AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 12001(a) OF TITLE 12 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 12001(a) of Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:

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"(a) The Governor shall appoint, with the advice and consent of the Guam Legislature, two (2) members from the business community of Guam; one (1) member who is a certified public accountant; one (1) member who has managerial or engineering experience in the field of power generation; one (1) member who has training and experience in the field of telephone, water or sewer utilities management or a related area; and two (2) members who are from the community-at-large. Except for the initial term, the terms of such members shall be for six (6) No member shall be a director, deputy director, appointed unclassified employee, any other unclassified employee of the government of Guam, or a member of any other board or commission. The appointment of any person to the Commission shall become void if at any time during his/her term of office, he/she shall become a director, deputy director, appointed to any unclassified position in the government of Guam, or accept appointment to any other board or commission."

COMMITTEE REPORT POWER, FOREIGN AFFAIRS & GENERAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES

BILL NO. 122

"An Act to Amend Section 12001(a) of Title 12 Guam Code Annotated, Relative the Public Utilities Commission.

I. PUBLIC HEARING

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services (CPFA&GGS) held a public hearing on Bill No. 122 at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, April 14, 1997 in the Public Hearing Room of the Temporary Guam legislature. Notices were placed in the Pacific Daily News.

The hearing was called to order by Senator Felix P. Camacho, Chairman of CPFA&GGS. Members present included Senator Lawrence F. Kasperbauer Vice-Chairman, Senators Francisco P. Camacho, Carlotta Leon Guerrero, Tom Ada, Vicente Pangelinan, Dr. Edwardo Cruz, Mark Charfauros, Alberto Lamorena V., Judith Won Pat. Borja and William Flores, with Senator Frank Aguon as Guest.

Mr. Eloy P. Hara, a Commissioner of the Public Utilities Commission was the only witness to appear before the Committee. He presented written testimony which is attached to this report.

II. BACKGROUND.

The Commissioners of the Public Utilities Commission are placed in a position to make decisions regarding utility rates. There are occasions when requests by the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Telephone Authority, and the Guam Waterworks Authority are the direct result of a political decisions. Because Commissioners are appointed by the Governor and who are government of Guam employees, especially employees who are occupying appointed positions and who are unclassified employees, they may find themselves unduly pressured into making decisions which they otherwise would not make if it were not for the pressure of possibly having their jobs jeopardized. The amendment proposed by Bill No. 122 will relieve Commissioners of any undue pressure and allow them to make decisions based on factual information presented before the Commission.

III, TESTIMONY

Mr. Eloy Hara, a Commissioner of the Public Utilities Commission testified before the Committee and submitted written testimony which is attached to this report. Mr. Hara

testified that he did not support neither the intent nor the language of Bill No. 122 pointing out that singling out GovGuam employees and making them ineligible is discriminatory. Additionally, Mr. Hara stated that there are many GovGuam employees who have the qualifications and experiences which qualifies them to serve on the Commission.

Senator Felix Camacho then stated that perhaps changing the language to more specific by changing it from "No member shall be an employee of the Government of Guam, nor a member of any other board or Commission" to "No member shall be a director, deputy director, appointed unclassified employee, any other unclassified employees of the Government of Guam, nor a member of any board or commission" would make it more specific. The intent being to have Commissioners of the Public Utilities Commission who would not be directly influenced by the Governor.

IV. FINDINGS

The Commission must make have an immediate impact on the entire community. Their decisions must be based on factual information and data presented to them by the utility appearing before them, taking into consideration the expert recommendations of their own consultants. The decisions the Commissioners must make must not be influenced by implied, explicit or perceived impressions that their jobs may be in jeopardy, if they are employees of the Government of Guam. The Committee also finds that classified employees of the Government of Guam are adequately protected by existing statutes and regulations. However, appointed employees of the government do not have the same kind of protection and serve solely at the pleasure of the appointing authority and are very susceptible to outside pressure which may have an impact on how they arrive at their decisions. Bill No. 122, as substituted by the Committee will prevent this potential problem.

V. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Power, Foreign Affairs & General Government Services hereby reports out Bill No. 140, as substituted by the Committee, with recommendation TO DO PASS.

Comments to Bill No. 122

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Bill No. 122 amends §17001(a) of Title 12 GCA relative to the Public Utilities Commission's Number and Appointment of Commissioners. The Bill provides additional eligibility requirements for appointment as Commission member, such that no member shall be an employee of the government of Guam, nor a a member of any other board or commission. In addition, the appointment of any person to the Commission shall become void if at any time during his term of office become an employee of the government of Guam or accept an appointment to any other board or commission.

If enacted, the Bill will affect the present membership of the Public Utilities Commission which consist of at least three (3) Commissioners holding positions within the government of Guam. These members would therefore be deemed ineligible and would have to relinquish their appointments in compliance with the proposed measure.

Bill 122 will pose a minimal fiscal impact to the operating expenses of the Public Utilities Commission. A cost savings from the non-payment of stipends to those affected Commissioners for meetings unattended may be realized. Such savings is dependent on the number of Commission meetings held through the duration of the appointment process of the Governor to fill the vacancies caused by the enautment of Bill 122.
