Dear Speaker Unpingco:

Enclosed please find Bill No. 3 (LS), "AN ACT TO ADD \$1510 TO ARTICLE 5, CHAPTER 1, DIVISION 1, PART 1 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING I MAGA'LAHEN GUÅHAN TO RECEIVE BILLS FROM I LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN AT ALL TIMES", which I have signed into law today as **Public Law No. 25-37**.

I commend the Liheslaturan Guåhan for providing a statutory basis to facilitate the transmittal of measures from the legislative branch to the executive branch. This will avoid the past legislative practices of transmitting measures to unauthorized clerks and security guards. Following the precedent established by this new law, I would suggest the Liheslaturan Guåhan adopt similar procedures to allow the receipt, on a 24 hour basis, of measures that are acted on by the Governor.



**AN ACT TO ADD §1510 TO ARTICLE 5, CHAPTER
1, DIVISION 1, PART 1 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM
CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING
I MAGA'LAHEN GUÅHAN TO RECEIVE BILLS
FROM *I LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN* AT ALL TIMES.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*
3 recognizes that the responsibilities of passing laws for Guam and its people
4 are of paramount importance and represent one of the fundamental processes

1 of our system of government. Public officials maintain a duty to ensure that
2 they are always prepared to accommodate the political mechanisms which
3 guarantee our system of government and operate to better our peoples' lives.
4 The importance of each bill passed by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* cannot be left to
5 any one branch of government to determine when it should be received for
6 action, once prepared for transmission. Our elected officials occupy positions
7 oftentimes requiring more than the ordinary government employee, including
8 working beyond the regular Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.,
9 working hours. Further, certain public officials, such as *I Maga'laken Guåhan*
10 are compensated and receive special privileges, such as government paid
11 living and travel accommodations, personal security, and administrative and
12 legal staff assistance, which provide for his being available to address any
13 emergency or important matter at a moment's notice at all times, be that after
14 regular working hours, on the weekends or on holidays.

15 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the bills it passes are of great importance
16 to the Island and our people, and that legislation cannot wait for the Chief
17 Executive to receive it during the regular government working hours. Once a
18 bill is prepared and ready for transmission for *I Maga'laken Guåhan's* review
19 and action, whether that be after regular working hours or on the weekend,
20 his being unavailable should not delay the receipt and action upon bills
21 passed by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* due to his extensive support staff network.
22 The Organic Act provides that *I Maga'laken Guåhan* may review bills for a
23 period of ten (10) days, excluding Sundays. This period should never be

1 delayed because of political reasons in order to delay the ability of *I*
2 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* to override a veto from the Chief Executive.

3 **Section 2.** Section 1510 is hereby *added* to Article 5, Chapter 1, Division
4 1, Part 1 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

5 **“Section 1510. *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* to Always Receive Bills.**

6 *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* shall receive bills transmitted from *I Liheslaturan*
7 *Guåhan* for his review and action at any time, including after regular
8 government working hours and on weekends and holidays. *I*
9 *Maga’lahen Guåhan* shall provide for a process in which transmission can
10 be effectuated during and after regular government working hours by *I*
11 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* by delivering to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan*
12 *Guåhan*, within thirty (30) days of enactment of this law, written notice
13 of the procedures. Until such time as notice is provided to the Speaker
14 of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* under this Section, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* shall
15 deliver to the Office of *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* bills for *I Maga’lahen*
16 *Guåhan’s* review and action during regular government working hours;
17 and if *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* is unavailable after regular government
18 working hours, to the security personnel at Government House located
19 in Agana Heights. *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* shall be deemed unavailable
20 after regular government working hours when any security personnel at
21 Government House advise the Clerk of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, either in
22 writing or orally, that *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* cannot immediately receive
23 the legislation.”

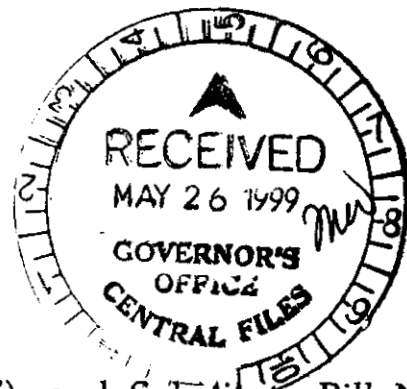

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform, Reorganization and Federal Affairs held two public hearings on Bill No. 3. The first public hearing was held on Thursday, February 18, 1999 at 9:30am in the Conference Room, Office of Senator Mark Forbes, I Liheslaturan Guahan. The second public hearing was held on Wednesday, February 24, 1999 at 10:00am in the Conference Room, Office of Senator Mark Forbes, I Liheslaturan Guahan. Public notice of the hearing was announced in the February 13, 18, 22, 23, and 24, 1999 issues of the Pacific Daily News.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

There were no individuals appearing before the Committee to present oral testimony on the bill. No written testimony was submitted to the Committee on the bill.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Rules, Government Reform, Reorganization and Federal Affairs finds that Bill No. 3 ensures that legislation passed by I Liheslaturan Guahan on behalf of the people of Guam is given immediate and timely consideration, as these bills are of paramount importance to our constituents. This measure guarantees that bills passed by this body are immediately addressed, regardless of working hours, weekends or holidays.
