Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 408 (COR), "AN ACT *AMEND* §19102 OF CHAPTER 19, DIVISION 3 OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO INCREASING THE STIPENDS FOR NURSING SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS BY 25%", which I have **signed** into law today as **Public Law No. 25-137**.

This legislation increases the current stipend offered by the University of Guam for nursing students. Specifically, the stipends for Freshmen are raised from \$200 to \$250, for Sophomores from \$300 to \$375, for Juniors from \$400 to \$500, and for Seniors and Graduate students from \$500 to \$625.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education held a public hearing on Wednesday, April 12, 2000 at 8:45 a.m. at I Liheslaturan Public Hearing Room.

II. Testimony

Dr. Helen Downey. Dr. Downey spoke in support of Bill No. 408 and suggested the following changes to the Nursing Scholarship Program:

1) That a minimum GPA of 2.7 on a 4 point scale be required for all scholarship candidates.

2) That the program not be restricted to four years for degree completion. This is inline with the UOG Nursing degree program being extended to five years She cited the continual trend of many students being placed in remedial courses often requiring additional time beyond the normal four-year degree program to complete their studies.

3) That the service credit payback be extended from a one-to-one ratio to a two-to-one ratio for every year the scholarship is utilized.

Ms. Joy Haskins. Ms. Haskins whom originally did not intend to testify affirmed Dr. Downey's testimony.

Dr. Jose T. Nededog. Dr. Nededog submitted testimony in support of the Bill and expressed support for Dr. Downey's request for a minimum 2.7 GPA and extension of the scholarship beyond four years.

III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee on Education finds that immediate measures must be taken to enhance both recruitment and retention of nurses on Guam. Bill No. 408 (COR) addresses one critical element of such a program by increasing the stipend level for students accepted into the Nursing Scholarship Program. This would prove to be an added attraction for prospective nursing students and an incentive, as well, for existing students to remain in the program until completion of their studies. The Committee further finds that recommended changes in student GPA and extension of the program beyond four years, while having merit, are issues requiring further study and would best be addressed in another bill. The Committee also substitutes Bill No. 408 (COR) to correct wording in its Title.

It is the recommendation of the Committee on Education that Substitute Bill No. 408 (COR) be reported out with the recommendation **TO DO PASS**.



I am Dr. Helen Downey, Acting Dean of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences.

I am also here on behalf of the President of the University.

I am here to speak on behalf of Bill # 408.

With me is Ms. Joy Haskin, Acting Unit Chair for the Nursing Division. Ms. Haskin is the most recent project director for a longitudinal study titled "Predictors of Success". The Study was designed to identify factors that will predict success of University of Guam Graduates on the National Registered Nurse, Licensing Examination.

Thank you for inviting us and for considering the needs of our nursing students.

I would like to suggest the following items for your consideration as you debate this bill.

1. I recommend that a minimum GPA of 2.7 on a 4 point scale be a prerequisite for consideration of a candidate for this scholarship. This is the minimum GPA identified in the the above mentioned study for individuals who pass the examination on the first attempt

Similar criteria could be identified from High School records for students just beginning the program.
2. I also recommend that the bill be worded in a manner that will allow students more than four years to complete the program as long as they are making satisfactory progress.

Seventy percent of entering UOG students must take developmental math and/or English. By limiting the scholarship to 4 years, students who many need financial assistance the most, may be either dropped from the program in his/her senior year or push through the program too quickly. Neither of these outcomes are beneficial to the student or the community, in the long run.
