1	Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan					
2	finds that a historical problem of abuse of public funds has been the hiring of					
3	and/or the granting of pay increases for unclassified employees following the					
4	ousting of an elected official in an election or decision by an elected official not					
5	to seek another term in office. This practice is costly to taxpayers in terms of					
6	actual wages paid and higher lump sum annual leave payments due upon					
7	separation of service.					
8	It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to put an end to the abusive					
9	practices of hiring new, unclassified employees and granting pay increases to					
10	unclassified employees of politicians leaving office.					
11	Section 2. Section 2109 is hereby added to Chapter 2 of Title 4 of the					
12	Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 6227. Prohibition Against Salary Increases for Unclassified Employees Following the Defeat of an Incumbent in an Election. No unclassified employee employed in the Executive Branch of government may receive a pay increase following the defeat of a sitting Maga'lahen Guåhan in a primary election or general election until after such date that such Maga'lahen Guåhan leaves office. No unclassified employee employed in any Legislative Office of a sitting Senator may receive a pay increase following the defeat of such Senator in a primary or general election. No unclassified employee employed in any Mayoral Office of a sitting Mayor may receive a pay increase following the defeat of such Mayor in a primary or general election."

Section 5. Section 6228 is hereby *added* to Chapter 6 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 6228. Prohibition Against Salary Increases for Unclassified Employees Employed by Incumbents Not Seeking Re-

election. No unclassified employee employed in the Executive Branch of government may receive a pay increase after October 1st of the last year of office of a sitting Maga'lahen Guåhan who is not seeking reelection until after such date that such Maga'lahen Guåhan leaves office. No unclassified employee employed in any Legislative Office of a sitting Senator, opting not to seek re-election, may receive a pay increase after October 1st of the last year in office of such Senator. No unclassified employee employed in any Mayoral Office of a sitting Mayor, opting not to seek re-election, may receive a pay increase after October 1st of the last year in office of such Mayor."


