**INTRODUCTION**

The Committee on Housing, General Government Services and Foreign Affairs conducted a Public Hearing at 8:30 a.m., on Wednesday, May 26, 1999, in the Public Hearing Room of the Guam Legislature in Hagatna.

**SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY**

Mr. Matthew Johnson of JMC Inc., operates a bar and restaurant within the secured area at the Guam International Airport. According to Mr. Johnson, 95% of his customers are departing travelers who arrive at the airport two hours prior to departure. Peak sales period in the secured departure area is in conflict with current liquor laws. Departures start about 4 a.m., bringing customers in at 2 a.m. Customers request alcoholic beverages, but we are unable to serve them. Needless to say, Mr. Johnson is in favor of Bill No. 201.

Senator Carlotta Leon Guerrero noted that there is curiosity as to why the legislature should allow vendors at the airport this special privilege. Senator Leon Guerrero explained; businesses deprived of selling alcoholic beverages during their peak times, represents a

serious loss of revenue. It is important these businesses do well, the senator noted, because unlike other government agencies, the airport gets a percentage of the business revenue from its concessionaires. Anything the legislature can do to increase the revenue to the airport will help decrease the prices to passengers. With a decrease in cost to the passenger there is an increase in business. Airlines then make more money, and our destination becomes more attractive to travelers.

Mr. Johnson noted that if this bill is passed, he would be adding on two to four new employees. Mr. Johnson also stated that he pays a higher percentage on liquor sales, an additional 5%, which means greater revenues for the airport on the sales of alcoholic beverages.

Vice Speaker Kasperbauer questioned the term "Gaming Zone" in the bill. Senator Leon Guerrero explained that that section has been repealed and that there is legislation being reviewed that will reenact the gaming zone in the security area at the airport. Bill No. 201 is talking about the secured area, she noted.

Vice Speaker Kasperbauer also expressed concern that some passengers may drink too much and not be allowed on the plane, but noted that was equally true for those passengers who leave at 4 p.m. and are currently allowed to drink.

Mr. Johnson pointed out that there is little time for travelers to get too intoxicated, being there is only an hour or hour and a half window for sales. He also noted that Japanese customers find it puzzling they cannot order beer and he has to explain to them that that is law that prohibits sales during certain hours.

Vice Speaker Kasperbauer then asked whether there are restrictions on alcohol at other international airports. Mr. Johnson replied that he was not aware of any. He recently visited the Denver International Airport and was there for an extended period and did not experience any restrictions on the serving of alcoholic beverages during early morning hours.

Senator Moylan noted that the intent on the bill is to carve a unique exception to the rule, because the airport vendors' outbound traffic is grouped in the early morning hours as opposed to being grouped during the midday period. If the schedule were different, Senator Moylan noted, there may not be a need for this bill.

Vice Speaker Kasperbauer also asked that senators keep in mind that they are often criticized for doing things for tourists that we would not do for our own people. He questioned whether there would be pressure on legislators to change statute for all drinking establishments on Guam?

Mr. Johnson responded that he didn't believe that would be a problem, due to the unique nature of the departure lounge...no customers will be leaving the airport and driving home. In this bill, says Johnson, there is no public safety concern since the customers will be leaving on the next plane.

Senator Salas brought up issues concerning the "sterile purchase" of alcohol due to the vendors location in a duty-free zone. He also suggested that Mr. Johnson may be entitled to tax relief for doing business with the government at the airport. Mr. Johnson stated his company currently does not enjoy "sterile purchases" nor do they receive

any tax relief, though he plans to look into the matter. Senator Salas stated his support for the bill.

Senator Salas also commented on the issue of other beverage establishments wanting the same consideration as airport concessionaires because many of them also serve tourists. He drew attention to a court case - Sakimoto vs. Duty Free - in which Sakimoto said it had the right to sell merchandise at the airport, and Duty free said no because they paid for the concession. The court agreed with Duty Free. Any operator under licensed concession, says Senator Salas, is a legalized monopoly endorsed by the government. Duty free a valid reason, and Mr. Johnson has a valid reason for his request.

Senator Moylan again stated that Bill No. 201 is carving a unique exemption to the law because of the unique situation at the airport.

Although not present at the public hearing, written testimony in favor of Bill 201 was provided by Mr. Gerald S.A. Perez from DFS Galleria and is made a part of this Committee Report.

#### **COMMITTEE FINDINGS**

The Committee on Housing, General Government Services and Foreign Affairs finds that current laws prohibiting the sale of alcoholic beverages after certain hours of the day prevent the airport from servicing transiting passengers, who come in at around 2 a.m. awaiting departures, usually scheduled for 4 a.m. As a result, potential revenues are being lost by vendors, the airport, and the government of Guam. The Committee further finds that the present circumstances at the airport prevent enhancement of revenues from its concessionaires which translates to reduced prices to passengers.

#### **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Committee on Housing, General Government Services and Foreign Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 201 to the Twenty-Fifth Guam Legislature with the recommendation **TO DO PASS**.

Dear Senator Leon Guerrero

I am not able to attend the public hearing today regarding Bill 201, relative to the hours of sale of alcoholic beverages at the Guam International Airport Terminal. However, I am writing this letter to express our support for the bill.

The ability to sell alcoholic beverages within the secured area of the airport terminal is consistent with other international airports throughout the Asia Pacific Region. Guam is becoming more of a regional hub for international travelers who arrive from, and depart to, different time zones. Current Guam law restrictions not only inconvenience the traveling public, but impairs the ability of certain businesses to maximize airport revenues.

Since people buying alcoholic beverages in the secured area will not immediately be driving on Guam's roadways, and since businesses in the airport are obligated to maximize revenues for the public benefit, I would urge the Legislature's favorable disposition on this measure.

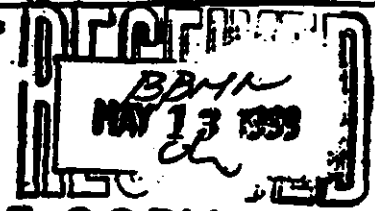
