Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 699 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD §120.15 TO TITLE 8 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT IN THE SUPERIOR COURT ON ALL DEFENDANTS UPON A JUDGEMENT OF GUILTY", which I have signed into law today as **Public Law No. 24-285**.

This legislation imposes a special assessment of \$100 on all persons convicted of a misdemeanor, and a special assessment of \$250 on all persons convicted of a felony. Seventy-five Percent of the money obtained from this special assessment is to be used by the Guam Police Department for training and for purchase or repair of equipment. The remaining Twenty-five Percent of the money obtained is to be used by the Superior Court of Guam for Drug Court or Drug-related projects.

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the

Guam Police Department ("GPD") is continuously in need of new equipment and additional training for its employees in order to better carry out its mission to serve and protect. A lack of sufficient funds often prevents GPD from purchasing or repairing equipment and providing necessary training. *I Liheslaturan Guahan* further finds that it is appropriate to require persons convicted of crimes to help pay for GPD's purchase or repair of equipment, training of its employees and capital improvement projects.

8 Section 2. Section 120.15 is hereby *added* to Chapter 120 of Title 8 of the
9 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 120.15. Judgment of Guilty: Special Assessment.

(a) After a plea, finding or verdict of guilty, the Court shall impose
against the defendant a special assessment of One Hundred Dollars
(\$100.00) for any misdemeanor and Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00)
for any felony offense.

(b) No person may have his sentence suspended, be placed on
probation, enter a deferred plea, be released on parole, be placed in a work
release or educational program at the Department of Corrections, or be
permitted to operate a motor vehicle if convicted of Driving under the
Influence of Drug(s) or Alcohol, until the special assessment is paid. The
Court may give the offender reasonable time to make the payment.

(c) All assessments shall be paid at the Superior Court of Guam.The Superior Court shall transfer seventy-five percent (75%) of the collected funds from this Act to a GPD Special Assessments Fund.

(d) All assessment funds shall be deposited into the GPD Special Assessments Fund. The account shall require the signatures of both the Chief of Police, and the Deputy Chief of Police, or the Acting Chief or Acting Deputy, but in no case shall checks be written with less than two (2) signatures.

(e) All Funds in the GPD Special Assessments Fund are appropriated to the Guam Police Department and shall be expended for the purchase or repair of equipment, training of GPD personnel and capital improvement projects.

8 (f) GPD shall submit an audit of the assessment funds at the end 9 of each fiscal year with the Public Auditor and *I Liheslaturan Guahan*. All 10 checks, invoices and contracts related to the assessment funds shall, at all 11 times, be available for public inspection and photocopying. Assessment 12 funds may *not* be borrowed against or used to secure any transaction.

(g) All other funds collected by the Court under this Act shall be
used by the Superior Court of Guam for the purpose of the establishment
of programs such as the Drug Court or Drug-related projects. After the end
of three (3) years of enactment, the Superior Court of Guam shall submit to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* for re-appropriation of the funds."

Section 3. Creation of Guam Police Department Special Assessments 18 19 There is hereby created, separate and apart from all other funds of the Fund. government of Guam, the "Guam Police Department Special Assessments Fund" 20 21 ("GPD Special Assessments Fund"). This Fund shall not be commingled with the 22 General Fund and shall be kept in a separate bank account. The GPD Special 23 Assessments Fund shall be used exclusively for the training of GPD personnel, or the purchase or repair of equipment for use by GPD. The funds in the GPD 24 Special Assessments Fund shall not be subject to I Maga'lahen Guahan's transfer 25

Section 4. The Superior Court Administrator shall transfer, on the first
day of each month, all funds contained in the GPD Special Assessments Fund to
the Treasurer of Guam.
