AN ACT TO AMEND §1203(f) OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 1 OF TITLE 12 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE AUTHORITY AND ADDITIONAL POWERS OF THE GUAM INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT AUTHORITY.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that
during these critical economic times, efforts should be concentrated on
developing ways to secure Guam's financial and social future. It also finds that a
key component to our economic success is in improving the Tourism Industry,

one of the primary sources of our Island's revenue. In addition, it finds that the
Tourism Industry is extremely competitive, and we cannot rely upon sites and
attractions we already have to maintain our market share. Visitors are looking
for new and different destinations with newer activities and better facilities.

5 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that at present, the property near and 6 surrounding the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport is underutilized and 7 has tremendous potential for business development, including, but *not* limited to, 8 the Visitor Industry. It also finds that the Authority needs the added power of 9 making and entering into contracts, leases and permits for the use of its property 10 for purposes *other* than that which is airport-related.

11 Furthermore, I Liheslaturan Guåhan believes that this amendment will provide opportunities for the Guam International Airport Authority 12 13 ("Authority") to generate additional revenue for its operations. In so doing, the 14 Authority can then work to further reduce passenger and other related fees for its 15 signatory carriers and other airline companies. This issue has been one (1) of 16 discussion recently within the Tourism Industry, as the costs associated with such 17 fees are seen as one (1) barrier to the increase of flight services from major 18 airlines, thereby limiting the number of available seats to Guam for visitors.

Section 2. Section 1203(f) of Article 2, Chapter 1 of Title 12 of the Guam
Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"(f) Improve, construct or reconstruct, lease, furnish or refurnish,
use, repair, maintain, control, sell or dispose of its property, including any
buildings, structures, lighting equipment and all other equipment and
facilities necessary therefor; and notwithstanding any other provision of
law, make and enter into contracts, leases and permits for the use of airport

facilities and properties for airport purposes, and visitor related activities,
 and make and enter into airline agreements, without prior approval of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, as long as these agreements are in conformity with the
 provisions of §1203.1 of this Title."

Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULE

The Committee on Transportation, Telecommunication and Micronesian Affairs conducted a Public Hearing on Tuesday, December 13, 1999 at 9:00 a.m. in the Public Hearing room of I Liheslaturan Guahan Temporary Building in Hagåtña.

Committee Members present: Sen. Carlotta A. Leon Guerrero, Chair

SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Testifying in favor of the bill was Chris Gerber, President of CTG Corporation. Mr. Gerber says passage of the Bill would allow his company to lease airport for a proposed recreational facility. Mr. Gerber says his company has worked for a year to secure Federal Aviation Administration approval for the project, and he envisions a facility that would enhance tourism and would be enjoyed by local residents as well.

Also testifying in favor of the bill was Guam International Airport Authority Deputy Executive Manager Gilbert Robles, who said GIAA wholeheartedly supports the proposed legislation which would be allow the airport to further generate non-airline revenue while in support of the visitor industry.

Finally, Guam Visitors Bureau General Manager James Nelson also testified in favor of the bill saying for too long the property surrounding the airport has been underutilized, and the potential for business development is immeasurable. Mr. Nelson says the bill would help create more jobs and will further the recovery of the economy.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee finds that Bill 249 has the strong support of both the Airport Authority and the Guam Visitors Bureau and will enhance airport revenues, create jobs, and benefit the tourism industry.

The Committee also finds that the Federal Aviation Administration conducted an airspace analysis and its review from an airspace utilization standpoint indicated the proposal by CTG corporation is acceptable.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

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The Committee on Transportation, Telecommunications and Micronesian Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 249 to I Mina'Bente Singko na Liheslaturan Guahan with the recommendation To Pass.

Dear Mr. Gerber:

This is in response to the FAA Form 7460-1, Notice of Proposed Construction, dated February 16, 1999, for construction of a 100' skycoaster amusement ride near Guam International Airport.

Under Aeronautical Study No. 99-HNL-41-NRA, the FAA has conducted an airspace analysis. Our review from an airspace utilization standpoint indicated the proposal is acceptable. Therefore, we do not object.

This determination does not include temporary construction equipment that may be used during the actual construction phase of this proposal. Such equipment which exceeds the height of the proposal requires separate notice.

This determination should not be construed to mean FAA approval of the physical development involved in the proposal. It is only a determination with respect to the safe and efficient use of airspace by aircraft. In making this determination, the FAA has considered matters such as the effect the proposal would have on existing or contemplated traffic patterns of neighboring airports, the effects it would have on the existing airspace structure and projected programs of the FAA, and the effects existing or proposed manmade objects (on file with the FAA) and natural objects within the effected area would have on the airport proposal. This determination in no way preempts or waives any ordinances, laws or regulations of any other government body or agency.

This determination does not indicate that the proposed airport development is environmentally acceptable in accordance with Public Laws 91-190, 91-258, and/or 90-495.

This determination expires on March 16, 2001, unless it is otherwise extended, revised, or terminated, or the facility is constructed before that date.

Testimony of James E. Nelson III, General Manager Guam Visitors Bureau on Bill No. 249 Tuesday, December 14, 1999

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> Håfa Adai Madame Chairperson and members of the Committee on Transportation, Telecommunications & Micronesian Affairs. Thank you for the opportunity to present testimony on Bill No. 249: An Act to amend § 1203(f) of Article 2, Chapter 1 of Title 12 Guam Code Annotated relative to the authority and additional powers of the Guam Airport Authority.

> It is clear in the intent of Bill No. 249 that this legislative body recognizes that much more must be accomplished in order to rebuild our ailing economy. For far too long, the property near and surrounding the A. B. Won Pat International Airport has been underutilized. The potential for business development is immeasurable. Airport related serviced alone would go far in assisting the Guam International Airport Authority in maintaining the first class facility that we now are proud to call the best airport in the western Pacific. In addition, the potential of indirect services related to our tourism industry would greatly benefit our community as a whole. By giving the Guam International Airport Authority the powers stipulated in Bill No. 249, more jobs would be created that will further the recovery of our economy.

> The Guam International Airport Authority has done a tremendous job in reducing its operating costs and in turn, passed those savings on to our signatory carriers through greatly reduced enplaned passenger costs. I am pleased that the legislative intent recognized the fine effort that has been put forth and encourages the airport to generate additional revenues to further reduce passenger and other related fees for the carriers. It is my hope that one day, these savings provided to the airlines will be passed on to the traveling public.

> In closing, allow me to offer my congratulations to the author of Bill No. 249 for specifically adding language that does not require the Guam International Airport Authority to seek legislative approval prior to entering into contracts, leases or permits surrounding the use of airport facilities and properties. This sends a strong, positive signal to the airport Board of Directors, management and staff that this legislative body has the confidence in the leadership abilities of the airport.

Madame Chairman, the Guam Visitors Bureau lends its full support towards the passage of Bill No. 249 and I thank you for giving me the opportunity to present testimony this morning.

This is in regards to the Public Hearing on Bill No. 339 and Bill No. 249 scheduled for December 14, 1999. We respectfully request your Committee accept this letter of testimony as part of the hearing record.

Bill No. 339

This is "An Act To Require Government Agencies To Include Any Proposed Expenditure For Commercial Mobile Radio Service As A Separate Line Item in Their Annual Budget."

The Antonio B. Won Pat Guam International Airport Authority (GIAA) concurs and will comply in creating a separate line item for CMRS in our annual budget. For Fiscal Year 2000, GIAA's budget had already gone through the signatory airlines review process and approval by our Board of Directors prior to the passage of Public Law 25-72. Our FY'2000 budget already includes proposed expenditures for CMRS under the line item, Telecommunications and , therefore, we believe it would be an unnecessary expense to make this change at this point. We recommend that for autonomous agencies that this requirement be implemented for the Fiscal Year 2001 budget process.

Lastly, we request that authorization for CMRS use be implemented as soon as possible. Accidents or emergency situations can occur at any time and cellular phones are an important and effective tool in response and for mitigation.




