AN ACT TO COMPLY WITH P.L. NO. 25-03 BY REQUESTING LEGISLATIVE AUTHORIZATION FOR THE CREATION OF THE SUPREME COURT OF GUAM STAFF ATTORNEY POSITION AND ONE (1) RESEARCH ATTORNEY POSITION, AND THE ASSOCIATED FUNDING FOR EACH POSITION; INCLUDING APPROVAL FOR THE CREATION OF

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ONE ADDITIONAL RESEARCH ATTORNEY POSITION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

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2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. As one (1) facets of I3 Liheslaturan Guåhan's public policy to prudently allocate limited financial 4 resources, a government wide freeze on hiring and a repeal of appropriations 5 for positions vacated has been mandated by Public Law Number 25-03. Such 6 policy, however, has, as an unintended consequence, had an adverse impact 7 upon small organizations staffed primarily by professional, unclassified 8 personnel. The automatic repeal of positions and associated funding hinders 9 organizations such as the Supreme Court of Guam from functioning 10 effectively and properly.

11 To ensure that operations are *not* adversely affected, *I Liheslaturan* 12 *Guåhan* finds that provisions must be made to authorize the creation of the 13 Supreme Court of Guam Staff Attorney position and one (1) Research 14 Attorney position, both of which are affected by §21(b) of Chapter V of Public 15 Law Number 25-03. Further, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes that the 16 Supreme Court of Guam caseload has exceeded projections and necessitates 17 the creation of one (1) additional Research Attorney positions.

Section 2. The following positions for the Supreme Court of Guam are hereby created by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. These positions shall be paid for from the appropriation to the Supreme Court of Guam as provided in §33 of Chapter III of Public Law Number 25-03.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

On behalf of the Supreme Court of Guam, I write respectfully requesting your favorable consideration of restoring two positions affected by Public Law 25-03, §21(b).

As a small entity that relies significantly on unclassified, professional staff such as attorneys, our operations are crippled every time one of the staff vacates his or her position. For example, our Staff Attorney is departing island in the next two weeks and the Research Attorney for retired Associate Justice Janet Healy Weeks entered the private sector upon her departure. These two positions, like all others within our court, are essential and critical to operations.

Given the nature of unclassified, professional staff (attorneys) rotating in and out every one or two years, we believe that the language contained within §21(b) of Public Law 25-03 is detrimental to our efforts to properly dispatch and conduct court. The process of obtaining legislative approval for reinstatement of such positions and associated funding is a hindrance and is unwieldy.

Please note that we have taken all steps possible to be efficient and frugal. We have filled only those positions which were deemed essential to hold down personnel costs and benefits. Additionally, we have consolidated equipment and other areas of our operations to maintain expenses at the lowest levels possible. As a matter of fact, on April 16, 1999, we remitted \$500,000 to taxpayers.

Ideally, an amendment to the statute, in which an exemption is granted for the recruitment of attorneys, would be suitable. If, however, this poses difficult, then I ask for your expedited attention and support for the resotration of the two essential attorney slots which are currently affected.

Attached is draft language for your consideration.
