AN ACT TO AMEND §§16104.6 AND 31101 OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO NOT REQUIRING EXECUTIVE APPOINTMENT AND LEGISLATIVE CONFIRMATION OF STUDENT MEMBERS ON THE U.O.G. BOARD OF REGENTS AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF G.C.C.

## **1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 Section 1. Section 16104.6 of Chapter 16, Division 3 of Title 17 of the

3 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"Section 16104.6. Student Regent. The student member shall be a full Board member with all rights, privileges and responsibilities thereof. To be eligible to serve as a student member of the Board the person shall be a full-time student at the University who has completed one (1) year of study (at least thirty (30) credits) and who has maintained good academic standing as defined by the Board.

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The student member shall be that person receiving the highest 7 number of votes cast at an election of all students registered at the 8 9 University of Guam whether full-time or part-time, to be held in March 10 of each even numbered year. The election of the student member shall be conducted by the Student Body Senate in accordance with the 11 12 regulations adopted by the Senate and approved by the Board. The 13 Chairperson of the Board shall proclaim the day of the election. The 14 student receiving the highest number of votes shall be certified by the 15 Chairperson of the Board, provided that the student received at least a 16 certain percentage of the votes cast of a certain percentage of those 17 eligible to vote, as determined by the Board. In the event that no 18 student receives sufficient votes, a run-off election will be held between 19 the two (2) students with the most votes. The student receiving the 20 most votes in the run-off election shall serve as the student member of the Board of Regents. The student member position shall not require the 21 22 appointment by I Maga'lahen Guåhan and the advice and consent of I 23 Liheslaturan Guåhan.

1 Any student member candidate must be nominated by a petition 2 signed by one hundred (100) students attending the University of 3 Guam.

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The student member shall serve for a term of two (2) years beginning at twelve o'clock noon on the first Monday in May in the year in which he or she is elected.

7 When a student ceases to be a full-time student or falls below the 8 academic standing required for student membership, as specified in 9 §16104.6 of this Title, at the University, he shall be deemed to have 10 vacated his position on the Board. Any vacancy during the term of a 11 student member shall be filled for the remainder of the term by an 12 election of a majority of the Student Body Senate."

Section 2. Section 31101 of Chapter 31, Division 4 of Title 17 of the
Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

15 "Section 31101. Administration of the Guam Community 16 All powers vested in the Guam Community College, College. (a) 17 except as provided herein shall be exercised by the Guam 18 Community College Board of Trustees. The Board shall consist of 19 seven (7) trustees, six (6) of whom shall be nominated and 20 appointed by I Maga'lahen Guåhan with the advice and consent of I 21 Liheslaturan Guåhan. Three (3) trustees shall be appointed to terms 22 of three (3) years, three (3) trustees shall be appointed to terms of 23 five (5) years and the seventh  $(7^{th})$  shall be an elected student member who shall serve a term of one (1) year. Their successors 24

shall be appointed each for a term of five (5) years, with the 1 exception of the student member. The student member shall be 2 elected by a plurality vote of students of the school. The student 3 member must be a student at the college and may be re-elected to 4 no more than one (1) successive one-year term. The procedures 5 for election of the student member shall be developed by the 6 Board of Trustees. The first election for student member shall take 7 place during the school year 1999-2000. The student member 8 position shall not require the appointment by I Maga'lahen Guahan 9 and the advice and consent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan. No courtesy 10 resignations shall be required. All vacancies occurring on the 11 12 Board of Trustees, except the student member, shall be filled by I 13 Maga'lahen Guåhan with the advice and consent of I Liheslaturan 14 Guåhan for the unexpired term.

15 I Maga'lahen Guåhan shall appoint one (1) trustee to (b) 16 represent business and industry and employer organizations; one 17 (1) trustee to represent organized labor organizations on Island. 18 The remaining four (4) trustees shall be members of the general 19 public. As these positions on the Board become vacant, they shall 20 be filled in a like manner. No person may serve as a trustee if the 21 trustee is a government of Guam employee or if the trustee's 22 service would amount to a conflict of interest.

(c) The concurrence of four (4) members of the Board at a duly called and noticed regular or special meeting of the Board, which is open to the public in accordance with law, shall be necessary to the validity of its acts; *provided*, that the Board need *not* meet in public when it is discussing litigation or impending litigation with its attorney.

7 (d) The trustees shall elect the chairperson from among
8 their number."

# **Committee Report On**

Bill No. 121 (COR): AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 16104.6 AND 31101 OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO NOT REQUIRING EXECUTIVE APPOINTMENT AND LEGISLATIVE CONFIRMATION OF STUDENT MEMBERS ON THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM BOARD OF REGENTS AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

# I. OVERVIEW

The Committee Education held a public hearing on Friday, May 5, 1999 at 9:00 a.m. at I Liheslaturan Public Hearing Room. Public Notice of the hearing was announced in the April 30<sup>th</sup> and May 4<sup>th</sup> 1999 issues of the Pacific Daily News.

# II. Testimony

**Mr. John T. Cruz, President, Guam Community College.** Mr. Cruz testified in favor of the Bill. He noted that GCC would need to develop new procedures for the selection of the student trustee. He also made note of a technical correction that needed to be made.

**Dr. Jose T. Nededog, President, University of Guam.** Dr. Jose T. Nededog testified that the University of Guam fully supports the Bill. He stated that it is UOG's position that selection of the student member should be left solely up to students.

Mr. Francis Patrick Toves. Mr. Toves signed in but did not testify.

# **III.** Findings and Recommendation

The Committee on Education finds Bill No. 121 (COR) will grant the students of GCC and UOG full autonomy in selecting the student Trustee and Regent members respectively. The Committee agrees with witnesses that the students alone should have the power to select their representatives. The Committee agrees with the recommendation of the GCC President for a technical correction that is incorporated in a substitute Bill.

It is the recommendation of the Committee on Education that Substitute Bill No. 121 (COR) be reported out with the recommendation **TO DO PASS**.

To be eligible to 9 serve as a student member of the Board the person shall be a full-time student at 10 the University who has completed one (1) year of study (at least 30 credits) and 11 who has maintained good academic standing as defined by the Board.

12 The student member shall be that person receiving the highest number of 13 votes cast at an election of all students registered at the University of Guam

whether fulltime or part-time, to be held in March of each even numbered year. 1 The election of the student member shall be conducted by the Student Body 2 Senate in accordance with the regulations adopted by the senate and approved by 3 the Board. The Chairperson of the Board shall proclaim the day of the election. 4 The student receiving the highest number of votes shall be certified by the 5 Chairperson of the Board who shall forward his or her name to the Governor who 6 shall appoint him or her pursuant to \$16104 of this title, provided that the student 7 received at least a certain percentage of the votes cast of a certain percentage of 8 those eligible to vote, as determined by the Board. In the event that no student 9 receives sufficient votes, a run-off election will be held between the two students 10 11 with the most votes. The student receiving the most votes in the run-off election will be certified to the Governor who shall appoint him pursuant to §16104 of this 12 title-shall serve as the student member of the Board of Regents. The Student 13 Member position shall not require the appointment by the Governor and the advice 14 15 and consent of the Legislature.

Dear Mr. Vice Speaker:

First of all, I want to thank you for giving me the opportunity to testify before this Committee regarding Bill No. 121 (COR), an act to amend Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to the rights, privileges and responsibilities of the Student Regent at the University of Guam.

I fully support Bill No. 121 (COR) particularly that provision, which stipulates that Student Regent shall not require the appointment by the Governor and the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Student Regent position in the Board of Regents is achieved by a full-time student who received the highest number of votes cast at an election of all students registered at the University of Guam. Therefore, to require that the student receive an appointment by the Governor and/or require confirmation by the Legislature would be ambiguous at the least. Since the student member of the Board of Regents is the student who received the highest number of votes through a democratic election process, the swearing in of the student before taking office should be accomplished by the Chairman of the Board.

Dear Senator Kasperbauer:

The College supports the intent of Bill No. 121, but would like to suggest several changes that will facilitate implementation of the amended bill when it becomes law.

1. There appears to be a conflict between section a and b of Section 2. Section 31101 of Title 17 of the GCA. Paragraph a establishes that the student member position does not require approval of the Governor or the Legislature, but paragraph b retains language that seems to imply that the Governor will appoint the student member. To remedy the conflict I suggest the following change to the first sentence of paragraph b: end the sentence on page 3 line 23 after the word "island," and delete the remainder of the sentence. The paragraph then would read:

"(b) The Governor shall appoint one (1) trustee to represent business and industry and employer organizations; one (1) trustee to represent organized labor organizations on the island. The remaining-four (4) trustees shall be members of the general public. As these positions on the Board become vacant, they shall be filled in a like manner. No person may serve as a trustee if he is a Government of Guam employee or if his service would amount to a conflict of interest."

2. I would like to include language that requires the Board of Trustees to establish eligibility criteria and the process of selection of the Student Trustee. There should be an added paragraph after the one given above. May I suggest that it read as follows:

"The Board of Trustees will establish, and revise as is deemed necessary, eligibility criteria for the Student Trustee, and the process of selection. In the interim between passage of this amended law and establishment of eligibility criteria and selection processes, previous criteria will prevail. The Board of Trustees will establish said criteria and processes within six (6) months of the enactment of the amended law."

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



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
