Enclosed please find Bill No. 496 (COR), "AN ACT TO AMEND \$80103 OF TITLE 21 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REDUCING THE QUORUM OF THE ANCESTRAL LANDS COMMISSION FROM SIX (6) MEMBERS TO FOUR (4) MEMBERS," which I have signed into law as Public Law No. 25-180.

This legislation reduces the number of members of the Ancestral Lands Commission necessary for a quorum. This legislation came about due to the request of the Commission members, who found it difficult to get a quorum of 6 members to be present for all of the business of the Commission. This legislation reduces the number needed for a quorum to 4 members for administrative business and 5 members for determining a land claim.

Committee Report November 3, 2000

The Committee on Land, Agriculture, Military Affairs & the Arts held a public hearing on November 3, 2000 at the Public Hearing Room in the Legislative Building. The hearing was called to order at 9:27 a.m. by the Chairman, Senator Marcel G. Camacho.

Present for the hearing were Senator Frank Aguon, Senator Tony Lamorena and Senator Larry Kasperbauer.

Summary of Testimonies:

Antonio Sablan: Acting Chairman, Ancestral Lands Commission. In favor of bill because it is difficult to obtain quorum with the current requirement of seven (7) members due to vacancies, medical problems, vacations etc. Requested that the number of members needed to carry out the duties be reduced from 6 to 4; with 4 needed to conduct business and 5 needed to convey title to a claimant.

Joseph Garrido: Member, Ancestral Lands Commission. Believes that the request is not to reduce the maximum number of 7 members, but that the number of members needed for a quorum to make a legal decision be reduced to 5.

Joseph Borja: Director, Ancestral Lands Commission. Stated that the original membership of the commission was 12 including some senators. A public hearing was held and the legislature agreed to remove the senators and membership within the commission, but did not lower the quorum count. Due to lack of quorum there has been no decisions made by the commission to date.

Senator Larry Kasperbauer: The Senator stated that vacancies make it difficult for boards/commissions to take action on issues. He questioned the procedure for filling vacancies. He suggested that if the chief executive appoints the members and a vacancy occurs, perhaps the commission members can assist in recommending names for appointment to the commission. He also noted that quorums have been reduced before because of problems getting members to attend meetings, but this doesn't get to the root of the problem. If it's that important of a body and a quorum cannot be reached in order to conduct business or take any action, then there's a problem. However, to simply reduce the numbers may be giving more power to fewer people.

Chairman: The chairman requested that Joe Borja facilitate the polling of each of the commission members to obtain their position on what the total membership should be. The position statements can be used as testimony and then a decision can be made on the floor on what direction to take. He then noted that he will be working with Senator Kasperbauer to insure that this legislation incorporates some of his ideas.

There being no other testimony, the bill is publicly heard.

Committee Recommendations: The committee finds that it is difficult for the Ancestral Lands Commission to conduct regular meetings based on the current quorum requirements. During the public hearing it was suggested that the proposed quorum requirement be the same as those proposed in the Rules and Regulations (Bill No. 503) submitted by the commission for legislative approval. The Rules and Regulations requires the attendance of four (4) members present shall constitute a quorum to transact administrative business and no less than five (5) members present to determine a land claim. The committee wishes to report out Bill No. 496 as amended by the author with the recommendation to do pass.

Section 2. Section 80103 of Title 21 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"Section 80103. Guam Ancestral Lands Commission. There is within the government of Guam the 'Guam Ancestral Lands Commission' to carry out the purposes of this Chapter. The Commission shall be composed of seven (7) members, with seven (7) people appointed by I Maga'lahen Guåhan, who shall be residents of Guam and descendants or heirs of ancestral land owners or claimants, and they shall serve terms of four (4) years from the date of their appointment.

Four (4) Commissioners present shall constitute a quorum of the Commission for the conduct of administrative business. Five (5) Commissioners present shall constitute a quorum of the Commission to determine a land claim. A vote of a majority of the members of the Commission shall be required for any action of the Commission. The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs. It shall elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman from among the Commissioners, and may employ an executive director and such staff as is necessary to carry out the duties set forth in this Chapter, pending the submission and approval of a budget by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Each Commissioner shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for attendance of each meeting of the Commission; provided, that such



I Mina' Bente Singko Na Liheslaturan 2 Guåhan finds that modern technology now exist that will make the need for 3 permanent concrete monuments at each survey point obsolete. With the use 4 of Global Positioning Station, and available hand-held computer technology, 5 anyone could locate the survey points within a high degree of accuracy. The 6 requirement to have permanent concrete monuments at each point of the 7 survey also makes the cost of the project prohibitive. Mr. Roy P. Duenas had 8 a land exchange approved by the Twenty-second Guam Legislature. Public 9 Law 22-[97]79:4:(c) required such permanent concrete monuments at each 10 survey point. This is an unusual survey mandate. 11

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

The Commission shall be composed of seven (7) members with seven (7) people appointed by I Maga'lahen Guahan and shall be residents of Guam and descendants or heirs of ancestral land owners or claimants, and they shall serve terms of four (4) years from the date of their appointment.

[Six-(6)] Four (4) Commissioners shall constitute a quorum of the Commission for the conduct of all business. A vote of a majority of the members of the Commission shall be required for any action of the Commission. The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs. It shall elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman from among the Commissioners and may employ an executive director and such staff as is necessary to carry out the duties set forth in this Chapter, pending the submission and approval of a budget by *I Liheslaturan Guahan*. Each Commissioner shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for attendance of each meeting of the Commission, providing that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month, and providing that they are not members of *I Liheslaturan Guahan*."



Bureau of Budget and Management Research Fiscal Note Comments to Bill 499 (COR) November 14, 2000

The intent of Bill 499 is to repeal an unusual survey mandate requiring permanent concrete monuments at each point of surveyed properties that is not conducive to modern technology where Global Positioning Stations and hand-held computers are currently being used to locate survey points within a high degree of accuracy. This bill action will relieve the mandated monumenting survey requirement for Mr. Roy P. Duenas in a land exchange agreement with Government of Guam pursuant to P.L. 22-79.

It should be noted that on Line 10 of this Bill should read Law 22-79;4:(c).

The fiscal impact of this Bill to Land Management is nominal in terms of the surveying, administrative and other related costs. With modern technology in place, permanent concrete monuments may not only be cost-effective but will become obselete eventually. Based on the limited information provided, funding requirements are undetermined at this time.

The intent of Bill 496 is to make discussions during Commission meetings more workable among members by reducing quorum requirements from six (6) down to four (4) members. This admendment action is necessary not only to avoid a near perfect attendance every Commission meeting (quorum requirement of six (6) out of the seven (7) member Commission) but to ensure a simple majority membership of at least four (4) members to conduct future meetings of the Commission.

Enclosed please find a draft bill entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND §80103 OF TITLE 21 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REDUCING THE QUORUM OF THE ANCESTRAL LANDS COMMISSION FROM SIX (6) MEMBERS TO FOUR (4) MEMBERS."

The Ancestral Lands Commission is a new entity that needs to perform considerable start-up work, such as prepare and promulgate rules and regulations. The total membership of this Commission is Seven (7) members; however, the quorum to conduct business is Six (6) members. Section 1. Legislative Findings. When the Committee on Land,
Agriculture, Military Affairs and the Arts conducted a Public Hearing for the
confirmation of Mr. Jose U. Garrido as board member of the Ancestral Lands
Commission, it was brought to the Committee's attention that they were
having problems with the quorum requirements for meetings. During further
discussions it was agreed that reducing it from six (6) members to four (4)
members was more workable.

Section 2. Quorum Requirement. §80103 of Title 21 of the Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:

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"Section 80103. **Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.** There is within the government of Guam the "Guam Ancestral Lands Commission" to carry out the purposes of this Chapter. The Commission shall be composed of seven (7) members with seven (7) people appointed by I Maga'lahen Guahan and shall be residents of Guam and descendants or heirs of ancestral land owners or claimants, and they shall serve terms of four (4) years from the date of their appointment.

[Six-(6)] Four (4) Commissioners shall constitute a quorum of the Commission for the conduct of all business. A vote of a majority of the members of the Commission shall be required for any action of the Commission. The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs. It shall elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman from among the Commissioners and may employ an executive director and such staff as is necessary to carry out the duties set forth in this Chapter, pending the submission and approval of a budget by *I Liheslaturan Guahan*. Each Commissioner shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for attendance of each meeting of the Commission, providing that such compensation shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month, and providing that they are not members of *I Liheslaturan Guahan*."
