1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. Such participation is considered vital and important in fostering the growth, development and advancement of Guam and the island's residents in a regional, national and global environment. It is especially important for the inspiration and motivation of the youths of Guam to develop their full potential and excel in competition and leadership roles. The Department of Parks and Recreation is tasked to facilitate administratively government of Guam subsidized offisland sports participation.

## 12 Section 2. Appropriation for the Guam National Baseball Team.

Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation's Off-Island Sports Fund to be allocated to the Guam National Baseball Team's participation in the Men's World Series in Phoenix, Arizona in October, 1998 to supplement the cost of their off-island travel expenses.

Dear Vice Speaker Blaz:

Firstly, on behalf of the Guam National Baseball Team, I would like to thank you for your interest and quick turn-around on pending legislation that would assist in sending our team to Arizona for an important training and game schedule in preparation for our bid to become the first team from Guam to ever qualify for an Olympic Games.

We cannot stress to you and your colleagues enough—and the community at-large—how vital these games are in our quest to secure the eighth and final seed in the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney. Our competitors in American Samoa, who are also vying for this final berth, have already spent two months playing top competition throughout California. We need to pull even with them in terms of international baseball experience.

We have one more request that we hope you do not find too troublesome in the scheme of your busy agenda. Since our team would depart Guam no later than October 20 of this year, we desperately need Bill 703 to be labeled a high priority by you and your colleagues. We do not mean to alter your schedule or be too forward; we just need to know if this trip will become a reality in as short a time as possible.

We must let organizers of this important tournament know that we are still slated to play against the nation's best amateur teams, and we also must choose and prepare our top 21 ballplayers to make this trip. Employers have to be notified shortly as well to give these players the necessary leave during the month of October.

Again, we thank you for all your work on behalf of Guam's national baseball team, and we look forward to working with you in the near future.

Dear Vice-Speaker Blaz:

The Guam National Baseball desperately needs your assistance. We are less than 10 months away from the most important games that a team from this island has ever played. Due to unique circumstances, we are the favorites to be the eighth and final seed in the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. Never has a team from Guam represented the island in Olympic competition. It will truly put the island on the map.

However, to better prepare the team for this level of competition, we need two things. The first is a pitching coach, and the Guam National Olympic Committee, who know full well the importance of our team's ambitions and final goal, are finalizing negotiations to bring a coach from the Milwaukee Brewers to work with our pitching staff. The second item we need is international competition before the first Olympic qualifier here on Guam next spring.

We have scheduled a trip for our team to compete in the Men's World Series in Phoenix, Arizona, this October. However, we have been unable to garner enough private sector support to make this and other trips possible. We didn't want to make the request to the government, but we feel we must—and we should. Because we have a responsibility to do everything we can to get this team in the Olympics. It would provide countless opportunities for our island's future athletes. The exposure alone will be worth millions in public relations dollars alone.

On a positive note, we have already secured the assistance of the Atlanta Braves, who are sending souvenirs for our team to auction off in the near future. Sports Illustrated, CNN Sports and the Sporting News know about our program and are interested in a story about the team as we progress. Now we need local support. We are in negotiations with two local companies to help fund equipment costs, and we asking the Governor and the Guam National Olympic Committee to find us a home field. (Currently, we play in the parking lot at Paseo while Little Leaguers have priority on the island's premiere field.)



Our team has watched recent media reports of the Legislature finding funds for dance troupes and Little League teams to travel across the country. We applaud their efforts and your dedication in assisting them reach their goals. By no means do we wish to prioritize the spending of the government, but we have something special going on here that only a handful of people on Guam fully understand: a team from Guam will be one of eight in the Olympic Games, competing against Cuba, the U.S.A., Japan and others. It's truly a once in a lifetime shot.

We need \$50,000 to travel to Arizona to play some of the best amateur ballplayers in the world in October. We will try to find funds for further competition from the private sector. However, we need someone to act now, and we hope you will be the one. Thank you for your time and your assistance. We are looking forward to hearing from you soon.

#### Comments to Bill No. 703

The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated to the Department of Parks and Recreation's Off Island Sports Fund to supplement off-island travel expenses of the Guam National Baseball Team's participation in the Men's World Series in Phoenix, Arizona on October 1998. Information had been requested and was unavailable from the Department of Parks and Recreation to ascertain whether the appropriation will be sufficient to cover the costs of the travel.

However, it should be noted that adequate funding for the proposed appropriation may not be available due to the projected General Fund shortfall for FY98 which is explained as follows:

Fiscal Year 1998 general fund adopted revenues available for appropriations, as adopted in Public Law 24-59, is \$353,292,790 (includes \$7,600,000 Autonomous Fund, \$7,000,000 Use Tax, and \$3,200,000 Custom & Immigration Reimbursement). The current appropriation level against the General Fund up to P.L. 24-205 and continuing appropriations for debt service total \$390,353,559. This results in a fiscal year budgetury shortfall of (\$37,060,769). Additionally, the prospects of collecting the \$7,600,000 Autonomous Agency Fund and the \$7,000,000 Use Tax is not likely to be realized. As such, the budgetary shortfall may increase by another \$14,000,000 adding to the budgetary shortfall.
