

1           **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2           **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** The Sunshine Reform Act  
3 of 1999 became Public Law Number 25-06 on May 12, 1999, changing Guam  
4 statute governing the disclosure of public records. Public Law Number 25-06  
5 requires that each agency submit to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a proposed list of  
6 exemptions to the public disclosure requirement section of the law. In  
7 accordance with §10106(b) of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, as  
8 repealed and reenacted by Public Law Number 25-06, various government  
9 agencies, as contained herein, submitted to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* lists of  
10 documents and information that they would like to see exempted from the  
11 disclosure requirements of the Sunshine Reform Act. Section 10106(b) of Title  
12 5 of the Guam Code Annotated further requires *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to either  
13 approve or disapprove said lists.

14           This Act is intended to *disapprove* all submitted lists from the agencies  
15 identified herein, and specifically approve exemptions contained under  
16 §10108. The disapproval of the submitted lists are *not* intended to disapprove  
17 an exemption created in the Sunshine Reform Act, or as created herein, for the  
18 agencies identified in this Act.

19           **Section 2.** Section 10108(p) is hereby *added* to Article 1, Chapter 10 of  
20 Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, as repealed and reenacted by Public  
21 Law Number 25-06, to read as follows:

22           “(p) For the Supreme and Superior Courts of Guam: (i)  
23           draft/working copies of bench notes, memoranda and opinions  
24           generated by the law clerks, research attorneys, judges and justices of

1 the courts; *and* (ii) notes of the legal impressions of law clerks, attorneys,  
2 judges and justices of cases before the courts, whether pending or  
3 already resolved."

4 **Section 3. *Disapproval of Agency Lists.*** The following agencies'  
5 lists submitted pursuant to §10106(b) of Article 1, Chapter 10 of Title 5 of the  
6 Guam Code Annotated, as repealed and reenacted by Public Law Number 25-  
7 06, are hereby *disapproved*, but shall *not* affect the existing limitations already  
8 contained within the Sunshine Reform Act of 1999, including within §10108,  
9 and their applicability to said agencies:

- 10 (1) the Agency for Human Resources Development;
- 11 (2) the Department of Law;
- 12 (3) the Department of Labor;
- 13 (4) the Supreme Court of Guam;
- 14 (5) the Department of Youth Affairs;
- 15 (6) the Public Defender Service Corporation;
- 16 (7) the Superior Court of Guam; *and*
- 17 (8) the Guam Fire Department.

18 **Section 4.** Section 10108(b) of Article 1, Chapter 10 of Title 5 of the  
19 Guam Code Annotated, as repealed and reenacted by Public Law Number 25-  
20 06, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

21 "(b) Records of complaints to, or investigations conducted by, or  
22 records of intelligence information, or security procedures or  
23 information, of an agency or its personnel."

1           **Section 5. Severability.**    *If* any provision of this Law or its

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 305 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD §10108(p) AND AMEND §10108(b) OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 10 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE SUNSHINE REFORM ACT EXEMPTIONS SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW, THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, THE SUPREME COURT OF GUAM, THE DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH AFFAIRS, THE PUBLIC DEFENDER SERVICE CORPORATION, THE SUPERIOR COURT OF GUAM AND THE GUAM FIRE DEPARTMENT", which I have vetoed.

As the sponsor of the original Sunshine Act, I strongly support effort to promote open government. Nevertheless, reformation of this act will require a serious effort not a shallow one.

Over the last few months, I have often heard it claimed by you and your colleagues that you wish to support open government and strengthen the Sunshine Act. It was therefore surprising to be presented with legislation that does the exact opposite. Section 10108(b) limited the right of inspection for records related to complaints and investigations conducted by the Attorney General's Office and law enforcement agencies. Bill No. 303 would broaden this exemption to include all agencies. Why? Although, it is understandable that this restriction should apply to those agencies involved in criminal investigations; it is questionable as to why public access should be limited beyond this scope. It is even further perplexing as why the Legislature would want to restrict access to information that is currently public. Indeed, this measure raises doubt as to the seriousness with which you and your colleagues addressed the issue of Sunshine Act Reform. The Legislature went through this long drawn-out process of asking every agency to submit lists of


The Committee on Judiciary, Public Safety, Consumer Protection and Human Resources Development hereby requests that you waive the public hearing requirement pursuant to §2103 of Title 2 of the Guam Code Annotated, *Public Hearings Mandatory*, for Bills 303, 304, 305, 306, 307, 308, 309, 310, 311 and 319. All are acts to approve the list of Sunshine Reform Act exemptions submitted by agencies under this Committee's oversight.

§2103 of Title 2 of the Guam Code Annotated, *Public Hearings Mandatory*, waives the requirement for a public hearing if a bill is identical to an earlier introduced bill having a public hearing. The above bill does not meet the letter of this requirement, but the substance of the above bill was discussed in an open, public hearing on August 13, 1999, pursuant to Public Law 25-06. Public Law 25-06 is unclear on the treatment of Sunshine Reform Act exemptions and numerous Committees may be facing the same situation. Therefore, I request that you waive the public hearing requirement for the above bill.

Bill 305: An Act to approve the list of Sunshine Reform Act exemptions submitted by the Agency for Human Resources Development.

**III. BACKGROUND**

The Sunshine Reform Act of 1999 became Public Law 25-06 on May 12, 1999 changing Guam statute governing the disclosure of public records. Public Law 25-06 requires that each agency submit to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* a proposed list of exemptions to the public disclosure requirements. In accordance with §10106(b) of Public Law 25-06, the Agency for Human Resources Development (AHRD), submitted to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* its proposed exemptions from the disclosure requirements of the Sunshine Reform Act.

Public Law 25-06 is unclear on the treatment of Sunshine Reform Act exemptions. While the Act requires a public hearing be held on exemptions to the Act, it does not stipulate how these lists are to be managed. On August 13, 1999 a public hearing was held to publicly discuss the list of exemptions for AHRD. Legal Counsel for *I Liheslaturan Guahan* later advised the Committee to provide these exemptions in bill format, as Legislative Standing Rules restrict *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to entertaining bills and resolutions.

During the public hearing, the Committee scrutinized AHRD's proposed exemptions and instructed AHRD to provide clarification and specific descriptions of proposed exemptions. It is with this information that Bill 305 was drafted and filed with *I Liheslaturan Guahan*. On September 25, 1999, the Committee requested that the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* waive the public hearing requirement for Bill 305, pursuant to §2103, Title 2 of the Guam Code Annotated. While Bill 305 does not meet the letter of this requirement, the substance of the bill was discussed in an open, public hearing; thus, a public hearing on the bill itself would be redundant.

**IV. TESTIMONY**

**Chairman Salas** instructed AHRD to explain each item of their proposed list of exemptions, giving clarification and rationale for inclusion. He noted that he would closely scrutinize the list based on privacy and legal-liability issues. He also noted that the Micronesian Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists (MCSPJ) requested to testify in opposition of P.L. 25-06. Chairman Salas noted, however, that the purpose of the hearing is not to discuss P.L. 25-06, but invited representatives of the organization to testify on the specific list AHRD is presenting during the hearing.

**AHRD Director Juanita Mafnas** and **Acting Deputy Director Jaime Celes** provided testimony on their proposed exemptions. They noted their desire and requested the Committee's support to keep confidential AHRD Client records according to §10108 of P.L. 25-06. AHRD administers federally funded training and employment programs for economically disadvantaged individuals. We are required to identify and document sensitive information to on clients to assist them in overcoming barriers to employment. Much of this information touch on medical issues, financial resources, arrest information, court matters, academic examinations, etc. Due to the nature of this information, prior written consent from client must be obtained before any information is released. The only other allowable access to these records is through court order or competent jurisdiction. She noted that while P.L. 25-06 does not specifically exempt AHRD's records, the information contained in these client records fall within the limitation of exemptions found in

§10108.

**Chairman Salas** noted that while he appreciates the sensitivity of clients' records, AHRD's exemption request is too broad and in danger of misinterpretation, exposing all of the agency's records to public scrutiny. Chairman Salas instructed Director Mafnas to provide a specific listing of documents that AHRD wishes to make exempt from P.L. 25-06. Director Mafnas agreed that a specific list is needed, and acknowledged that a list would be provided to the Committee within 2 weeks.

**V. COMMITTEE FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATION**

The Committee received the list of exemptions from AHRD on September 3, 1999 which is incorporated into the language of Bill 305. The Committee feels that the proposed exemptions are reasonable, and in the best interest of the Agency for Human Resources Development's clients. Therefore, the Committee recommends **TO DO PASS Bill 305**.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. The Sunshine Reform Act  
3 of 1999 became Public Law 25-06 on May 12, 1999 changing Guam statute  
4 governing the disclosure of public records. Public Law 25-06 requires that  
5 each agency submit to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* a proposed list of exemptions to  
6 the public disclosure requirements. In accordance with Section 10106(b) of  
7 Public Law 25-06, the Agency for Human Resources Development, submitted  
8 to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* a list of documents said agency would like to see  
9 exempted from the disclosure requirements of the Sunshine Reform Act.  
10 Section 10106(b) of Public Law 25-06 further requires *I Liheslaturan Guahan*  
11 to either approve or disapprove said list within ninety days after submission.

12 Section 2. The list of proposed exemptions to the Sunshine Reform Act  
13 submitted by the Agency for Human Resources Development is hereby
