AN ACT TO AMEND §7120 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 7, DIVISION 1 OF TITLE 22 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING SPECIFIC FUNDING FOR THE GUAM DEPARTMENT OF LABOR'S QUARTERLY "THE UNEMPLOYMENT SITUATION ON GUAM" REPORT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Guåhan Liheslaturan finds that Public Law Number 25-3 allocates thirty percent (30%) of the Manpower Development Fund ("MDF") to the Guam Department of Labor to assist their meeting the needs of the Island through a variety of services. A vital part of this service is the publication of unemployment data, both the private and public sectors need to determine Guam's economic situation, plan for and implement a variety of economic and social programs and manage the Island's human resources. However, the Guam Department of Labor's most recent unemployment report was published in March, 1998.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to mandate that the unemployment report be published continuously and consistently by providing a specific funding source to accomplish this task. Therefore, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* will dedicate on an annual basis One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) of the Department of Labor's thirty percent (30%) MDF allocation to complete and publish the quarterly "The Unemployment Situation on Guam" report.

Section 2. Section 7120 of Article 1, Chapter 7, Division 1 of Title 22 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"Section 7120. Manpower Development Fund. There is hereby created in the Guam Department of Labor a Manpower Development Fund ("MDF"), which shall remain separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam. The MDF is created solely for the purpose of receiving territorial, Federal, and private

money and revenues from registration fees on non-immigrant temporary workers. Thirty percent (30%) of the annual revenues generated shall be allocated to the Guam Department of Labor. The Department of Labor allocation in the MDF shall be expended exclusively to fund the following:

- (a) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be allocated annually to produce the quarterly "The Unemployment Situation on Guam" report; and
- (b) the remaining balance of the Department of Labor's MDF allocation shall be used for administrative and operational purposes as may be determined by the Director of Labor.

Seventy percent (70%) of the annual revenues generated shall be allocated to the Apprenticeship Training Program at the Guam Community College. The Guam Community College allocation in the MDF shall be paid out by the Treasurer of Guam to the Apprenticeship Training Program at Guam Community College, which shall be expended exclusively to fund the following, which shall be subject to legislative appropriation:

- (a) the administrative and instructional costs for the operation of the apprenticeship training programs;
- (b) the advertising and outreach programs for the promotion of the apprenticeship training programs; and
- (c) direct financial assistance to students enrolled in the apprenticeship program. Any unused portion of this allocation under this Subsection shall be returned to the MDF.

The MDF shall *not* be used for any purposes other than those enumerated in this Section."

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 216 (COR), "AN ACT TO AMEND §7120 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 7, DIVISION 1 OF TITLE 22 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING SPECIFIC FUNDING FOR THE GUAM DEPARTMENT OF LABOR'S QUARTERLY "THE UNEMPLOYMENT SITUATION ON GUAM" REPORT", which I have vetoed.

This legislation takes the current funding, used for the administration of the Department of Labor, and segregates out \$100,000 from this funding and designates it for publishing a quarterly report on unemployment. However, a general hiring freeze exists prohibiting the hiring of individuals to carry out the survey to produce this unemployment report.

The current law requires a portion of the funding to be used at the Guam Community College (GCC) for administrative and instructional costs of the apprenticeship training programs, the advertising and outreach programs of the apprenticeship training programs, and no less than 50% of this funding to the direct financial assistance to students enrolled in the apprenticeship programs. This legislation, by contrast, deletes the requirement of using no less than 50% of the GCC's portion for direct student financial assistance, to the detriment of students who might be in the program.

Legislative Secretary/SB216/veto March, 2000 - Page 2

Since this legislation diverts Department of Labor funding without providing personnel for the task of completing an unemployment report, and since students may suffer from removal of the amount required to be spent on direct financial assistance for the students in the apprenticeship program at the GCC, this legislation does not appear to accomplish any positive goals.

Bill 216: An act to amend §7120 of Article 1, Chapter 7, Division 1 of Title 22 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to establishing specific funding for the Guam Department of Labor's quarterly "The Unemployment Situation on Guam" report. Senator John C. Salas

III. SYNOPSIS

Bill 216 proposes to ensure a reliable funding source for the publication of the Guam Department of Labor's "The Unemployment Situation on Guam" report. Bill 216 provides 30% of the Manpower Development Fund (MDF) to the Department of Labor (DOL) and further allocates \$100,000 annually from DOL's share of the MDF to the unemployment report.

IV. TESTIMONY

Chairman Salas, gave an overview of the bill and noted that as a long time member of the private sector, he understands the value of the unemployment report as an economic indicator and as a tool businesses use that affects hiring and the bottom line. Previously, the entire MDF was earmarked to the Guam Community College. Public Law 25-03 gave 30% of the MDF back to DOL. Bill 216 dedicates \$100,000 of DOL's MDF share to publish the unemployment report. It has been shown that the report has been costing between \$90,000 and \$100,000.

James Underwood, Director of the Department of Labor, noted that he initially supported the bill, but after looking at the entire department's various needs, cannot support this bill. He noted concern that Bill 216 would take too much from the 30% share of the MDF while other areas such as Alien Labor Certification and Processing are in need of operational funds. He noted that the MDF is a diminishing fund and taking \$100,000 out of it will defeat its original purpose of assisting the department in its alien labor processing responsibilities. Further, Director Underwood noted that decline of MDF money will affect the ability to fund the report. He continued with written testimony.

Senator Pangelinan noted that the bill does not dictate that only the money identified from the MDF can be used for the report. He noted that the bill does not prohibit the Director from using other funding sources to supplement the publication of the unemployment report.

Chairman Salas, while understanding the Director's concern, expressed his disagreement with Director Underwood's analysis. He provided his experience on the temporary labor issue which dates back to 1969. He noted that at no time has the number of alien workers dipped below 1,200. At one time during the height of Guam's economy, it jumped to approximately 12,000 workers. Looking at the base of 1,200 non-residential workers at \$200 per head, he noted that there should be enough money going into the MDF. This base of alien workers will increase as the economy improves. Further, history indicates as administrations change, construction level move from horizontal to vertical. He further

went on to state that the Department cannot rely on the General Fund to ensure that the unemployment report is published. Because of these factors, the MDF is a more reliable source of funding for the report than the General Fund.

The Committee received written testimony from John R. Rider, Vice President for Academic Affairs at the Guam Community College, requesting for an amendment to Bill 216 that does not restrict their allocation to 50% for direct financial assistance to students. During low enrollment periods, they would like to utilize funds to promote the program but would be restricted from using this fund under the bill's provisions.

V. COMMITTEE FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATION

The Committee finds that while the Director of the Department of Labor opposes the bill as it restricts a large portion of their MDF share to the publication of the unemployment report, the Committee does not feel it is appropriate to leave such a vital economic indicator to the mercy of the General Fund. The Committee also agrees to incorporate the Guam Community College's amendment to ensure that their students receive direct financial assistance and at the same time give GCC the ability to promote their program at times of low enrollment to perpetuate the program. Therefore, the Committee recommends **TO DO PASS Bill 216,** as substituted.

2 **Section 1.** Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan 3 finds that Public Law 25-3 allocates 30% of the Manpower Development 4 Fund (MDF) to the Guam Department of Labor to assist their meeting the 5 needs of the island through a variety of services. A vital part of this service is 6 the publication of unemployment data both the private and public sectors need to determine Guam's economic situation, plan for and implement a 7 8 variety of economic and social programs and manage the island's human 9 resources. However, the Guam Department of Labor's most recent 10 unemployment report was published in March 1998.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to mandate that the unemployment report be published continuously and consistently by providing a specific funding source to accomplish this task. Therefore, *I Liheslaturan Guahan* will dedicate on an annual basis One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) of the Department of Labor's 30% MDF allocation to complete and publish the quarterly "The Unemployment Situation on Guam" report.

Section 2. Section 7120 of Article 1, Chapter 7, Division 1 of Title 22 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read:

"§7120. Manpower Development Fund. There is hereby created in the Guam Department of Labor a Manpower Development Fund (hereinafter "MDF"), which shall remain separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam. The MDF is created solely for the purpose of receiving territorial, federal, and private money and revenues from registration fees on non-immigrant temporary workers. Thirty percent (30%) of the annual revenues generated shall be allocated to the Guam Department of Labor, for administrative and operational purposes as may be determined by the Director of Labor. The Department of Labor allocation in the MDF shall be expended exclusively to fund the following:

(a) One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) shall be allocated annually to produce the quarterly "The Unemployment Situation on Guam" report.

(b) The remaining balance of the Department of Labor's MDF allocation shall be used for administrative and operational purposes as may be determined by the Director of Labor.

Seventy percent (70%) of the annual revenues generated shall be allocated to the Apprenticeship Training Program at Guam Community

College. The Guam Community College allocation Funds in the MDF shall be paid out by the Treasurer of Guam to the Apprenticeship Training Program at Guam Community College which shall be expended exclusively to fund the following, which shall be subject to legislative appropriation:

- (a) The administrative and instructional costs for the operation of the apprenticeship training programs.
- (b) The advertising and outreach programs for the promotion of the apprenticeship training programs.
- (c) Direct financial assistance to students enrolled in the apprenticeship program. Any unused portion of this allocation under this subsection shall be returned to MDF. Not less than fifty percent (50%) of the annual revenues shall be appropriated for direct financial assistance to students enrolled in the apprenticeship training program. Any unused portion of the appropriated fund under this subsection shall be returned to the MDF.

The MDF shall *not* be used for any purposes other than those enumerated in this section."

Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

Dear Chairman Salas:

We are pleased to offer this testimony in behalf of the Department of Labor and the Gutierrez Administration on Bill 216. While the intent of Bill 216 is most commendable we can not support the Bill as written.

The Department has now produced two consecutive unemployment quarterly reports after a full year of not producing any report. The multi-year non-itemized Budget Acts for FY 98 and FY 99 that did not give specific funding authority or limitation to the production of the unemployment reports was more the contributing factor than the absence of a specifically identified funding source in the Budget Acts.

The Department has produced the unemployment reports for decades under the normal itemized budget process where funds would come from the General Fund with an expenditure ceiling established, thus the general knowledge that \$90,000 was annual budget for this program.

The recent amendment restoring 30% of the Manpower Development Fund (MDF) for Department of Labor use would in effect by nullified by Bill 216 since almost the entire revenues allocated to Labor would be used for Bureau of Labor Statistics unemployment report activity with the smaller remaining balances if any, being available for Alien Labor Processing and Certification Division administrative and operational purposes. To illustrate this we simply

take the collections of the fund since April 1, 1999 to date of \$85,800 and multiply that by 30% resulting in only \$25,740 available for Bill 216 purposes, a) Unemployment report production and b) DOL administrative and operational purposes.

The steady and sharp decline of the number of alien workers subject to the MDF could result in the inadequacy of the fund to cover quarterly unemployment report production costs in a time period measured in months rather than years. Since we would not want to see an increase of alien workers just to fund these reports, you can see our opposition to Bill 216.

We recommend that Bill 216 be substituted with new provisions that would amend appropriate Bureau of Labor Statistics section to:

- Identify a stable and recurring source to fund all unemployment reports production costs notwithstanding that annual budget acts may not be itemized budgets.
- 2) Define the Department of Labor Temporary Survey Workers to permit their most cost effective utilization and exemptions from certain typical government employee processing requirements.

As you and your committee develop the FY2000 Budget for the Department of Labor you may add such new provisions as administrative sections or report Bill 216 with the changes we recommend.

Thank you for this opportunity to comment on Bill 216.



Dear Senator Salas:

As one of the primary agencies involved in human resources development, Guam Community College sincerely appreciates the efforts of your office to ensure the adequate preparation of our workforce through programs such as the Apprenticeship Training Program funded by the Manpower Development Fund (MDF).

Section 7120 of Article 1, Chapter 7, Division 1 of Title 22 of the Guam Code Annotated requires 50% of the MDF allocation to be used for direct financial assistance to students enrolled in the Apprenticeship program. This requirement has proven to be an obstacle to the program and the students it serves rather than a benefit. As the enrollment of students fluctuates so do revenues to the program, even though the operational costs remain the same during these typically brief reductions in enrollment. This means that during times when we should be increasing our efforts to attract more students to the program we are hampered by declining revenue.

As your committee focuses on other aspects of Bill 216, please replace the sentence in Section 4, sub-paragraph (c) that reads: "Not less than fifty percent (50%) of the Guam Community College allocation in the MDF shall be appropriated for direct financial assistance to students enrolled in the apprenticeship training program." with the following:

"(c) Direct financial assistance to students enrolled in the apprenticeship training program. Any unused portion of this allocation under this subsection shall be returned to MDF."


