





AN ACT TO ADD §833 TO ARTICLE 1 OF TITLE 1 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO RENAMING THE RETIREMENT FUND BUILDING AS THE "SENATOR JESUS R. QUINENE RETIREMENT FUND BUILDING".

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan
- 3 finds that former Senator Jesus R. Quinene, a statesman in the First and
- 4 Second Guam Legislature, was a champion in strengthening our
- 5 infrastructure and educating our children. From the building of new
- 6 schools, to the construction of the roadway leading to the present Agat-
- 7 Umatac Road, Sen. Jesus R. Quinene was pro-active and his leadership was
- 8 put to the benefit of the entire island.

- 9 I Liheslaturan Guahan further acknowledges that through the work,
- 10 foresight and action of former Sen. Jesus R. Quinene, the Government of
- 11 Guam Retirement Fund was created providing retirement annuities and
- benefits to employees of the government of Guam and their survivors.

It is therefore the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to commemorate the memory and contributions of the late Sen. Jesus R. Quinene by naming the present Retirement Fund Building in his honor.

Section 2. Section 833 is hereby added to Chapter 8, Article 1 of Title 1 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building. The Retirement 6 Fund Building, located in the Municipality of Maite, shall hereafter be 7 known as the "Sen. Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building". Any 8 provisions in the laws of Guam referring to the Retirement Fund Building 9 are hereby deemed to read the "Sen. Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund 10 Building". The Governor of Guam, the Director of the Retirement Fund, 11 the Mayor of Mong Mong-Toto-Maite and members of the M-T-M 12 Municipal Planning Council, shall cause to be erected appropriated 13 nameplates or signs designating the Retirement Fund Building as the "Sen. 14 Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building". Further, at such ceremony as 15 16 the Governor, the Director of the Retirement Fund and the Mayor of M-T-M and members of the M-T-M Municipal Planning Council deem 17 appropriate, the "Sen. Jesus R. Quinene Retirement Fund Building," shall 18 19 be officially named and a plaque bearing the name, picture, and brief history of the contributions of the late Senator Jesus R. Quinene to the 20 people of Guam shall be affixed within a suitable spot in or on the 21 building." 22
