Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 197 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD §5008.1 TO PART A, ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 5, DIVISION 1 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THE PROCUREMENT OF NATIVE AND GROWN-IN-GUAM HORTICULTURAL PRODUCTS", which I have signed into law today as **Public Law No. 25-100**.

This legislation focuses on preserving the local character of landscaping for public areas and areas where public funds are spent on plants. In the past, there have been instances of off-island purchases of horticulture products which were planted on Guam. Some of these horticulture products were not native to Guam and did not thrive on the island.

This legislation involves the University of Guam and the Department of Agriculture in establishing a listing of horticulture products which are indigenous to Guam or which have been successfully grown on our island. Procurement of plants, trees, flowers, shrubs, grass, and seeds will be procured with public funds to promote the local flora of Guam, preserving the unique "look" of our island.





1           **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2           **Section 1. Legislative Statement.**           *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that  
3 it is an established policy of this government to provide preference to local  
4 businesses in procurement of goods utilizing public funds. It is also a public  
5 priority to protect and conserve local and native species, ensuring that our

1 future generations enjoy the native plants, and to preserve our delicate  
2 ecosystem.

3 Thus, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to require the procurement  
4 of native and locally-grown horticultural products when utilizing public  
5 funds, to complement and embellish infrastructure improvements and  
6 landscape projects. By increasing the visibility of native and locally-grown  
7 horticultural products, we can proudly display our distinct identity and  
8 culture to our visitors.

9 **Section 2.** Section 5008.1 is hereby *added* to Part A, Article 1, Chapter 5,  
10 Division 1 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

11 **"Section 5008.1. Policy in Favor of Native or Grown-in-**  
12 **Guam Horticultural Products.** (a) Notwithstanding any other  
13 provision of law, in any procurement of horticultural products  
14 utilizing public funds, no less than seventy-five percent (75%) of  
15 the products to be procured shall be native to Guam or grown-in-  
16 Guam, *except* for horticultural products that are on the endangered  
17 specie list, *unless* they are domestically cultivated and shall be  
18 made from among businesses authorized to transact business in  
19 Guam. *'Horticultural products,'* as used in this Section, includes:

- 20 (1) plants;  
21 (2) trees;  
22 (3) flowers;  
23 (4) shrubs;  
24 (5) grass; and

1           (6) seeds.

2           (b) The Department of Agriculture shall, in cooperation with  
3 the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences of the University of Guam:

4           (1) determine, establish and maintain a list of species of  
5 native horticultural products;

6           (2) determine conditions that constitute '*grown-in-Guam*';  
7 *and*

8           (3) establish and regularly update a list of qualified local  
9 landscapers, farmers and other related businesses authorized to  
10 transact business on Guam, and to assist those qualified  
11 businesses in establishment of availability and other related  
12 logistics to facilitate acquisition of horticultural products that are  
13 native to Guam, or grown-in-Guam, by all agencies and  
14 instrumentalities of Guam and other entities expending public  
15 funds.

16           (c) The provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Law  
17 shall *not* apply to the requirements of this Subsection."

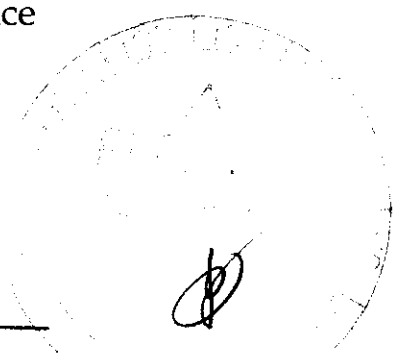



**PUBLIC HEARING:** The Committee on Housing, General Government Services and Foreign Affairs, to which was referred Bill No. 197 (COR) " AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §5008.1 TO PART A, ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 5 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THE PROCUREMENT OF NATIVE AND GROWN-IN-GUAM HORTICULTURAL PRODUCTS," conducted a public hearing on Wednesday, May 26, 1999, at the Legislative Public Hearing Room.

**MEMBERS PRESENT:** Senator Kaleo S. Moylan, Chairperson of the Committee on Housing, General Government Services and Foreign Affairs convened the hearing at approximately 9:00 a.m. Committee members and other Senators present were: John C. Salas, Carlotta A. Leon Guerrero, and Lawrence F. Kasperbauer.

**TESTIMONY:** Appearing before the Committee was Juan Tajito, Acting Director, Department of Agriculture. Mr. Tajito testified in favor of Bill No 197. He informed the Committee members that the legislation will help stimulate the economy due to local sales of locally grown plants. Director Tajito noted that the implementation of Bill No. 197 will stop the unfair practice and assist those persons who currently operate greenhouse, plantation and or plant nurseries, to assist in the beautification of the island by promoting native and grown-in-Guam plants.

After a brief discussion, the Chairman of the Committee adjourned the hearing on Bill No. 197 (COR).

**FINDINGS:** The Committee finds that:

- Passage and enactment of Bill No. 197 (COR) would establish that it is the policy of this government to provide preference to local businesses in procurement of goods utilizing public funds. And it is also a public priority

to protect and conserve native and local species ensuring that our future generations enjoy the native plants, and to preserve our delicate ecosystem.

- By increasing the visibility of native and grown-in-Guam horticultural products, as an island community we can proudly display our distinct identity and culture to our visitors.
- Bill No. 197 makes it a priority to protect and conserve native and grown-in-Guam species ensuring that our future generations enjoy the native plants, and to preserve our delicate ecosystem.






