BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Statement and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 2 recognizes the fact that the Late Honorable Francisco Duenas Perez, served a long and 3 distinguished political career, serving as an Assemblyman and Councilman in the 7th, 4 9th, and 10th Guam Congress, as well as serving as a charter Senator in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd 5 6 and 8th Guam Legislatures. The Late Honorable Francisco Duenas Perez was known for his entrepreneurial successes such as, being the first Chamorro farmer to 7 successfully incubate imported fertilized chicken eggs to sell locally produced eggs to 8 9 stores throughout Guam; was the owner and manager of a commercial poultry farm and piggery; founder of Perez Bros. Inc.; co-founder of the Pacific Construction Company 10 and the Guam Contractors' Association. The Late Honorable Francisco Duenas Perez 11 is considered the "Father" of the Guam Economic Development Authority, by his 12 13 advocacy and support of creating a public corporation to promote and attract new 14 businesses to Guam. Furthermore, the Late Honorable Francisco Perez is credited for developing GEDA's tax incentive programs, now known as the *Qualifying Certificate Program*, one of GEDA's most successful economic development programs. It is the
intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to further recognize the contributions and
accomplishments of this visionary, and in doing so, *I Liheslatura* finds that it is
befitting to rename GEDA's QC Program after the Late Honorable Francisco Duenas
Perez.

Section 2. Renaming of the QC Program. Article 4, Chapter 2, Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby renamed the *Perez Economic Revitalization and Enhancement Zone Act.*

10 Section 3. Implementation of the QC Name Change. Upon the enactment 11 of this Act, it shall be the responsibility of the GEDA Administrator to effectuate the 12 name change authorized herein, and within a reasonable period of time, make the 13 necessary changes to all pertinent QC forms to reflect the name change authorized 14 herein.

COMMITTEE REPORT ON BILL NO. 231,

"An Act to Rename Article 4, Chapter 2, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated the Perez Economic Revitalization and Enhancement Zone Act, in Honor of the Late Honorable Francisco Duenas Perez."

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform, Reorganization and Federal Affairs held a public hearing on Bill 231 on Friday, Sept. 8, 2000 at 10:00 a.m. at the Conference Room, Office of Senator Mark Forbes, I Liheslaturan Guahan. Public notice of the hearing was announced in the Sept. 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 issues of the Pacific Daily News. In addition, the Committee on Tourism, Economic Development, and Parks held a hearing on Bill 231 as it received secondary referral on the bill.

Individuals submitting written testimony (attached) were:

Tom D. Perez, President, Perez Bros. Inc. Ed Untalan, Administrator, Guam Economic Development Authority

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Mr. Tom D. Perez, President of Perez Bros. Inc., submitted written testimony in support of Bill 231. Mr. Perez wrote that it is an honor to have the GEDA QC programed renamed the Perez Revitalization Enhancement Zone Act, because future generations will become familiar with the history that created Guam's top industry.

Mr. Ed Untalan, Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority, submitted written testimony **not in support of Bill 231** as written. Mr. Untalan expressed a desired to honor the Late Honorable Francisco D. Perez, but suggested that he be honored in other ways, including by renaming GEDA's financial services programs for local businesses. Mr. Untalan said that reprinting brochures marketing the QC program to off-island markets would cost \$150,000 and said there would be limited local recognition because the QC isn't marketed primarily to local businesses.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform, Reorganization and Federal Affairs finds that Bill No. 231 provides a fitting tribute to the Late Honorable Francisco Duenas Perez, who is considered the Father of the Guam Economic Development Authority, by his advocacy and support of creating a public corporation to promote and attract new businesses to Guam. Mr. Perez also developed GEDA's tax incentive programs, now known as the Qualifying Certificate Program, one of GEDA's most successful economic development programs. In addition, Mr. Perez was a visionary and an entrepreneur who created such successful enterprises as a local egg producing company, a commercial poultry farm and piggery, Perez Bros. Inc., the Pacific Construction Company, and the Guam Contractors Association. Mr. Perez served a long and distinguished political career, serving as an Assemblyman and Councilman, as well as a charter Senator in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 8th Guam Legislatures.

Official Testimony Regarding Bill 231, An Act To Rename the Qualifying Certificate Program

Submitted by Ed Untalan Administrator Guam Economic Development Authority

Friday, November 05, 1999

Senator Lamorena and members of the 25th Guam Legislature, the Guam Economic Development Authority wishes to express appreciation for the efforts proposed in Bill 231 to officially honor the late Honorable Francisco Duenas Perez, founder of GEDA by renaming the Qualifying Certificate Program in his memory.

This proposal is an honorable one, and is received by GEDA as a moving and very well intentioned tribute to a man who gave much of himself for the benefit of Guam. Further, GEDA fully agrees that some measure, promulgated by the legislature and administered by the Authority, is more than needed to fully recognize the accomplishments of this Chamorro statesman.

The Authority however does wish to implore the legislature to please consider an alternative form of recognition aside from the renaming of the Qualifying Certificate program for the following reasons:

Established Brand Recognition for the Qualifying Certificate, "QC" program -Subsequent to the moratorium placed on the QC program in the early 1990s, the Authority had to make monumental efforts to revive the program as a viable economic incentive tool with global brand recognition. Precious marketing dollars, available in very minimal supply, were allocated to the printing of a variety of brochures promoting the program. The brochures were positioned to target the international investor, and were thus translated into Mandarin, Japanese, and Korcan for positioning in these target markets. Further, a video promoting the program, its past successes, and its future potential for the economic diversification of Guam was also produced and translated into target market languages as well. The results have been notable; 17 QCs have been approved for major projects providing hundreds of new jobs for the island.

Reprinting of these brochures, reproduction of the video, and a total rebuilding of the established brand image would be extremely costly for the Authority - at a minimum more than \$150,000. Further, no such budget exists at the Authority for the reproduction of these materials. Repositioning the brand image would take years, and could greatly impact our ability to continue positioning of this program in target markets.

Limited Local Recognition Through This Particular Program

While the Qualifying Certificate Program is available to qualified local investors, it has served primarily as a tool for recruiting off-island investment. Most promotion of the program occurs in off-island target markets. GEDA would like to respectfully suggest that to most fully honor the legacy of the Late Honorable Francisco Duenas Perez and his contributions to the People of Guarn, that assigning his namesake to a more locally focused program would provide the highest and most appropriate honor.

The Authority therefore respectfully submits the following proposals for the review of the legislature as ways to honor GEDA's founding father:

- renaming of GEDA's financial services (loan) programs for local businesses
- assignment of land by the legislature to GEDA for development as the Francisco Duenas Perez Industrial and/or Commercial Park
- assignment of the Francisco Duenas Perez name to GEDA's current and/or future office building/location

The Authority suggests that one or more of these measures will provide the most widespread local recognition of the Late Honorable Francisco D. Perez, and will prove instrumental in furthering the mission of the Authority through either its local loan programs, industrial park leases, or operations facility.

developing GEDA's tax incentive programs, now known as the *Qualifying Certificate Program*, one of GEDA's most successful economic development programs. It is the
intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to further recognize the contributions and
accomplishments of this visionary, and in doing so, *I Liheslatura* finds that it is
befitting to rename GEDA's QC Program after the Late Honorable Francisco Duenas
Perez.

7 Section 2. Renaming of the QC Program. Article 4, Chapter 2, Title 12 of
8 the Guam Code Annotated is hereby renamed the *Perez Economic Revitalization and*9 *Enhancement Zone Act.*

10 Section 3. Implementation of the QC Name Change. Upon the enactment 11 of this Act, it shall be the responsibility of the GEDA Administrator to effectuate the 12 name change authorized herein, and within a reasonable period of time, make the 13 necessary changes to all pertinent QC forms to reflect the name change authorized 14 herein.
