Enclosed please find Bill No. 135 (COR), "AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §63202, ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 63, DIVISION 3, PART 2 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE RANK OF BRIGADIER GENERAL FOR THE ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL FOR ARMY OF THE GUAM NATIONAL GUARD", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 25-18.

This legislation allows the Assistant Adjutant General for the Army of the Guam National Guard to assume the responsibilities of the National Guard at times when the Adjutant General is not able to do so, due to the separate duties of managing the civil defense response to natural disasters, such as typhoons, which occur on Guam.

The authorized position is federally funded, and will allow for an already qualified person to fill it, as is done in the various states of the United States.



22 Assistant Adjutant General for Army shall be recommended by the
23 Adjutant General to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*, and he shall:

1 (a) be a citizen of the United States and a resident of
2 Guam;

3 (b) hold the rank of Colonel, which is Federally
4 recognized;

5 (c) be promoted to a rank *not* to exceed Brigadier General
6 at the discretion of *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* as Commander-in-Chief of
7 the Guam National Guard; *and*

8 (d) perform such military duties as the Commander of the
9 Guam Army National Guard, under the direction of the Adjutant
10 General and shall perform such other military duties as may be
11 required of him by the Adjutant General.

12 The Assistant Adjutant General for Army shall be under the
13 supervision and control of the Adjutant General. When so designated
14 by *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*, the Assistant Adjutant General shall be the

16 Guam or during the unavailability of the Adjutant General due to illness
17 or incapacitation."





Bill No. 135(COR): AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT 63202, ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 63, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO AUTHORIZE THE RANK OF BRIGADIER GENERAL FOR THE ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL FOR ARMY OF THE GUAM NATIONAL GUARD.

Summary of Testimonies:

Mr. Garrido testified in support of Bill 135.

Gen. Paulino stated Guam is the only territory of the 54 states and territories that does not have the authorized Rank of Brigadier General as the Assistant Adjutant General for the Army, as authorized by the federal government. We just have to amend the statute. It will not cost the government of Guam any additional expense, in fact it will be a federally funded position. For the position to be federally recognized the person has to meet and fulfil all federal requirements for the rank. The primary reason for having an Assistant Adjutant is in case of a natural disaster or emergency I can step down as the Adjutant General of the National Guard and go run the Civil Defense and the Assistant Adjutant can take over my duties at the National Guard. Without the Assistant Adjutant's position I can not statutorily do both jobs.

Mr. Taimanglo testified in support of Bill 135.

Sen. Salas: If there was an Assistant Adjutant and the position of

Adjutant General is vacated, does the Assistant Adjutant move up to the vacated spot?

Gen. Paulino stated no, the Adjutant General is appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature, it is not an automatic promotion.

Mr. Greg Perez testified in support of Bill 135 and would like to add that the Bill should provide a training ground for a two star General, In the event there is a vacancy the Governor needs to make a selection, there is someone on board that has been groomed, trained and knows the Guam Guard.

Bill No. 135 (COR) has been publicly heard.

The Committee recommends TO DO PASS Bill No. 135.

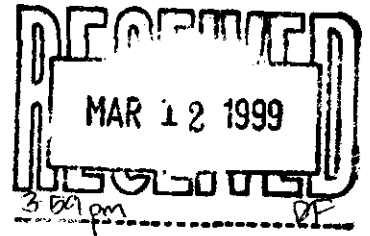
