AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 34(C) OF CHAPTER III OF PUBLIC LAW 24-59, RELATIVE TO THE GUAM HUMANITIES COUNCIL.

PUBLIC NOTICE:

Pursuant to the requirements of Public Law 24-139, notice of the public hearing on Bill No. 564(LS) was published in the Pacific Daily News on 16, June 1998.

PUBLIC HEARING:

The Committee on Finance and Taxation conducted a public hearing on 17, June 1998 at 1:30 PM in the Legislative Public Hearing Room to hear testimonies on Bill No. 564(LS).

PROVIDING WRITTEN TESTIMONY:

Mr. George J. Boughton, Chairman, Guam Humanities Council. Mr. Mark E. Skinner, Guam Humanities Council.

BACKGROUND:

Written & Oral Testimony:

Mr. George J. Boughton, Chairman, Guam Humanities Council favors Bill No. 564 (LS). Shortage of federal funds for the remainder of fiscal yea1998 requires the reauthorization of \$50,000.000 for programming and operational expenses. This amount should carry their fund requirements into November.

FINDINGS:

The Committee finds that:

- ◆ Lack of federal funds to carry the programming and operational expenses of CAHA into the last quarter of FY '98, requires that \$50,000.00 must be reauthorized from P.L. 24-59 for that purpose.
- ◆ Providing this reauthorization will also preserve federal funding requirements for FY '99.
- ◆ Reauthorizing the appropriation of \$50,000.00 will help supplement operating costs such as rent, general office supplies, and materials.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Committee, having conducted a sufficient hearing, does hereby recommend to the Liheslåturan Guåhan to do pass Bill No. 564 (LS) AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 34(C) OF CHAPTER III OF PUBLIC LAW 24-59, RELATIVE TO THE GUAM HUMANITIES COUNCIL.

RE: Testimony in support of Bill #564, "An Act to Repeal and Reenact Section 34(C) of Chapter III of Public Law 24-59, Relative to the Guam Humanities Council

Dear Vice Speaker Blaz:

My name is George J. Boughton, Chairman of the Guam Humanities Council and Professor Emeritus of History at the University of Guam. I am here today to testify in favor of Bill #564.

The Guam Humanities Council, founded in 1990, is an independent nonprofit corporation [501(C)3] of citizens working in cooperation with the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH). It is the Council's mission is to foster critical thinking and an understanding and appreciation of the humanities on Guam, especially as they relate to Guam's rich cultural heritage, its multi-ethnic composition, and the issues — both local and global — confronting the people of Guam today.

Since its inception, the Council has awarded approximately \$1 million in funds for humanities-related research grants, public forums, exhibits, speaker's bureaus and related scholarship activities to the people of Guam. Council projects require 50% in-kind support for its activities. As a result, nearly \$1.6 million in in-kind services and cash have complemented Council projects.

It is important that the Council maintain this valuable source of funding to meet federal requirements as well as be a recipient of Federal FY99 funding. There are currently not enough remaining federal funds to continue operations through FY98. The Legislature's reallocation of the \$50,000 already awarded to the Council, will allow us to continue operations through November of this year, when FY99 funding becomes available. Moreover it would send a message to the National Endowment for the Humanities that the Guam community values and supports the Council's activities and wants to see them continue.

In requesting temporary financial assistance from the Guam Legislature, it is worth noting some of the important public programs which the Council has

provided to the residents of Guam over the last several years. Among them:

Guam Museum Audio Cassette Tour - This project, which will be completed at the end of this year, will result in a 45-minute audio/cassette tour of the Guam Museum in four different languages; Chamorro, English, Japanese and Korean. It will describe, through narration, music and sound effects, the displays at the museum. It will also supplement the historical and cultural information already visually presented. The cassette tour project will offer another forum toward increasing awareness and easier accessibility of the Chamorro culture and history for resident and the visitor industry.

English Chamorro Dictionary - The project, currently under development, consists of preparing the pre-production work for a new Chamorro-English Dictionary. Council funding is being used to edit, layout and pay for other technical assistance in order to bring the product to the publication stage. The completed dictionary will be the standard reference for the Chamorro language. Language is the primary humanities field.

Chamorro: A Complete Course of Study - The project consists of revising a Chamorro study language text that was field-tested during the 1995-96 school year. The text uses a second language teaching approach in teaching Chamorro. Language is the primary humanities field.

Can't We All Just Get Along? - The project funded ten conflict resolution workshops at ten different high schools. The workshops provided a "train the trainer" methodology for students interested in learning about alternative dispute resolution methods - an important tool where more and more students are resorting to violence, litigation and feuding to solve their problems.

The Pattera Story & Legacy - The project documented the role of the Navy-trained Chamorro nurse-midwives, known as "Pattera." Oral history interviews with these women complements archival research. A public forum was held as well as a booklet published of the research. A standing exhibit complements the project. The project increased public understanding of this unique and nearly forgotten group of women. The exhibit is a part of the Council's resource center and can be checked out by teachers and nonprofit organizations. History is the primary humanities field.

Harvesting and Conserving Reef Resources - The project consisted of acquiring social context information from the island's man'amko on traditional harvesting and conservation of reef resources, particularly shellfish. The information was compared with archaeological and ethnographic data in order to gain an understanding of how Chamorros used and conserved reef resources in

the past. A portable educational display was created and is available with a speaker. Archaeology, history and anthropology were the humanities disciplines used in this project.

Sacred Vessels: Navigating Tradition and Identity in Micronesia - The project consisted of funding the production of a 30-minute video documentary that explored the relationship between the survival of culture and historical change in contemporary Guam and Micronesia. It charted the activities of three Micronesian men; two brothers from the island of Polowat and one Chamorro from Guam who actively participate in traditional canoe carving and navigation. The project contributed to the existing popular and scholarly interest in the struggles between indigenous tradition and external forces of change in history. It also addressed the construction of identity and the experimental modes of representing culture and history. History and anthropology are the primary humanities disciplines.

Isla: A Journal of Micronesian Studies - The project funded the publishing of three issues of Isla: A Journal of Micronesian Studies. The journal is the only scholarly periodical devoted to publishing original research of the Guam and wider Micronesian area, book reviews and essays which critically examine new humanities scholarship in the region. The Journal incorporates all aspects of the humanities, including archaeology, commerce and economics, education, geography, health, history, linguistics, political science, psychology and sociology.

Reports from the Field Radio Series - This project funded in ten, 10-minute radio programs consisting of interviews with archaeologists and other specialists about the work they are doing and accomplishments they have made in Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands. The objective of the project was to increase public awareness of culture, provide accurate information regarding current archaeological findings and help listeners interpret the findings in ways meaningful to them. The series was broadcast on Guam's public radio station. The program series is available to the public from the Council's Resource Center. Archaeology and history are the primary humanities disciplines.

In conclusion, there are many more research projects and public events which the Council has underwritten including public forums, exhibits, and festivals. One noteworthy project, of particular importance to early Chamorro historians, is the publishing of Father San Vitores' Biography. This 400-year-old Spanish document stands as the pre-eminent font of knowledge of prehistoric Chamorro society. The Council had the document edited, in its full version, and preparations are underway for its publication.

These programs have enabled the people of Guam to better understand their

cultural, social, historic and political environment. They differ widely in audience, content and form, but they all have one thing in common: they encourage us to think critically about our lives.

The humanities encompass the range of human experience -- who we are and what our lives mean. The humanities help us to comprehend the meaning of events and ideas; they reveal insights that lead us to an understanding of human behavior; they help us consider the values that underlie our culture and the cultures of others. In a world that struggles to find a moral center amid the forces of change and diversity, the humanities furnish the standards by which society can make judgments and build a future.

I would be happy to discuss further the Council's activities with the Committee on Finance and Taxation as well as with members of the Legislature at large.

Comments to Bill No. <u>564(LS)</u>

The intent of Bill 564 (LS) is to repeal and reenact Section 34(c) of Chapter III of Public Law 24-59 which appropriates the sum of \$50,000 to the Guam Humanities Council for the Marianas Exhibit at the Smithsonian Institute. The subsection if reenacted as proposed, will re-authorize the appropriation of \$50,000 to the Guam Humanities Council for a different purpose rather than for the Marianas Exhibit. As such, the funds can be utilized and expended for programming and operational expenses of the Guam Humanities Council during Fiscal Year 1998.

According to the Guam Humanities Council, the appropriation of \$50,000 will be used to supplement operating costs such as office rent, general office supplies and materials as the federal funding it receives are not adequate to continue its operations through Fiscal Year 1998.
