Enclosed please find Bill No. 151 (COR), "AN ACT TO ACT TO ADD \$3105.1 TO CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 3 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO DESIGNATING HIGH SCHOOLS, THE GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND COLLEGES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM AS PLACES FOR VOTER REGISTRATION", which I have signed into law today as **Public Law No. 25-10**.

This legislation establishes the various high schools of Guam, as well as the Guam Community College and the various colleges of the University of Guam as designated sites for voter registration. This will make it very easy for those turning 18 years old to immediately register to vote, since they will not need to make a separate trip to the Guam Election Commission. It will also provide easy access for the general public to register, since these educational institutions are located in every village, near residential areas.

There is no funding provided in the legislation. The legislation imposes an additional duty on the current employees of the high schools, the GCC, and the UOG colleges, because it mandates that the current employees become qualified to register voters and to perform voter registration duties.

Interestingly, the public hearing on this legislation did not involve any personnel from the educational institutions who are mandated to comply with the terms of the legislation. Although public hearings are usually





1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** Section 3105.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 3 of Title 3 of the
3 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

4 **"Section 3105.1. High Schools, The Guam Community College
5 And Colleges Of The University Of Guam Designated As Places Of
6 Registration.** All public high schools, the Guam Community College
7 and Colleges of the University of Guam are designated as places for
8 registration of electors. Registration shall take place during the normal
9 business hours of each school or college. Each principal of a public high
10 school shall designate at least one (1) permanent twelve-month
11 employee to act as a registration clerk on behalf of the high school. The
12 President of the Guam Community College shall designate at least one
13 (1) permanent twelve-month employee to act as a registration clerk on
14 behalf of the Guam Community College. Each Dean of a college of the
15 University of Guam shall designate at least one (1) permanent twelve-
16 month employee to act as a registration clerk on behalf of the College.
17 Private high schools may, at their option, be designated as places of
18 registration. All employees designated to act as registration clerks shall
19 meet all the qualifications of this Chapter and shall comply with all
20 laws, rules, regulations and procedures governing the conduct of
21 registration clerks. The Commission shall develop rules, regulations
22 and procedures for the appointment and training of registration clerks."

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform, Reorganization and Federal Affairs held a public hearing on Thursday, April 15, 1999 at 10:00 a.m. at I Liheslaturan Public Hearing Room. Public Notice of the hearing was announced in the April 10, 1999 and April 15, 1999 issues of the Pacific Daily News.

Providing Written Testimony on the Bill:

Ms. Elizabeth Blas, Acting Director Guam Election Commission (attached)

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Ms. Elizabeth Blas, Acting Director Guam Election Commission submitted written testimony on the Bill. She noted that it is not the Commission's policy to take a position for or against legislation but to provide insight on the subject matter. Ms. Blas concluded that all measures to enhance the voting process are welcome by the Commission.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform, Reorganization and Federal Affairs finds that the right to vote is the most important right that we as citizens in a democracy possess. However, many factors including but not limited to complacency and voter apathy have caused a decline in voter registration both locally and nationally. Traditionally, most of the voter registration activity on Guam takes place immediately prior to an election. Allowing schools to be designated as places for voter registration would increase the accessibility for those students of voting age, who wish to register to vote.

Accordingly, the Committee on Rules, Government Reform, Reorganization and Federal Affairs, to which Bill No. 151 was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Singko Na Liheslaturan Guahan **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 151**, "An act to add a new §3105.1 to Chapter 3 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated relative to designating high schools, the Guam Community College and Colleges of the University of Guam as places of voter registration."

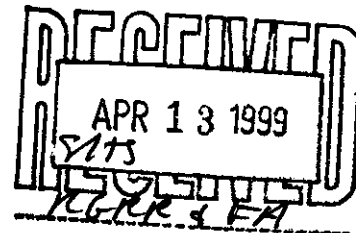

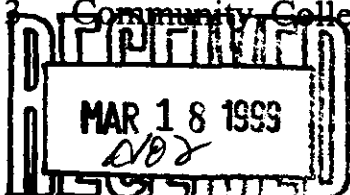

The President of the Guam Community College shall designate at least one (1) permanent twelve-month employee to act as a registration clerk on behalf of the Guam Community College. Each Dean of a college of the University of Guam shall

Dear Mr. Chairman:

We understand that the Committee has scheduled a public hearing for April 15, 1999 at 10:00 a.m., to receive public testimony on several pieces of legislation. Of particular interest to the Guam Election Commission are Bill Nos. 151 and 172. As you know, the Commission has a standing policy not to comment on the merits or demerits of any legislation but to only provide comments as it relates to the Commission's administrative area of responsibility. We therefore, submit the following:

Bill No. 151: An Act to add a new §3105.1 to Chapter 3 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated relative to designating High Schools, the Guam Community College and Colleges of the University of Guam as places of Voter Registration.

The Commission's current Voter Outreach Program has been, in coordination with the various school principals, to conduct voter registration at both Public and Private High Schools. Similar arrangements are also made with the University of Guam and the Guam Community College. The Commission would welcome any recommendations from the sponsor to further improve this outreach program at the various educational institutions.

Bill No. 172: An Act to appropriate twenty-five thousand two hundred dollars (\$25,200.00) from the General Fund, through debt service savings derived from the refunding of prior bond issues of the General Fund, to the Guam Election Commission for the purpose of upgrading their existing balloting machines.

Contrary to the Commission's policy of not commenting on the merits or demerits of any legislation, we would be remiss if we did not submit favorable testimony towards receiving funding to upgrade our balloting machines. The Commission welcomes any legislation that provides funding for our operations, more specifically, the upgrade of our balloting machines.


The amount that is mentioned in Bill No. 172 would only be sufficient to upgrade our present system that would entail replacing the tape drive system with a disk type system on all our six scanners. The Commission's present system has been on site and first used in the 1984 elections. Prior to this, the Commission utilized an Optical Scanner that was used in the 1974 elections and subsequent elections up until 1984. Our current system is over fifteen years of age.

During the tabulation of the 1998 Primary Election, we experienced some problems with our tape drive system, therefore, the Commission sought the assistance of the Legislature in obtaining funding to purchase a newer model that is available, however, the producer of our election system felt that there was insufficient time to install a new system in time for the 1998 General Election, therefore, the Commission opted to go with only upgrading our tape drives to a disk drive, with the cost being \$25,200, of which the Legislature approved and which the Commission is most grateful.

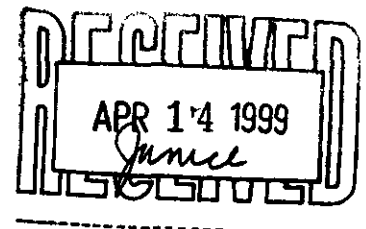
As mentioned earlier that our system is over fifteen years old. With this in mind, the Commission would like to work closely with the Chairman and the Committee in upgrading our scanners to the latest model known as the ES&S 550 Scanner. Estimated cost that we have received to purchase six (6) ES&S 550's is about \$45,000 per system along with an Election Reporting System Software with a total of about \$280,000 plus. Arrangements can be to outright purchase the system or lease the system. We would be pleased to provide any additional information, if the Chairman or the Committee so desires.

Thank you Mr. Chairman for inviting us to submit testimony on Bill Nos. 151 and 172.

6 high schools, the Guam Community College and Colleges of the University of
7 Guam are designated as places for registration of electors. Registration shall take
8 place during the normal business hours of each school or college. Each principal
9 of a public high school shall designate at least one (1) permanent twelve-month
10 employee to act as a registration clerk on behalf of the high school. The President
11 of the Guam Community College shall designate at least one (1) permanent
12 twelve-month employee to act as a registration clerk on behalf of the Guam
13 Community College. Each Dean of a college of the University of Guam shall
