contained herein and specifically approve exemptions contained under §10108. The disapproval of a submitted list is *not* intended to disapprove an exemption created in the Sunshine Reform Act, or as created herein, for those agencies.

I. PUBLIC HEARING

The Committee on Power, Public Works, Tax and Regulatory Reform, Municipal and Community Affairs ("the Committee") held a public hearing on Thursday, September 23, 1999 at 9:00 a.m. to discuss and to take testimony on the lists of public writings to be considered as non-public and non-disclosable by the Guam Power Authority, the Department of Public Works, the Guam Contractors Licensing Board, the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, the Guam Energy Office, the Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors Board, the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Department of Youth Affairs.

The hearing was called to order by Committee Chairman, Senator Eddie Baza Calvo. with Senator Mark Forbes in attendance.

II. <u>TESTIMONY</u>

Appearing before the Committee to testify on behalf of their agencies were Mr. Ricardo Unpingco, Guam Power Authority: Mr. David Dell'Isola, Department of Youth Affairs; Mr. Sonny Shelton, Department of Parks and Recreation and Mr. George Tydingco, Department of Public Works. All were testifying in favor of the listing they submitted for non-disclosure.

Also appearing before the Committee was Ms. Jayne Flores, who was representing the Micronesia Chapter. Society of Professional Journalists. Ms. Flores expressed concern regarding the lists which were submitted and here concerns are contained in **Exhibit A.**

III. <u>FINDINGS</u>

The exception is with the Bureau of Budget and Management Research with respect to Audit Work Papers and Draft Audit Reports which the Committee agrees that they should be approved as items which are non-public and non-disclosable.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Power, Public Works, Tax and Regulatory Reform, Municipal and Community Affairs puts its recommendation in BILL NO. 352(LS), and reports out Bill No. 352(LS) to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, with the recommendation TO DO PASS.

Micronesia Chapter, Society of Professional Journalists Written Testimony FOI Hearings Submitted 10-27-99

The Micronesia Chapter, Society of Professional Journalists has submitted formal written testimony that the Sunshine Reform Act of 1999 allows sufficient exemptions for some government documents to be kept private.

MSPJ asks senators to keep in mind that many items on these government lists are too general in nature. We advise you, the lawmakers, to force the agency heads to be extremely specific about what types of documents fall under the provisions of Subsection 10108 of the Sunshine Reform Act.

For example, the University of Guam's proposed non-public list contained this item:

10. Legal counsel's correspondence related to University business. That statement, MSPJ testified, is too general in nature and could be used as an umbrella to keep out of the public eye legal correspondence that should be made public. UOG's legal counsel was understanding of MSPJ's position. Sen. Kasperbauer requested, and UOG agreed, to change the wording so that only legal correspondence involving pending legal matters would be kept private.

MSPJ recommends that senators make the suggested adjustments to these items contained in proposed non-public lists from the following government agencies:

Guam Power Authority:

- Disconnection Listing while private accounts may be kept out of the public eye, the list of government agencies that have not paid their GPA bills should definitely be open to the public
- Discovery Records or Documents in PUC Proceedings include the word "draft" in front of this item
- Insurance Records add "relating to pending claims prior to settlement"

 Exhibit A

- Integrated Resource Plan only the numerical cost estimates in the plan should be kept confidential. The rest of the plan should be open to the public.
- Memorandum from GPA's Internal Auditor to the Board of Directors add "with regard to internal investigations"
- Notice of levy files or correspondences add "with regard to employees"
- Records or Applications with Banks, Savings & Loan Assns., Credit Unions, or other financial institutions add "with regard to employee matters only"

Department of Parks and Recreation

- Payroll Records please note that all employees' salaries should be public information
- Offense Reports are cases of offense and arrest records As long as the arrest record is forwarded to GPD, MSPJ has no problem with this item.



This is in response and compliance to Public Law 25-06 requesting all departments and agencies to compile and submit records to the Legislature within 60 days upon the passage of the law, May 12, 1999.

Since the Department of Public Works is a line agency and all records that are considered non-public as stipulated in Section 10108; personnel, medical, similar files, home address and telephone numbers etc., the Department of Administration serves as the official records custodian on such matters. Any request for such records reflected above are automatically referred to Department of Administration.

We are therefore submitting the following documents we consider non-disclosure:

- Engineers' estimates prior to advertisement to receive bids, and bid opening of the Project. This engineers' estimate stipulates the estimated total construction cost of a certain project. This estimate should not be furnished to the public prior to advertisement and bid opening in such a way that prospective bidders had to come out with their own estimate.
- · Bid proposals for construction prior to award of the project. The bid proposals from contractors shall not be distributed to public prior to award of the project because they first have to be analyzed to in sure that proposals are acceptable and/or in compliance with contract requirements.

- Independent Government estimates for design fee prior to service contract negotiation. Per approved Enigneer-Architect (E-A) Services, Procurement Procedures, DPW, the independent government estimate shall be used for internal use only and shall not be released. During the period that the Department awards the E-A firm's submission of it sproposal, the Department shall prepare the estimated cost for procurement of the E-A services. This estimate shall be based on direct cost, indirect costs, overhead, and profit, and shall be the basis of the Government to negotiate for the E-A service fee.
- Pre-Negotiation memorandum for E/A services prior to award of the project. This memorandum contains assumptions of scope of work that have to be discussed and clarified between the Government and E-A firm prior to final fee negotiation.

In support of the above non-disclosure of documents we are citing the GSA Procurement Regulation 3-202.12.3 Confidential Data and the Release of Information item VIII of the Approved Engineer-Architect (E-A) Services, Procurement Procedures, DPW. Please refer to Attachments A and B.

All other records under the perview of the Department of Public Works are considered open and can be requested by anyone with the exception of the above mentioned documents.

Upon its receipt, each bid and modification shall be timestamped, but not opened and shall be stored in a secure place unt the time and date set for bid pening.

3-202.12.2 OPENING AND RECORDING.

Bids and modifications shall be opened publicly in the presence of one or more witnesses, at the time, date, and place designated in the Invitation for Bids. The name of each bidder, the bid price, and such other information as is deemed appropriate by the Procurement Officer, shall be read aloud or Such information also shall be otherwise made available. recorded at the time of bid opening; that is, the bids shall be tabulated or a bid abstract made. The names and addresses of required witnesses shall also be recorded at the opening. The opened bids shall be available for public inspection except to the extent the bidder designates trade secrets or other proprietary data to be confidential as set forth in Subsection 3-202.12.3 of this section. Material so designated shall accompany the bid and shall be readily separable from the bid in order to facilitate public inspection of the nonconfidential portion of the bid. Prices and makes and models or catalogue numbers of the items offered, deliveries, and terms of payment shall be publicly available at the time of bid opening regardless of any designation to the contrary.

3-202.12.3 CONFIDENTIAL DATA.

The Procurement-Officer shall examine the bids to determine the validity of any requests for nondisclosure of trade secrets and other proprietary data identified in writing. It the parties do not agree as to the disclosure of data; the Procurement Officer shall inform the bidders in writing what portions of the bids will be disclosed and that unless the bidder protests under Chapter 9 (Legal and Contractual Remedies) of this Guam Procurement Regulations, the bids will be so disclosed. The bids shall be opened to public inspection subject to any continuing prohibition on the disclosure of confidential data.

VI. AWARD

Award of E-A service contracts shall conform with Government policy and procedures for award of construction, service, and supply contracts.

For Federal Aid Highway projects, a concurrence with the negotiated contract amount and authorization to proceed shall be obtained from FHWA prior to execution of the contract.

VII. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- A. The award of a contract for E-A services for a particular project and the award of a contract for the related construction work to the same firm, a parent firm, or its subsidiaries, or affiliates is prohibited except for a design/build contract.
- B. An E-A firm selected for negotiation of an E-A services contract shall be informed of the policy set forth above prior to the initiation of negotiations. If the firm possesses construction capabilities either within its own organization or through a parent firm, subsidiaries, or affiliates, the firm shall have the option of either:
 - 1. declining to enter into contract negotiations so that its parent firm, subsidiaries, or affiliates will be eligible to compete for the related construction contract; or
 - 2. entering into contract negotiations with the clear understanding that if such negotiations are successful, its parent firm, subsidiaries, or affiliates will be ineligible to compete for the related construction contract.
- C. The E-A firm shall acknowledge its understanding of the above policy in its proposal submission.

VIII (PRELEASE OF INFORMATION)

The rank order list of firms selected by the E-A Evaluation Board as most highly qualified is for the internal use of the Department and such information shall at no time be made known to the firms funder consideration or to sany other, non-Governmental source. Information may be released by the Director or Chief of Engineering identifying the E-A selected for negotiation and describing the work in general terms. If negotiations are terminated without consummating a contract the Director or Chief of Engineering may release such information and the name of the firm with which the Government will start new negotiations. When an award has been made, the Department may release this information, giving special notice of the award to any firms interviewed by the E-A Evaluation Board.

IX. DEBRIEFING UNSUCCESSFUL INTERVIEW FIRMS

A. After a contract is awarded, unsuccessful firms that participated in the interviews may be debriefed upon written request of the firm. The debriefing shall be performed



Historic Resources Division

a. Section 304 of the National Historic Preservation Act provides authority for federal agencies to withhold information on the location, character, or ownership of a historic resource if they properly make a determination that such disclosure may cause significant invasion of privacy, risk harm to the resource, of impeded use of a traditional site by practitioners.

The Historic Resources Division, in line with general practice of other Historic Preservation Offices, would like to also withhold this information when such a determination has been properly made. At this time, this would be only for such sites where a federal agency has made a determination – there no authorization for the Historic Resources Division to make its own determinations in existing Guam law.

There have been situations in the past where a federal agency has sought to refuse to give specific site locations to the HRD because they understood that location could not be held confidentially. The federal agencies were worried that with location in the public domain in our files, harm might come to the site in question which is both archaeological site and a nesting site for an endangered species.

Section 304 (16 U.S.C. 4702-3)

The head of any Federal agency, after consultation with the Secretary, shall withhold from disclosure to the public, information relating to the location or character of historic resources whenever the head of the agency or the Secretary determines that the disclosure of such information may create a substantial risk of harm, theft, or destruction to such resources or to the area or place where such resources are located.

- (a) AUTHORITY TO WITHHOLD FROM DISCLOSURE. The head of a Federal agency or other public official receiving grant assistance pursuant to this Act, after consultation with the Secretary, shall withhold from disclosure to the public, information about the location, character, or ownership of a historic resource if the Secretary and the agency determine that disclosure may-
 - (1) cause a significant invasion of privacy;
 - (2) risk harm to the historic resource; or
 - (3) impede the use of a traditional religious site by practitioners.
- (b) ACCESS DETERMINATION.-When the head of a Federal agency or other public official has determined that information should be withheld from the public pursuant to subsection (a), the Secretary, in consultation with such Federal agency head or official, shall determine who may have access to the information for the purpose of carrying out this Act.
- (c) CONSULTATION WITH COUNCIL.—When the information in question has been developed in the course of an agency's compliance with section 106 or 110(f), the Secretary shall consult with the Council in reaching determinations under subsections (a) and (b).

Section 305 (16 U.S.C. 470w-4)

In any civil action brought in any United States district court by any interested person to enforce the provisions of this Act, if such person substantially prevails in such action, the court may award attorneys' fees, expert witness fees, and other costs of participating in such action, as the court deems reasonable.

Section 306 (16 U.S.C. 470w-5)
