1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. Prior to the passage of
Public Law Number 24-07, the developers of Lot Number 23, Block 3, Tract
100C, Dededo, Guam were granted a zone change from "R-2" to "C," along
with an approval for Conditional Use to be limited to a mini-storage facility
only. *However*, the lot number was inadvertently omitted in §3.

Section 2. Section 3 of Public Law Number 24-07 is hereby *amended* to
 read as follows:

3	"Section 3. Grandfather Provision. Any application to

8	whether or not approved by I Maga'lahen Guåhan, shall be exempt from
9	the GLUC Conditional Use Application process and shall be deemed
10	approved. The Department of Land Management is hereby directed to
11	issue a formal 'Notice of Action' for these applications."

Sen. Camacho: This bill was introduced more as a technical amendment to Legislation that was passed in the 24th Guam Legislature. When the law was passed it was DLM who got an opinion from the Attorney General that the intent of the Bill could not be followed all the way through because a technical problem not identifying a lot that had been approved in the bill. This legislation tries to correct the situation by adding the Lot number to the Law. I view it as a technical amendment. Is there anyone who would like to testify on the Bill No. 346? If not, for the record, Bill No. 346 has been publically heard.

States cautious on paid family leave

WASHINGTON (AP) — Fe w states are expected to pay new parents' unemploy-ment benefits any time soon under an experimental pro-gram that President Clinton outlined Tuesday.

"I believe giving states the fle xibility to experiment with paid employment leave is one of the best things we can do to strengthen our families and to surragine our families and help new mothers and fathers meet their responsibilities, both at home and at work," said Clinton, joined by three families at an Oval Office an-Picific atouncement.

A maximum cost estimate of \$68 million annually for the pilot project, provided by nistration, assu at most 71,000 parents in four states will participate in the short term.

Experts say state governments, which are under no obligation to offer the paid child-care leave, are likely to be wary of spending money on it that they collect for un-employment benefits.



Advocates of adding new parents to unemployment rolls in Maryland, Massa chusetts, Vermont and Washington requested the federal clearance. Legislators in those and other states have yet to consider the idea formally.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 24-07.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. Prior to the passage of Public Law 24-07, the developers of Lot 23, Block 3, Tract 100C, Dededo were granted a zone change from "R-2" to "C"along with an approval for Conditional Use to be limited to a Mini-storage facility only. However, the lot number was inadvertently omitted in Section 3.

7 Section 2. Amendment to Section 3 of Public Law 24-07. Section 3 of
8 Public Law 24-07 is amended to read:

"Section 3. Grandfather Provision. Any application to the Territorial Guam 9 10 Land Use Commission (TLUC) (GLUC) for the purpose of permitting a Ministorage or Mini-warehouse facility, inclusive of Lot No. 23, Block 3, Tract 11 12 <u>100C, Dededo</u>, which has been approved by the TLUC <u>GLUC</u> prior to the 13 enactment of the Amendment, whether or not approved by the Governor of 14 Guam, shall be exempt from the TLUC GLUC Conditional Use Application 15 process and shall be deemed approved. The Department of Land 16 Management is hereby directed to issue a formal "Notice of Action" for these 17 applications.".
