I. PUBLIC HEARING

The Committee on Power, Public Works, Tax and Regulatory Reform, Municipal and Community Affairs (PPWTRRM&CA) called a public hearing to order at 9:16 a.m., Thursday April 1, 1999 to hear testimony on BILL NO. 70 (COR) “AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (A) & (C) TO 11 GCA §28101; TO RE-ALPHABETIZE THE EXISTING SUBSECTIONS ACCORDINGLY AND TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (H) TO 11 GCA §28106, RELATIVE TO EXEMPTING USE TAX FOR PASSENGER LUGGAGE.” The hearing was held in the Public Hearing Room of the Temporary Building of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, Hagåtña. Notices were placed in the Pacific Daily News on 3/26/99, 3/27/99, 3/28/99 and 3/30/99.

The hearing was called to order by Senator Eddie Baza Calvo, Chairman of PPWTRRM&CA. Members present included Senators Kaleo S. Moylan, Marcel G. Camacho and Frank B. Aguon, Jr. Also present was Senator Vicente C. Pangelinan.

II. TESTIMONY

MR. JOHN M. QUINATA and MAJOR IGNACIO Q. PEREDO of Customs and Quarantine testified that the language of the measure is complicated, vague and overly broad. As written, it provides for misinterpretation and misapplication. Also noted were discrepancies and ambiguities in the definitions of 'luggage' and "cargo"; all of which could lead to increased commercial imports via passengers arriving at the air terminal, thereby resulting in the usurping of the Use Tax.

To afford individuals an exemption from Use Tax on personal merchandise transported via their baggage, it was recommended that new language be used which would add a new subsection (h) to §28106 of 11 GCA. (Please refer to written testimony, herein attached as Exhibit "A".)

MR. JOHN P. CAMACHO, representing Carl E. Torres, Acting Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation, testified against the measure. He stated that the subsections in the title and in Section I were misleading and should be clarified. He also stated that by exempting all passenger luggage, a loss in tax revenue would result. He also pointed out that currently, the law provides for an exemption of up to one thousand dollars, per month, on personal, non-commercial goods arriving with passengers. (Please refer to written testimony, herein attached as "Exhibit B".)

The senators present queried those present on agency operations, possible problems that could arise if the bill were passed, and the application of existing statute. Senator Moylan also inquired on whether a tracking system was in place so as to better assist in the monitoring of the frequency of passenger arrivals. Mr. Quinata stated that Customs and Quarantine is currently working with the Department of Revenue and Taxation in instituting such.

There being no further testimony, the public hearing on Bill No. 70 (COR) concluded at 10:16 a.m.

III. FINDINGS

Current statute provides an exemption of the Use Tax on items brought in via passenger baggage that is intended for personal non-business use. Said exemption applies to a \$1,000 aggregate value, or less, on items acquired outside Guam during any one-month period. And despite remonstrative testimony presented by both Customs and Quarantine and the Department of Revenue and Taxation, the Committee finds that said exemption nevertheless unduly restricts or penalizes returning residents who have brought with them personal items valued at over \$1,000. Bill No. 70 (COR) seeks to eliminate said "restrictions" by affording relief from the Use Tax on items specifically intended for personal use.


IV. RECOMMENDATION



Re: Comments on Bill 70 Relative to Use Tax Amendment

Dear Senator Calvo:

Hafa Adai! Thank you for giving us this opportunity to offer our comments regarding Bill 70, an act to exempt merchandise imported via the airport from the Use Tax. As indicated at the public hearing on this bill, the Customs and Quarantine Agency remains concerned about the language of this legislation, and the potential impact it will have on our operations.

Our foremost concern is that the language of this bill is complicated, vague, and overly broad. Because of this, we fear that not only can it easily be misinterpreted or applied, but it can also incite commercial activities to use the airport passenger area to import their cargo... a venue to avoid applicable use taxes contrary to the intent of this provision.

Despite the proposed definition for "cargo", merchandise imported via passenger baggage are not transported under an airway bill or bill of lading, and consequently, does not carry much weight in distinguishing where the exemption applies. These discrepancies, of course, can lead to increased commercial imports and clearances at our passenger airport, and less clearances and capital in our cargo operations.

Our understanding is that this bill's primary intent is to afford individuals an exemption from the Use Tax on personal merchandise imported via their baggage. Should this be the case, we suggest that following language be used and added to the "Use Tax Exemptions" as an alternative to the proposed legislation:

"Exemptions - §28106 (h). Articles accompanying an arriving passenger for their own personal non-business use or consumption."

With this language, it offers:

- consistency with terminology used in transportation and import/export trade;
- the exemption is clear and concise;
- no other definition, amendment, or provision is necessary;
- it is the class of articles, not the baggage, that is eligible for exemption; and
- it is the individual that is allowed the exemption.

Example II

If the same passenger in example 1 brings in Jewelry valued at Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) on May 29, 1999 for personal use. Under the present law, passenger will be taxed a use tax of \$400 (10,000x4%) passenger has exhausted his 1,000 exemption on May 01,1999. Exempting passenger luggage again will mean zero use tax revenue.

Given the following examples above the passing of this legislation would surely decrease collection of the use tax, In times of declining revenues it may appear to make good sense not to pass this exemption.

Under Section 3 of the bill, "Cargo travelling with a passenger is not exempt from the provisions if this chapter." Currently exemptions under subsection (e) of 11 GCA 28106 "entitles an individual who is a bona fide resident of Guam, a One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) value or less, during any one month period for a maximum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) per any given calendar year on personal non-business use of any property." Thus, cargo travelling may involve personal non-business use of any property and are subject to exemption under subsection 28106 (e).

The Department of Revenue and Taxation holds the position not to be in favor of this bill.
