voter turnout.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform and Federal Affairs finds that opening the polling sites an extra hour before 8:00 a.m. on election days would increase voter turnout. Since most people who work on election days start work at 8:00 a.m., they will, if Bill No. 713 becomes law, be able to vote prior to going to work.

The Committee further finds that Bill No. 713 appropriates six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) to the Guam Election Commission to cover the additional expenses related to opening the polling places an hour earlier.

Accordingly, the Committee on Rules, Government Reform and Federal Affairs, to which Bill No. 713 was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Kuattro Na Liheslaturan Guahan **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 713** as substituted, "An act to amend §9109 of Chapter 9 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated relative to changing the starting time for voting on election day from 8 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock a.m."
