Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 785 (COR), "AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §51102(17) AND 51106, TO AMEND §51103(a)(11), AND TO ADD §§51103(a)(16), 51104(g) AND 51106A, ALL TO ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 51, PART 2, DIVISION 2 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AS AMENDED BY P.L. NO. 24-272, RELATIVE TO SOLID AND HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 24-309.

As evaluated by the Guam Environmental Protection Agency, this legislation is similar to Bill No. 655 in that it seeks to satisfy previously identified regularly deficiencies required by USEPA, Region IX, Office of the Regional Counsel, in order to ensure consistency with federal requirements. Without these needed amendments, a new solid waste landfill cannot be attained.

AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §§51102(17) AND 51106, TO AMEND §51103(a)(11), AND TO ADD §§51103(a)(16), 51104(g) AND 51106A, ALL TO ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 51, PART 2, DIVISION 2 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AS AMENDED BY P.L. NO. 24-272, RELATIVE TO SOLID AND HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guahan* has found that §§51102, 51103 and 51104, repealed and reenacted by Public Law Number 23-64, which has since been codified into Chapter 51 of Title 10 Guam Code Annotated, were repealed and re-enacted by The Ordot Dump Closure and Solid Waste Management Alternatives Act, Public Law Number 24-139 (Bill No. 495), and then subsequently were repealed and reenacted by the legislative override of vetoed Bill Number 520, now Public Law Number 24-272.
 - These sections must be amended as well as sections not affected by the other two (2) recent laws based on USEPA's review of the delegation request for a solid waste permitting program on Guam. Without this delegation a new RCRA Subtitle D Municipal Solid Waste Landfill *cannot* be built.
 - **Section 2**. Section 51102(17) of Article 1, Chapter 51, Part 2, Division 2 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, *as amended by P.L. No. 24-272*, is hereby *repealed* and *reenacted* to read as follows:
 - "(17) Financial assurance means a financial guarantee assuring that funds are available to pay for the design, construction, operation and closure of a solid waste landfill facility, for rendering post-closure at a solid waste landfill facility, for corrective action and to compensate third parties for bodily injury and property damage caused by sudden and non-sudden accidents related to the operation of a solid waste landfill facility."
 - **Section 3**. Section 51103(a)(11) of Article 1, Chapter 51, Part 2, Division 2 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, *as amended by P.L. No. 24-272*, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

If such entry or inspection is denied or *not* consented to *and* no emergency exists, the Agency is empowered to and shall obtain from the appropriate court a warrant to enter and conduct an inspection. The courts on Guam are empowered to issue such warrants upon a showing that such entry and inspection is required to verify that the purposes of the Act are being carried out. *If* samples are taken, the owner and operator of the premises for which such samples are taken shall be entitled to a receipt for such samples and, upon request, a sufficient portion to perform an analysis equivalent to that which the Agency may perform.

- (iii) In the event of an emergency which presents an immediate and substantial threat to the public health and safety or the environment, the Agency shall have the authority to issue such orders as may be appropriate to protect the public health and safety or the environment, including emergency authorization for procurement.
- (iv) Any person against whom an emergency order is issued shall be entitled to a hearing within twenty-four (24) hours. The GEPA Board shall affirm, modify or set aside the order of the Agency."

Section 7. Section 51106A is hereby *added* to Article 1, Chapter 51, Part 2, Division 2 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 51106A. Criminal Search Warrants. A search

warrant relating to offenses of environmental laws may be served at any 1 time of the day or night if the judge or magistrate issuing the warrant is 2 3 satisfied that there is probable cause to believe that grounds exist for the 4 warrant." 5 If any provision of this Law or its application Section 8. Severability. to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such 6 7 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can 8 be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the 9 provisions of this Law are severable.

The Committee on Natural Resources held a Public Hearing on Friday, November 27, 1998, at 9:00 a.m., in the Legislative Public Hearing Room.

Bill 785(COR): An Act To Amend Chapter 51 of 10 Guam Code Annotated Relative To Solid And Hazardous Waste Management

Elizabeth Cruz, Legal Counsel for the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) testified on Bill 785.

Ms. Cruz began her testimony with the changes that were made to Bill 785. In section 2, there is a change in the definition of the term financial assurance. She mentioned that it is pretty much self explanatory. She also added that this term deviates from the federal definition, and gives reference to Senator Joanne Brown incorporating the financial assurance for design operations and the construction of a landfill in the privatization section in P.L. 24-06.

Ms. Cruz continued with financial guarantees. She mentioned that this is a "magic term" for landfills. There are allowable mechanisms for a financial guarantee for a landfill. The other sections incorporate the idea of the performance bond requirement.

One of the corrections she would like to make is on page three (3), line seven (7) and line eight (8). The regulations read: solid waste disposal facility, but it should be changed to solid waste landfill facility. She mentioned that it was a typographical error.

In section 6 and section 7, these are the items Ms. Cruz has added to strengthen the Agency's enforcement action under the inspection authority. She wants to expand the agency's abilities to be allowed to inspect on any kind of property if there is violation. Senator Brown asked for an example. Ms. Cruz mentioned that if the agency receives a complaint, they would go to that area and the owner would tell them to get out. She added that legally, the agency is only allowed to inspect private property through the consent of the owner. Senator Brown questioned about the feedback on this matter. Ms. Cruz mentioned that the agency has to make a decision

regarding private property rights when it goes beyond that and if it becomes a public nuisance, then the Authority would be asked to go into that property.

Senator Brown assumes that GEPA will extend all common courtesy to the residents and go through all the proper protocol. Ms. Cruz confirmed that is correct and those are the steps GEPA will take.

Ms. Cruz continued with the items she has added into the regulations, which included: the <u>Administrative Inspection Warrants</u>. This will help the agency inspect if the private property owner is resistant or belligerent even after the courtesy request. The agency will issue this warrant giving them the authority to inspect. In addition to this, there is also a <u>Criminal Search Warrant</u>. This will help if the agency feels there is criminal activity occurring. The agency will have the authority to go through a criminal search warrant.

Senator Brown questioned whether these amendments were made because they were forgotten in the original version, or whether these amendments were additional thoughts that have come up as a result for the agency to strengthen its position.

Ms. Cruz answers that the agency has been looking at their position with regards to inspections. She also confirmed that the amendments were added on to strengthen the agency's position.

Senator Brown asked if Ms. Cruz can do a short summary of the critical sections, of what is currently existing in law that they have passed, and what the changes are going to do. Ms. Cruz agreed to provide the summary.

There was no further testimony on Bill 785.

Comments to Bill No. 784(COR)

Bill No. 784 intends to establish the Rules and Regulations for the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) Air Pollution Control Standards and Regulations. A total of Five (5) additional Full Time Employees (FTE's) for the Air Pollution Control Program will be created to effectuate the purpose and intent of the Air Pollution Control Act. These new positions are to be funded contingent on the availability of funds in the Air Pollution Control Special Fund that is also created by the Act.

The Bureau is unable to obtain any comments from GEPA on the content and impact of the proposed measure. As such, the Bureau cannot provide a revenue forecast of the proposed special fund to determine whether there will be sufficient funds generated and available to cover the costs of the requested positions and to carry out the intent of the Act.
