CHAPTER I.

14 **Section 1. Short Title.** This Act shall be known as the "*General*
 15 *Appropriations Act of 2001.*" *Except* as otherwise provided by this Act, the
 16 appropriations made by this Act shall be available to pay for obligations
 17 incurred on or after October 1, 2000, but no later than September 30, 2001. In
 18 the event any appropriation of this Act is found contrary to Federal law, all
 19 portions *not* so found shall remain valid.

20 **Section 2. Adoption of Estimated Revenues for Fiscal Year 2001.** In
 21 the absence of any revenue estimates from the Special Accounting Service of
 22 the Guam Finance Commission, the revenue estimate for the General Fund in
 23 Fiscal Year 2001 of Four Hundred Thirty-nine Million Four Hundred Fifty-

1 seven Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars (\$439,457,838) is
2 established.

3 Special Funds are expected to collect Forty Million Six Hundred Sixty-
4 three Thousand Dollars (\$40,663,000). Federal Grants-in-Aid requiring local
5 matching totals Twenty-two Million Eight Hundred Nineteen Thousand Two
6 Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$22,819,260). *I Liheslaturan Guahån* hereby adopts this
7 revenue estimate for the purpose of making the various appropriations
8 contained in this Act.

9 **Section 3. Debt Service.** Seventeen Million Seven Hundred Eighty-
10 four Thousand Six Hundred Forty-four Dollars (\$17,784,644) is appropriated
11 from the General Fund for the *exclusive* purpose of the repayment of debt
12 service.

1 **CHAPTER II.**

2 **APPROPRIATIONS FOR PERSONNEL AND OPERATIONS.**

3 **Section 1. Personnel Appropriations.** Two Hundred Eighty-five
4 Million Three Hundred Twenty-four Thousand Ninety-six Dollars
5 (\$285,324,096) is appropriated for the personnel requirements for the period
6 beginning October 1, 2000 and ending September 30, 2001. This sum is
7 composed of Two Hundred Sixty Million Four Hundred Ninety-five
8 Thousand One Hundred Eighty-five Dollars (\$260,495,185) from the General
9 Fund, which shall be expended as contained in "**Attachment A**";
10 Fourteen Million Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Nine Hundred Forty Dollars
11 (\$14,550,940) from Special Funds, which shall be expended as contained in
12 "**Attachment B**"; and Ten Million Two Hundred Seventy-seven
13 Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-one Dollars (\$10,277,971) from Federal
14 Matching Grants-in-Aid, which shall be expended as contained in
15 "**Attachment C**."

16 **Section 2. Executive and Judicial Branch Operating Expenses.**

17 One Hundred Twenty-three Million Three Hundred Seventy-eight Thousand
18 Three Hundred Thirty-one Dollars (\$123,378,331) is appropriated for
19 operating expenses for the Executive and Judicial Branches for the fiscal year
20 ending September 30, 2001. This sum is composed of Ninety-four Million
21 Nine Hundred Forty-six Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-three Dollars
22 (\$94,946,393) from the General Fund, which shall be expended as contained in
23 "**Attachment A**"; Ten Million Five Hundred Ninety-six Thousand Eight
24 Hundred Fifty-six Dollars (\$10,596,856) from Special Funds, which shall be
25 expended as contained in "**Attachment B**"; and Seventeen Million Eight

- 1 Hundred Thirty-five Thousand Eighty-two Dollars (\$17,835,082) from Federal
- 2 Matching Grants-in-Aid, which shall be expended as contained in
- 3 **"Attachment C."**

CHAPTER III.

MISCELLANEOUS APPROPRIATIONS.

Section 1. Appropriation to UOG for Scholarships and Training Programs.

(a) Student Scholarship, Financial Assistance and Program Administration. Two Million Four Hundred Five Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-nine Dollars (\$2,405,429) is appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam to be expended for the following student scholarships, financial assistance programs and program administrations: Merit Awards, Student Loans, Nurse Training Programs, Professional and Technical Awards, Reserve Officer Training Corp. ("ROTC"), Regent Scholarships, Marine Lab Graduates Assistance Programs, Doctoral Fellowships, Advanced High School Placement Programs and administration of all student financial assistance programs.

The University of Guam shall determine the allocation of this appropriation in order to fund the various student scholarships, financial assistance programs and program administration.

(b) Pedro "Doc" Sanchez Scholarship Program. Two Hundred Seventy Thousand Five Hundred Eighty-six Dollars (\$270,586.00) is appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam for the Pedro "Doc" Sanchez Scholarship Program to be spent in accordance with its rules and regulations and §15107 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated, as amended.

1 (c) **Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita Educator Corps.** Two Million
2 Four Hundred Four Thousand Ninety-five Dollars (\$2,404,095) is
3 appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam, which
4 shall disburse the funds pursuant to the directives and policies of the
5 Educator Corps Council, for stipends for the Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita
6 Educator Corps and for the administration of the Educator Corps
7 Council, in accordance with the provisions of Public Law Number 24-
8 231, and §15107 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated, as amended.

9 (d) **Chamorro Teaching Degree Institute.** One Hundred Nine
10 Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$109,980.00) is appropriated
11 from the General Fund to the University of Guam for the operations of
12 the Chamorro Teaching Degree Institute. This appropriation shall
13 continue until expended for the operations, and other purposes of the
14 Institute.

15 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, funds
16 appropriated and available under §§2(a), (b), (c) and (d) of Chapter III of
17 Public Law Number 25-72, as repealed and reenacted by Public Law
18 Number 25-98, for Fiscal Year 2000 are available for the respective
19 scholarship programs for Fiscal Year 2001.

20 **Section 2. Appropriations to UOG.**

21 (a) Twenty-four Million Eight Hundred Three Thousand One
22 Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars (\$24,803,188) is appropriated from the
23 General Fund to the University of Guam ("UOG") for their operations.

24 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, funds appropriated
25 and available to UOG for Fiscal Year 2000 under §3(a) of Chapter III of

1 Public Law Number 25-72, as repealed and reenacted by Public Law
2 Number 25-98, are available to GCC for Fiscal Year 2001 operations.

3 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or fund balance
4 deficit that may exist, the Pari-Mutuel Tax Revenue provided for
5 pursuant to §5107 of Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated are hereby
6 appropriated to the Guam Community College ("GCC").
7 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Treasurer of Guam
8 shall deposit in full, by the fifth (5th) Day of each month, all Pari-Mutuel
9 Revenues received during the prior month in a bank account in the
10 name of the Guam Community College in which *only* an official of GCC,
11 as designated by resolution of its Board of Trustees, has the right to
12 withdraw such funds.

13 Pari-Mutuel Fund Revenues shall *not* be subject to the Bureau of
14 Budget and Management Research allotment process. No allotment
15 shall be required for disbursement of the funds to GCC authorized by
16 this Subsection. GCC shall, on a quarterly basis, transmit a written
17 report to *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*
18 outlining the funds received and expended as provided in this Section.

19 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, funds appropriated
20 and available to GCC for Fiscal Year 2000 under §4(c) of Chapter III of
21 Public Law Number 25-72, as repealed and reenacted by Public Law
22 Number 25-98, are available to GCC for Fiscal Year 2001 operations.

23 **(d) GCC Manpower Development Fund Appropriation.**

24 The seventy percent (70%) continuing appropriation from the
25 Manpower Development Fund to the Guam Community College

1 ("GCC") authorized by Public Law Number 25-123 shall be promptly
2 disbursed to GCC on a quarterly basis within each fiscal year.

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, funds appropriated
4 and available to GCC for Fiscal Year 2000 under §4(d) of Chapter III of
5 Public Law Number 25-72, as repealed and reenacted by Public Law
6 Number 25-98, are available to GCC for Fiscal Year 2001 operations.

7 **Section 4. Appropriation to UOG WERI's GHS.** There is hereby
8 appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam ("UOG") to
9 fund the Water and Environmental Research Institute of the Western Pacific
10 ("WERI") the sum of Two Hundred Twenty-four Thousand Two Hundred
11 Dollars (\$224,200.00) for the sole purpose of funding the Guam Hydrologic
12 Survey ("GHS"). WERI shall continue to administer the GHS for the same
13 purposes that have previously been established by the laws of Guam. Such
14 funds may *not* be transferred or used for any other purpose.

15 **Section 5. Appropriation to UOG WERI's the Comprehensive Water**
16 **Resource Monitoring Program.** There is hereby appropriated from the
17 General Fund to the University of Guam to fund the Water and
18 Environmental Research Institute of the Western Pacific ("WERI") the sum of
19 One Hundred Seventy-three Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-eight Dollars
20 (\$173,948.00) for the sole purpose of funding the Comprehensive Water
21 Resource Monitoring Program. Said funds shall be used to match the Federal
22 funding for said program. WERI shall continue to administer the
23 Comprehensive Water Resource Monitoring Program for the same purposes
24 that have previously been established by the laws of Guam. Such funds may
25 *not* be transferred or used for any other purpose.

1 **Section 6. Appropriation to DOE for Stipends and Accreditation**
2 **Costs.** The sum of One Hundred Forty-four Thousand Nine Hundred
3 Fifty-seven Dollars (\$144,957.00) is hereby appropriated from the General
4 Fund to the Department of Education for academic coaches' stipends for team
5 competitions and accreditation costs.

6 **Section 7. Appropriation to DOE for Summer School.** There is
7 hereby appropriated such sums as are necessary from the Summer School
8 Fund established pursuant to §6118 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated
9 to the Department of Education to fund the operations of the 2001 Summer
10 School Program.

11 **Section 8. Appropriation to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.**

12 **(a) Appropriation.** The sum of Seven Million Six Hundred
13 Twenty-four Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-two Dollars (\$7,624,272)
14 is appropriated from the General Fund for the operations of *I*
15 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* for Fiscal Year 2001.

16 **(b)** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, *no less than*
17 one-quarter of the appropriation in Subsection (a) of this Section shall be
18 transmitted to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* on the first day of each quarter of
19 the Fiscal Year.

20 **Section 9. Appropriation to DOE for Substitute Teachers.** The sum
21 of Nine Hundred Eighty-three Thousand One Hundred Ninety Dollars
22 (\$983,190.00) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for Fiscal Year
23 2001 to the Department of Education for the employment of substitute
24 teachers.

1 **Section 10. Appropriation to DOE for Non-Personnel Operating**
2 **Expenses.** All monies collected by the Department of Education from the
3 school lunch program, lost textbooks and Federal funds paid to the
4 government of Guam for reimbursement under the National School Lunch
5 and Breakfast Program are hereby appropriated to the Department of
6 Education for non-personnel operating expenses.

7 **Section 11. Appropriation to DOA for Government Claims Fund.**
8 Two Hundred Eighty-nine Thousand Nine Hundred Fourteen Dollars
9 (\$289,914.00) is appropriated from the General Fund for Fiscal Year 2001 to the
10 Government Claims Fund under the Department of Administration for the
11 payment of eligible and approved Government Claims.

12 **Section 12. Appropriation to DOA's DAWR.** Twenty-seven
13 Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-three Dollars (\$27,783.00) is hereby
14 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture's
15 Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources ("DAWR") for the following
16 purposes:

18 Supplies and Materials \$1,000.00

19 (2) **Conservation of Wildlife (Law Enforcement) Program:**

20 Contractual \$9,000.00

21 Supplies and Materials \$9,033.00

22 Equipment \$8,750.00

23 **Section 13. Appropriation to the Guam Environmental**
24 **Protection Agency for Program Funding.** Two Hundred Eighty-five

1 Thousand Five Hundred Twenty-three Dollars (\$285,523.00) is appropriated
2 from the General Fund to the Guam Environmental Protection Agency for
3 Fiscal Year 2001 *solely* for the hiring of additional personnel in the following
4 Agency programs:

5	(1) Water Resources Management Program	\$82,238.00
6	(2) Water Pollution Control Program	\$85,527.00
7	(3) Solid Waste Management Program	\$71,040.00
8	(4) Hazardous Waste Management Program	\$46,718.00

9 Such funds may *not* be transferred or used for any other purpose.

10 **Section 14. Appropriation to the Guam Environmental**
11 **Protection Agency for Training.** Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00)
12 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Environmental Protection
13 Agency ("GEPA") for Fiscal Year 2001 for GEPA personnel training. Such
14 funds may *not* be transferred or used for any other purpose.

15 **Section 15. Appropriation to Council of the Arts and Humanities**
16 **Agency.** One Hundred Five Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-six Dollars
17 (\$105,966.00) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Council of the Arts
18 and Humanities Agency to pay the stipends of the Guam Territorial Band
19 Society. This appropriation shall *not* be subject to *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan's*
20 transfer authority.

21 **Section 16. Appropriation to Office of *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*.**
22 Five Million Five Hundred Twenty Thousand One Hundred Dollars
23 (\$5,520,100) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of *I*
24 *Maga'lahaen Guåhan* for salaries and operation expenses for Fiscal Year 2001.

1 **Section 17. Appropriation to the Department of Youth Affairs**
2 **for Sanctuary, Inc.** Three Hundred Eighty-six Thousand Five Hundred
3 Fifty-two Dollars (\$386,552.00) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
4 Department of Youth Affairs (“DYA”) for Sanctuary, Inc. for their Fiscal Year
5 2001 operations. DYA shall make a report of the expenditures of the funds of
6 this appropriation to *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* within
7 sixty (60) days following the end of the fiscal year covered herein.

8 **Section 18. Appropriation to DPW Solid Waste Division.**
9 Such sums as are necessary are hereby appropriated from the Solid Waste
10 Operations Fund established by §51118 of Title 10 of the Guam Code
11 Annotated to the Solid Waste Division of the Department of Public Works for
12 the operations of the Solid Waste Division. The Director of the Department of
13 Public Works shall submit a detailed report outlining all collections and
14 expenditures of the Solid Waste Operations Fund. The report shall be
15 submitted to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* on a quarterly basis.

16 **Section 19. Appropriation to DOA for the Residential Treatment**
17 **Fund.** One Million Seven Hundred Two Thousand Nine Hundred
18 Thirty-two Dollars (\$1,702,932) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
19 Department of Administration (“DOA”) to pay authorized expenses for
20 persons under the jurisdiction of the Superior Court of Guam for residential
21 care arising from physical, mental or emotional handicaps, or from severe
22 emotional disturbances. All patients and escorts referred off-Guam shall
23 submit to the Director of DOA supporting documents to justify
24 reimbursement of their travel expenses.

1 **Section 20. Village Mayors Appropriation. (a) Legislative**

2 **Findings and Intent.** The Mayors are elected by the people of the
3 different municipalities of Guam. They are expected by the people to
4 provide a myriad of services, yet are *not* given adequate resources to
5 provide the services and have to depend upon the cumbersome
6 bureaucratic process, often resulting in an inordinate delay in getting
7 needed projects done. As elected officials and as direct representatives
8 of the people, it is incumbent that they be provided with sufficient
9 resources to provide the services needed in their respective villages
10 without having to depend on the good graces of legislators, the
11 Administration or different government agencies. This Act is intended
12 to provide the Mayors more autonomy in order to carry out their
13 responsibilities to the people of Guam.

14 **(b) Village Streets Fund Change.** Section 1504(k) of Article
15 5, Chapter 1, Division 1 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby
16 *repealed and reenacted* to read as follows:

17 **“(k) Village Streets Fund.**

18 (1) There is hereby created, separate and apart from
19 other funds of the government of Guam, a fund known as
20 the Village Streets Fund (‘VSF’). The VSF shall be used
21 exclusively for the purposes of payment to vendors for
22 village road planning, design, construction, reconstruction,
23 improvement, repair and maintenance services, supplies and
24 equipment to be used for road repair and maintenance, the
25 acquisition of rights of way, or to service debt payments of

1 revenue bonds which may be issued to fund the
2 construction, repair and maintenance of secondary and
3 tertiary roads. All roads defined as 'major arterial,' 'minor
4 arterial' and 'major collector,' as defined in the Highway
5 System Classification Map of Guam, shall continue to be
6 maintained by the Department of Public Works and are
7 excluded from the proceeds of the VSF.

8 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
9 fifty percent (50%) of all monies in the Surplus Fund of the
10 Limited Obligation Highway Bonds, Series 1992 A Debt
11 Service Fund on the fifth day of each month shall be paid by
12 the depository to the VSF. The VSF shall be under the
13 control of the Mayors' Council of Guam and exempted from
14 Bureau of Budget and Management Research control.
15 Accounting procedures for the funds shall be prescribed by
16 the Mayors' Council of Guam.

17 (3) For Fiscal Year 2001 *only*, the sum of One Million
18 Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,800,000) is hereby
19 appropriated from the un-appropriated surplus of the VSF
20 to the Village Mayors to be divided among the Mayors as
21 prescribed in Subsections (4)(a) and (4)(b) of this Subsection
22 for the purposes described in Subsection 1 of this Subsection.

23 (4) Beginning with Fiscal Year 2002, the monies
24 deposited in the VSF shall be expended by Village Mayors
25 for the purposes prescribed under Subsection 1504(k)(1) of

1 this Chapter. The VSF shall be divided among the Village
2 Mayors as follows:

3 (a) each village mayor shall be allocated the
4 sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00); and

5 (b) the remaining un-appropriated balance of
6 the VSF shall be distributed on a *pro rata* basis. The
7 *prorated* distribution per Village shall be based on the
8 total local road mileage in each Village over the total
9 local road mileage as contained in the 1998 Local Road
10 Inventory by the Department of Public Works. The
11 1998 Total Local Road Inventory is hereby appended
12 to this Act as "**Attachment E.**"

13 (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, *I*
14 *Maga'lahaen Guåhan* may *not* use his transfer authority to
15 utilize any monies deposited in the VSF.

16 (6) Notwithstanding the general provisions of
17 §22406 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, which
18 requires that unused and de-appropriated funds revert to
19 the General Fund, or any other provision of Guam law to the
20 contrary, unused funds in the VSF and funds allocated to
21 each Mayor shall be carried over into the next fiscal year.

22 (7) The Mayors' Council of Guam shall require that
23 an audit of the VSF is conducted each fiscal year by the
24 Public Auditor, and a copy of the report shall be transmitted
25 to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan.*"

1 **Section 21. Miscellaneous Mayoral Appropriations.**

2 **(a) Appropriation to the Mayors' Council.** Six Million
3 Three Hundred Nineteen Thousand Three Hundred Forty-nine Dollars
4 (\$6,319,349) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Mayors'
5 Council for their personnel and operating expenses for Fiscal Year 2001.

6 **(b) Appropriation for Operation of Village Gymnasiums.**
7 Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) is appropriated
8 from the General Fund to the following Villages for the operating
9 expenses for their respective gymnasiums:

10	Agat	\$90,000.00
11	Talofofo	\$90,000.00
12	Astumbo Dededo	\$90,000.00
13	Yigo	\$90,000.00
14	Yona	\$90,000.00

15 **(c) Exemption from BBMR Control.** The budget of the
16 Mayors' Council is *not* subject to the allotment process or control of the
17 Bureau of Budget and Management Research, or its successor agency;
18 nor shall *I Maga'lahaen Guahan* impound or transfer funds appropriated
19 to the Mayors' Council. The Mayors' Council shall receive from the
20 Department of Administration, or its successor agency, an amount
21 totaling *no less than* one-twelfth (1/12th) of the balance of the
22 appropriation on the first of every month of the fiscal year *until* such
23 appropriation has been exhausted. On a month where *more than* two (2)
24 pay periods occur, the Department of Administration shall release such

1 funds required for the purpose of meeting the operational needs of the
2 Mayors' Council for that month; *provided*, a sufficient balance of the
3 appropriation remains.

4 (d) **Mayors' Council Fund.** There is created a Mayors'
5 Council Operations Fund. The annual budget of the Mayors' Council
6 shall be deposited in the Mayors' Council Operations Fund.

7 (e) **Annual Review.** The Mayors' Council shall continue
8 to submit its annual budget to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for review on the
9 30th day of March of each year.

10 (f) **Lapses.** Lapses in the Mayors' Council annual budget
11 shall *not* revert back to the General Fund, but shall be carried over into
12 the next fiscal year.

13 **Section 22. Appropriation to Guam Little League Baseball, Inc.**

14 The sum of Twenty Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$20,500.00) is hereby
15 appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Guam Little League
16 Baseball, Inc. to cover expenses incurred during the Guam hosting of the Little
17 League Baseball Far East Tournament held during the month of July, 2000.
18 The funds appropriated herein shall *not* be used for any other purpose, and
19 that any remaining balance from this appropriation shall revert back to the
20 Fund.

21 **Section 23. Appropriation to Guam Visitors Bureau for**
22 **Operations.** Fourteen Million Four Hundred Seventy-eight Thousand
23 Three Hundred Twenty-four Dollars (\$14,478,324) is appropriated from the

1 Tourist Attraction Fund to the Guam Visitors Bureau for Fiscal Year 2001 for
2 the following:

3 (a) One Million Three Hundred Seventy-seven Thousand One
4 Hundred Eighty-six Dollars (\$1,377,186) is appropriated for salaries and
5 benefits for the period beginning October 1, 2000 and ending September
6 30, 2001; *and*

7 (b) Thirteen Million One Hundred One Thousand One Hundred
8 Thirty-eight Dollars (\$13,101,138) for contractual services, which shall be
9 expended pursuant to the Budget Digest provided in "**Attachment**
10 **D**" of this Act; Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for warehouse
11 storage space; Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for supplies and
12 materials; Forty-six Thousand Dollars (\$46,000.00) for miscellaneous;
13 One Hundred Twenty-nine Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty Dollars
14 (\$129,720.00) for utilities; and Twenty-five Thousand Dollars
15 (\$25,000.00) for capital outlay.

16 **Section 24. Appropriation to GVB for Visitor-Related Projects.**

17 One Million Forty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$1,049,000) is appropriated from
18 the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Guam Visitors Bureau ("GVB") for the
19 following visitor industry-related projects for Fiscal Year 2001 *only*:

20 (a) Four Hundred Sixty-three Thousand Dollars (\$463,000.00)
21 for Tumon and Hagatna beach cleaning and maintenance;

22 (b) One Hundred Fifty-six Thousand Dollars (\$156,000.00) for
23 Tumon landscaping maintenance;

24 (c) Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for the Two Lovers'
25 Point jogging/biking trail;

- 1 (d) Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for Donations for Work;
- 2 (e) Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for Tumon Beach
3 beautification - Phase 4;
- 4 (f) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for
5 Tournament of Champion Matching Funds;
- 6 (g) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for the Guam
7 Micronesian Island Fair;
- 8 (h) Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for Guam Tropical
9 Fantasy Fireworks;
- 10 (j) Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for the 58th Asia
11 Pacific Council of American Chambers of Commerce ("APCAC"); *and*
- 12 (k) Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for the Guam Village
13 Beautification Grant Program.

14 This appropriation shall be kept in a separate account and *not* combined
15 with the Bureau's administration account. The funds appropriated shall be
16 used *specifically* for the projects outlined therein. A quarterly report shall be
17 prepared and submitted *not later than* fifteen (15) days following the end of the
18 quarter, by GVB to the Bureau of Budget Management and Research, to the
19 Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and to the Legislative Standing Committee
20 with oversight over GVB.

21 **Section 25. Appropriation for RFK Library for Compliance With**
22 **Accreditation Requirements.** The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand
23 Dollars (\$250,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund from
24 FY2000 revenues to the University of Guam's RFK Library for acquisitions for
25 compliance with accreditation requirements. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty

1 Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund
2 from FY2001 revenues to the University of Guam's RFK Library for
3 acquisitions for compliance with accreditation requirements.

4 **Section 26. DOE Textbook Appropriation.** The sum of Three
5 Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,200,000) is hereby appropriated
6 from the General Fund from FY2002 revenues to Department of Education for
7 the purchase of textbooks.

8 **Section 27. Private School Textbook Appropriations.** The sum
9 of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00) is hereby appropriated
10 from the General Fund from FY2002 revenues to Department of
11 Administration for purchase of textbooks for students of private schools.

12 **Section 28. UOG Accreditation Authorization for Appropriation.**
13 *Subject to the availability of funds, the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars*
14 *(\$500,000.00) is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the General Fund to*
15 *the University of Guam's RFK Library for acquisitions for compliance with*
16 *accreditation requirements.*

17 **Section 29. UOG 10th Pacific Science Inter-Congress**
18 **Authorization for Appropriation.** *Subject to the availability of funds, the*
19 *sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) is hereby authorized to be*
20 *appropriated from the General Fund to University of Guam for hosting the*
21 *10th Pacific Science Inter-Congress.*

22 **Section 30. Authorization to appropriate to the Department of**
23 **Revenue and Taxation.** *Subject to the availability of funds, there is hereby*
24 *authorized to be appropriated the sum of One Million Six Hundred Ninety-six*

1 Thousand One Hundred Forty-three Dollars (\$1,696,143) from the license, fees
2 and permits revenues to the Department of Revenue and Taxation
3 (“Department”) in Fiscal Year 2001 for the following purposes:

4 (1) The sum of Eight Hundred Six Thousand One Hundred
5 Twenty-two Dollars (\$806,122.00) to recruit positions in the Taxpayer
6 Service, Regulatory and Collections Division in Fiscal Year 2001.

7 (a) The Department shall submit a proposed staffing
8 pattern along with justification for each position to be recruited by
9 October 31, 2000 to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

10 (2) The sum of Eight Hundred Ninety Thousand Twenty
11 Dollars (\$890,020.00) for operating expense requirements to facilitate the
12 upgrading and/or purchase of computer software and hardware
13 directly related to the audit and collections processes of the Department.

14 (a) The Department shall submit a detailed budget for
15 these proposed expenditures by October 31, 2000 to *I Liheslaturan*
16 *Guåhan*.

17 **Section 31. Appropriation for Travel for Off-Guam Justices for**
18 **Supreme Court.** The sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) is
19 appropriated from the General Fund to the Supreme Court of Guam for the
20 exclusive purpose of travel expenditures to bring designated Justices to Guam
21 from off-Guam locations.

22 **Section 32. DOE Operations Authorization for Appropriation.**
23 *Subject to the availability of funds, the sum of Three Million Five Hundred*
24 *Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000) is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the*
25 *General Fund to the Department of Education operations.*

1 **Section 33. GCC Authorization for Appropriation. Subject**
2 *to the availability of funds, the sum of Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars*
3 *(\$900,000.00) is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the General Fund*
4 *to the Guam Community College.*

5 **Section 34. UOG Authorization for Appropriation. Subject**
6 *to the availability of funds, the sum of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) is*
7 *hereby authorized to be appropriated from the General Fund to the University*
8 *of Guam.*

9 **Section 35. Appropriation for Inarajan Mayor's Rent. Thirty-**
10 *two Thousand Dollars (\$32,000.00) is appropriated from the General Fund to*
11 *the Inarajan Mayor to pay for the rental of office space for the Inarajan Mayor.*
12 *Any unused portions of this appropriation shall revert to the General Fund.*
13

1 **CHAPTER IV.**

2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.**

3 **Section 1. Transfer of Employees.** Notwithstanding any other
4 provision of law, and recognizing that the provisions of this Act may cause
5 shortages of personnel in certain areas of the government, and in order to
6 facilitate the reorganization of the government, and for the purpose of
7 ensuring that the minimum number of new employees shall be required for
8 the operation of the government, *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* is authorized to transfer
9 employees within or between any department or agency of the government of
10 Guam, *except* that:

11 (a) the provisions of this Section shall *not* apply to any
12 employee of the Legislative or Judicial Branches of the government, and
13 the transfer of any employee shall *not* result in a loss of pay or salary;
14 *and*

15 (b) the transfer of any employee pursuant to this Section shall be
16 accompanied with the authorized funding for the transferred
17 employee's position, which was made to the department or agency they
18 are being transferred from, pursuant to any personnel funding
19 authorized by this Act. Any transfer *not* in conformance with this
20 Section shall be considered null and void on the effective date of this
21 Act. Any compensation due to an employee transferred under the
22 provisions of this Section and for whom no accompanying transfer of
23 funding has been made, shall be charged to the department or agency of
24 origin by the Department of Administration. No certifying officer of the
25 government shall certify that funds are available to pay for the

1 compensation of a transferred employee, *unless* certain that funds and
2 budgetary authority have been transferred for that employee as detailed
3 in this Section.

4 No transfer of an employee shall occur from an autonomous
5 agency of the government of Guam to a line department of the
6 government of Guam, or any agency or department of the government
7 of Guam whose funding is appropriated, in part or whole, from the
8 General Fund. It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that in every
9 circumstance, a transfer of personnel from an appropriate agency shall
10 be the *first* alternative exercised in such circumstances where it has been
11 determined by *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* that a need for personnel in an area
12 of the government exists.

13 **Section 2. Moratorium on Limited Term Appointments.**

14 Notwithstanding the provisions of §4103 of Title 4 of the Guam Code
15 Annotated, or any other provision of law, no person may be employed on a
16 temporary or limited term basis by any instrumentality of the government of
17 Guam during this Fiscal Year, *except* for the following:

- 18 (1) attorneys at the Department of Law;
19 (2) nurses and doctors;
20 (3) persons employed one hundred percent (100%) by Federal
21 funds;
22 (4) temporary survey workers employed by the Department of
23 Labor for the purpose of conducting employment surveys; *and*
24 (5) licensed health care professional ancillary service personnel
25 employed at the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Department of

1 Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the Department of Public
2 Health and Social Services.

3 In any case, no person employed on the basis of these exceptions can be
4 employed for a period of *more than ninety (90) days, subject to no more than two*
5 *(2) renewals. No more than seven (7) days after the hiring of any individual*
6 *subject to the exceptions contained in this Section, the head of the government*
7 *instrumentality where such hiring has occurred shall report in writing such*
8 *hiring to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan.*

9 **Section 3. Reporting Requirements; Expenditures and Staffing**
10 **Patterns.** Beginning October 1, 2000 and continuing on the first of each
11 month thereafter, each agency or department head in the Executive Branch of
12 the government of Guam, the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Guam,
13 the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam and the Chairman of the
14 Board of Trustees of the Public Defender Service Corporation shall submit to
15 the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a monthly report in writing detailing the
16 full and complete staffing pattern for their respective instrumentality. Such
17 staffing pattern shall include *at a minimum* the name, position, salary and
18 benefits for each person employed, as well as the funding source for the salary
19 and benefits of all employees. In a separate section of the report, the head of
20 the reporting instrumentality shall detail any changes from the prior month's
21 report, in either the number of personnel contained in the staffing pattern or
22 levels of compensation for persons contained in the staffing pattern.

23 Thirty (30) days after the end of each quarter of Fiscal Year 2001, each
24 agency or department head in the Executive Branch of the government of
25 Guam, the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Guam, the Chief Justice of

1 the Supreme Court of Guam and the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the
2 Public Defender Service Corporation shall submit to the Speaker of I
3 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* a monthly report in writing detailing the full and
4 complete expenditures for their respective instrumentality for the preceding
5 quarter, inclusive of sources of funding for such expenditures.

6 **Section 4. Outsourcing Directive.** Each head of every department
7 or agency in the Executive Branch of the government of Guam, the Presiding
8 Judge of the Superior Court of Guam and the Chief Justice of the Supreme
9 Court of Guam shall submit a report to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and the Speaker
10 of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, no less than ninety (90) days from the effective date of
11 this Act, that details specific areas of service within the purview of their
12 respective instrumentalities that may be outsourced to private contractors or
13 to non-government entities, thus relieving the government of requirements to
14 hire additional personnel in those specific service areas. Such report shall
15 detail specifically what service areas the reporting head wishes to outsource;
16 what personnel requirements would be supplanted as a result; what the
17 estimated cost of such proposals would be, contrasted to the cost of providing
18 such service in-house; and what impacts upon service, *if any*, would be
19 anticipated as a result of such action.

20

1 **CHAPTER V.**

2 **ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.**

3 **Section 1. Appropriations from Guam Contractors License Board**
4 **Fund and Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors Board**
5 **Fund to Revert to the General Fund for Fiscal Year 2000.** At the end of
6 Fiscal Year 2000, any un-appropriated balances from the Guam Contractors
7 License Board Fund and the Professional Engineers, Architects and Land
8 Surveyors Board Fund shall revert to the General Fund.

9 **Section 2. Reversion to General Fund and Tourist Attraction Funds.**

10 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, *unless* otherwise specified in this
11 Act or subsequent legislation:

12 **(a) General Fund, Reversion.** All unexpended or
13 unencumbered appropriations made from the General Fund pursuant to
14 this Act for Fiscal Year 2000 shall *revert* to the General Fund on the last
15 day of that fiscal year; *and*

16 **(b) Tourist Attraction Fund, Reversion.** All unexpended or
17 unencumbered appropriations made in this Act for Fiscal Year 2000
18 from the Tourist Attraction Fund shall revert to the Tourist Attraction
19 Fund on the last day of that fiscal year.

20 **Section 3. Carryover of Local and Federal Matching Program Fund.**

21 The local and Federal Matching Funds for programs whose expiration dates
22 extend beyond September 30, 2000 are hereby authorized to be carried over
23 and expended through the period of the grant award.

24 **Section 4. Authorization to Expend Federal Funds.**

1 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Departments are authorized to
2 expend funds appropriated in this Act for matching requirements of new
3 Federal programs.

4 **Section 5. Medically Indigent Program Funds.** All appropriations
5 made to the Medically Indigent Program of the Department of Public Health
6 and Social Services shall remain available until expended.

7 **Section 6. Special Fund Transfer.** Notwithstanding any other
8 provision of law, *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* is authorized to transfer to the General
9 Fund from any Special Fund, Trust Fund and Revolving Fund to supplement
10 the cash obligations of the General Fund, *except* that such authority shall *not*
11 extend to any of the following:

12 (a) funds under the purview and administered by *I Liheslaturan*
13 *Guåhan*, the Superior Court of Guam, the Supreme Court of Guam or the
14 Public Defender Service Corporation; *and*

15 (b) the Tourist Attraction Fund; the Custom Application of
16 Pesticides Fund; the Water Research and Development Fund; the Solid
17 Waste Management Fund; the Litter Control Revolving Fund; the Guam
18 Environmental Trust Fund; the Air Pollution Control Special Fund; the
19 Hazardous Substances Emergency Response and Remedial Action
20 Fund; the Guam Wildlife Conservation Fund; the Guam Highway Fund;
21 the Village Streets Fund; the Pari-Mutuel Fund; the Manpower
22 Development Fund; the School Operations Fund; the Territorial
23 Education Facilities Fund; the Junior Reserve Officers Training Corp
24 Fund; the Summer School Fund; the Dededo Buffer Strip Revolving
25 Fund; the Student Activity Funds in the Department of Education; the

1 Land Survey Revolving Fund; the Chamorro Land Trust Fund; the *Tiyan*
2 Fund; the *Komitea Para Tiyan* Fund; the Solid Waste Operations Fund;
3 the Department of Corrections Revolving Fund; the Housing Revolving
4 Fund; the Customs, Agriculture and Quarantine Inspection Services
5 Fund; the Utility Bank Fund; the Medically Indigent Program Payment
6 Revolving Fund; the Workers Compensation Fund; the Residential
7 Treatment Fund; the Mayors' Council of Guam Operations Fund; and
8 the Dormant Bank Account Fund.

9 **Section 7. Prohibition Against Payment for Cellular Phone Services**

10 **With Government Funds.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and
11 upon the effective date of this Act, no government of Guam funds shall be
12 expended for the purpose of cellular telephones, cellular telephone service or
13 cellular telephone air time. This Section shall apply to the expenditure of any
14 or all government of Guam funds, regardless of source and inclusive of all
15 funds utilized by autonomous agencies. This Section shall *not* apply to *I*
16 *Maga'lahaen Guåhan, I Segundo Maga'lahaen Guåhan*, the Chief Justice of the
17 Guam Supreme Court and the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of
18 Guam.

19 **Section 8. Prohibition Against the Lease and Use of Government**
20 **Vehicles by Directors and Deputy Directors of the Government of Guam.**

21 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and upon the effective date of
22 this Act, no government of Guam funds shall be expended for the lease of any
23 vehicle which purpose is the transportation of any Director or Deputy
24 Director, regardless of specific title or designation, of any agency, department,
25 autonomous agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam. This

1 Section shall *not* apply to *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan, I Segundo Maga'lahaen Guåhan,*
2 the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan,* the Chief Justice of the Guam Supreme
3 Court and the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Guam.

4 This Section shall apply to the expenditure of any or all government of
5 Guam funds, regardless of source and inclusive of all funds utilized by
6 autonomous agencies.

7 **Section 9. Prohibition Against the Use of Twenty-four Hour**
8 **Vehicles.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and upon the
9 effective date of this Act, no government vehicle shall be used by any
10 government employee, contract employee or other person, *except* during such
11 time that the person is on official duty. This Section shall *not* apply to *I*
12 *Maga'lahaen Guåhan, I Segundo Maga'lahaen Guåhan,* the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan*
13 *Guåhan,* the Chief Justice of the Guam Supreme Court and the Presiding Judge
14 of the Superior Court of Guam.

15 **Section 10. Solid Waste Operations Fund.** Notwithstanding
16 any other provision of law, any allocations and expenditures of Funds from
17 the Solid Waste Operations Fund shall be *subject to* approval and
18 appropriation by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan.*

19 **Section 11. Authorization for the Department of Education to**
20 **Use Funds Appropriated in FY2000 in FY2001.** The Department of
21 Education is hereby authorized to use all funds appropriated to the
22 Department of Education for and during Fiscal Year 2000 in Fiscal Year 2001.
23 Such carry-over shall be used only for teacher salaries and benefits. The
24 Director of Education shall, *no later than* thirty (30) days following the

1 enactment hereof, submit to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a full
2 disclosure of all funds actually received by the Department of Education from
3 all FY2000 appropriation sources. The Director of Education shall, *no later*
4 *than* thirty (30) days following the enactment hereof, submit to the Speaker of
5 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a full disclosure of all funds spent by the Department of
6 Education from all FY2000 appropriations.

7 **Section 12. Drug Treatment and Enforcement Fund.** Section
8 67.414.1 of Article 4, Chapter 67 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated is
9 hereby *repealed and reenacted* to read as follows:

10 **"Section 67.414.1.** All fines collected by the Superior Court of
11 Guam for violation of this Act shall be placed in a special fund
12 maintained by the Superior Court of Guam for the sole use by Superior
13 Court of Guam. Said fund shall be maintained separately by the
14 Superior Court of Guam from the General Fund to be called the '*Drug*
15 *Treatment and Enforcement Fund.*' Funds so placed shall be used
16 *exclusively* for the support of drug treatment, education and enforcement
17 efforts."

18 **Section 13. Volunteer Deputy Marshal Reserve Program.** Section
19 8114 is hereby *added* to Chapter 8, Division 1 of Title 7 of the Guam Code
20 Annotated to read as follows:

21 **"Section 8114. Volunteer Deputy Marshal Reserve Program.**
22 There is hereby established within the government of Guam, under the
23 auspices of the Superior Court of Guam, a Volunteer Deputy Marshal
24 Reserve Program. Volunteers shall *not* be considered full-time

1 employees of the government of Guam, and shall *not* be entitled to
2 receive employee benefits or government of Guam retirement.
3 Volunteers shall be paid on a stipend basis. The Judicial Council of the
4 Superior Court of Guam shall establish rules and regulations for the
5 implementation of the Program, which rules and regulations shall be
6 effective upon promulgation by the Council.”

7 **Section 14. Volunteer Deputy Marshal Reserve Program.**

8 Section 8114.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 8, Division 1 of Title 7 of the Guam
9 Code Annotated to read as follows:

10 **“Section 8114.1. Eligibility and Recruitment.** A volunteer
11 must be qualified as a Superior Court of Guam Deputy Marshal, and
12 have graduated from *either* the Guam Police Academy, the Basic Law
13 Enforcement Academy or a qualified law enforcement academic
14 program within Guam.

15 Volunteers shall be recruited from within this qualified category of
16 eligible candidates. No full-time employee of the government of Guam
17 shall be eligible for the Program.”

18 **Section 15. Volunteer Deputy Marshal Reserve Program.**

19 Section 8114.2 is hereby *added* to Chapter 8, Division 1 of Title 7 of the Guam
20 Code Annotated to read as follows:

21 **“Section 8114.2. Duties.** Volunteers shall provide additional
22 manpower to the Superior Court of Guam Marshal Division. The
23 Judicial Council of the Superior Court of Guam shall promulgate rules
24 and regulations governing the scope of duties, functions and limitations

1 of the Program to include, but *not* be limited to, security for patrons,
2 judges, jurors, inmates, witnesses and court property; serving court
3 documents, subpoenas and civil warrants; executing levies and
4 evictions; and such other duties as are authorized by law to the Superior
5 Court of Guam Marshal Division. Volunteers shall also be authorized to
6 assist in times of Guam emergencies."

7 **Section 16. Volunteer Deputy Marshal Reserve Program.**

8 Section 8114.3 is hereby *added* to Chapter 8, Division 1 of Title 7 of the Guam
9 Code Annotated to read as follows:

10 "Section 8114.3. Stipends. Volunteers shall be compensated
11 under stipend for a *minimum* of forty-two (42) hours or more per month.
12 The Judicial Council of the Superior Court of Guam shall establish the
13 maximum allowance per month for a volunteer under the Program.
14 Volunteers must perform a *minimum* of forty-two (42) hours a month to
15 be eligible for compensation."

16 **Section 17. Annual Leave.** Section 4109(c) of Article 1, Chapter 4
17 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

18 "(c) Employees entitled to annual leave hereunder may
19 accumulate *up to* four hundred eighty (480) hours. Any annual leave
20 earned by eligible employees in excess of four hundred eighty (480)
21 hours shall be *automatically* credited to such employee's accumulated
22 sick leave; *provided*, that *no more than* one hundred (100) hours shall be
23 credited to said sick leave at the end of each fiscal year. The

1 determination of accumulation of annual leave, and crediting of excess
2 hours to sick leave, shall be done at the end of each fiscal year."

3 **Section 18. Annual Leave.** Section 4109(d) of Article 1, Chapter 4
4 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

5 "(d) Departments defined by §4105 of Title 4 of the Guam Code
6 Annotated, by appropriate personnel rules and regulations, may
7 authorize accumulation and carry over of annual leave in excess of four
8 hundred eighty (480) hours at the end of each fiscal year *up to a*
9 maximum of seven hundred twenty (720) hours."

10 **Section 19. Carry Forward of Prior Year Lapses for the**
11 **Department of Public Health and Social Services.** Any lapses from the
12 appropriations made to the Department of Public Health and Social Services
13 for the Personnel Object Category in Fiscal Year 2000 shall continue to be
14 available until fully expended during Fiscal Year 2001, *subject to the*
15 provisions herein.

16 Lapsed funds shall be used to pay the personnel expenses that arise
17 from the hiring of personnel *only* for certified registered or licensed health
18 care professional positions, or for administrative or clerical positions
19 responsible for administering, processing, or supporting the Medically
20 Indigent Program, the Food Stamp Program, or the Medicaid, TANF or Public
21 Assistance Programs.

22 **Section 20. Carry Forward of Prior Year Lapses for the**
23 **Commission on Decolonization and Task Forces.** Any lapses from the
24 appropriations made in Fiscal Year 2000 to the Commission on

1 Decolonization, the Task Force on Independence, the Task Force on Statehood
2 or the Task Force on Free Association, shall continue to be available to those
3 respective entities until fully expended during Fiscal Year 2001. Any funds
4 encumbered, but *not* expended, of the funds appropriated in Fiscal Year 2000
5 to the Commission on Decolonization, the Task Force on Independence, the
6 Task Force on Statehood or the Task Force on Free Association shall continue
7 to be available to be expended in Fiscal Year 2001.

8 **Section 21. Medically Indigent Program Payment Revolving**
9 **Fund.** From the funds appropriated by this Act from the General Fund
10 for the Department of Public Health and Social Services Miscellaneous Object
11 Category, the amount of Twenty-four Million Dollars (\$24,000,000) shall be
12 deposited into the Medically Indigent Program Payment Revolving Fund
13 ("MIPPR Fund"). The MIPPR Fund shall be maintained separate and apart
14 from all other funds allocated to the Department of Public Health and Social
15 Services. Payments from the MIPPR Fund shall be authorized by the Director
16 and credited against the MIPPR Fund. Appropriations to the MIPPR Fund are
17 hereby authorized to be carried over into subsequent fiscal years and may be
18 expended for any authorized Medically Indigent Program obligation,
19 regardless of when the obligation was incurred.

20 Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, all approved
21 claims for Program services incurred *prior to* the close of Fiscal Year 2000 shall
22 be eligible for payment from monies appropriated to the Department, or the
23 Fund established by this Section.

24 The MIPPR Fund shall *not* be subject to any transfer authority by *I*
25 *Maga'lahaen Guahan.*

1 dollar amount allocated for the fiscal year for each respective Executive
2 Branch line agency's personnel object category as appropriated by this
3 Act.

4 (b) All subsequent personnel actions executed for each
5 respective Executive Branch line agency during Fiscal Year 2001 shall
6 *not* exceed the dollar amounts appropriated by this Act. Each certifying
7 officer shall certify that the aggregate dollar amount to be encumbered,
8 inclusive of benefits, for each subsequent personnel action is *equal to or*
9 *less than* the total dollar amount appropriated by this Act to the
10 respective agency's personnel object category.

11 **Section 25. Prohibition on New Personal Services Contracts.**

12 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no appropriation made in this
13 Act shall be used to fund any new Personal Services Contracts. The
14 University of Guam and the Guam Community College shall be exempt from
15 the application of this Section.

16 **Section 26. Utility Bank Fund. (a) Creation of Utility Bank**

17 **Fund.** There is hereby created a Special Fund, hereinafter called the
18 "Utility Bank Fund," which shall be kept in an interest bearing account
19 separate and apart from the other accounts of the government of Guam.
20 The funds in the Utility Bank Fund shall be administered by the
21 Department of Administration, and shall be used exclusively for the
22 payments of the government of Guam's utility bills. All interest
23 generated from the Utility Bank Fund shall be used to offset any future
24 rate increase. The Utility Bank Fund is exempted from the transfer

1 authority of *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*. "Utility bills" as used in this Section
2 shall include power, water, sewer and basic telephone service.

3 (b) **Deposits to the Utility Bank Fund.** Notwithstanding
4 any other provision of law, the Treasurer of Guam shall deposit in full,
5 by the fifth (5th) day of each month, one-twelfth (1/12th) of the funds
6 appropriated by this Act from the General Fund for the Utilities Object
7 Category in "**Attachment A**" for Executive Branch departments
8 and agencies into the Utility Bank Fund. Funds appropriated by this
9 Act from the General Fund for the Utilities Object Category for the
10 Superior Court of Guam, the Supreme Court of Guam and the Public
11 Defender Service Corporation shall *not* be deposited into the Utility
12 Bank Fund.

13 After the deposit, the funds shall be disbursed to the respective
14 utility agencies on a *prorated* basis based upon monthly billings. The
15 Department of Administration shall, on a quarterly basis, transmit a
16 written report to *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* and to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan*
17 *Guåhan* outlining the funds received and expended as provided in this
18 Section.

19 **Section 27. No Transfer Authority from the Miscellaneous**
20 **Appropriation to the Department of Public Health and Social Services.**

21 The amounts appropriated to the Miscellaneous Object Category of the
22 Department of Public Health and Social Services by this Act in
23 "**Attachment A**" shall *not* be subject to any transfer authority by *I*
24 *Maga'lahaen Guåhan*.

1 **Section 28.** *I Maga'lahaen Guahan Transfer Authority.* *I*

2 *Maga'lahaen Guahan* is authorized to transfer *not more than* two point five
3 percent (2.5%) in or out of the object categories of the Executive Branch from
4 the amounts appropriated in Fiscal Year 2001 for the object categories as listed
5 in "**Attachment A**" of this Act.

6 *I Maga'lahaen Guahan* shall report to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* within twenty
7 (20) days of the end of each month all transfers pursuant to this Section, and
8 as provided in this Act.

9 **Section 29.** **Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its
10 application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall
11 *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect
12 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of
13 this Act are severable.





MEMO TO FILES

In reference to the attempt of Daniel Perez and Robert Jesus (Clerk's Office staff) to deliver Budget Bill No. 484, the following is a record and sequence of events of the late evening of September 21, 2000 and early morning of September 22, 2000 after the passage of Bill No. 484, by the 25th Guam Legislature.

At 11:50 p.m. on 9/21/00, Mr. Perez telephoned the Government House (#475-9470) to inform the security officer on duty of the pending arrival of Bill 484, so *he/she* could notify the Governor as per standard procedure. The call was not answered after about 5 minutes of letting the phone ring. Tried calling again a few minutes before midnight and all lines now had a busy signal.

At 12:10 a. m. on 9/22/2000, Mr. Perez and Mr. Jesus arrived at Government House in Agana Heights to deliver Bill 484. They knocked on all doors at Gov't House but there was no response although a TV or radio could be heard from outside the side door to the right of the main entrance door.

At around 12:20 a.m., Mr. Jesus called Clerk of the Legislature Brennan-Badley from the phone outside the side garage door to inform of the situation and get further instructions. We were instructed to try to deliver the bill to the Governor's private residence in Agana Hts. We proceeded directly to the Governor's residence but found the front gate closed and no response after sounding the car horn and calling out for about 10 minutes. (Tried on all sides of the residence to get someone to come out to receive said bill, but to no avail).

At 12:30 a.m., we decided to return to our office and on the way tried again to make delivery at Government House but again found no one on duty to receive Bill 484 after knocking on all doors.

Around 12:40 a.m., Mr. Perez and Mr. Jesus returned Budget Bill 484 to the office of the Clerk of the Legislature.


