Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 087 (COR) entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND §22205 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO REPEAL AND REENACT §2 OF P.L. 26-02, TO REPEAL AND REENACT §21 OF P.L. NO. 25-176, RELATIVE TO EXEMPTING THE DIVISION OF VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION FROM CENTRAL ACCOUNTING AND FOR FIGHTING THE ORDOT DUMP FIRE" which I have signed into law as Public Law No. 26-06.

Thank you for the corrections to Bill No. 54, now embodied in this legislation, which will allow us to expend at least \$125,000 from the Tourist Attraction Fund for fighting the ongoing Ordodump fire.

This funding will not cover the entire expenses that are projected to put the fire under control, but is a welcome introduction to responding to the immediate needs of the people in the Ordod-Chalan Pago area and other smoke infested areas. As pointed out in previous transmittal letter for vetoed Bill No. 54, it is estimated that the Ordod dump fire will take at least a week, probably about 9 days, to fully respond to, and it costs approximately a little less than \$20,000 per day to respond to this fire.

The main body of Bill No. 87 still contains an exemption for the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, which is a subdivision of a line agency of the government, DISID, from the General Accounting Act of the government of Guam. As previously stated in the veto message to Bill No. 54, this would be exempting a Division, within a line agency, from having funds accounted for by the Department of Administration. This is not practical, since the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation is not ultimately responsible for the misuse of funds; the government of Guam is responsible. For example, in computing disallowed costs, the Division should not attempt to separate itself from the responsible party, the government. Additionally, the Division does not

have personnel and other resources to set up its own separate accounting system, as would be the case with an autonomous agency. In fact, they would have to work manually to account for the funds.

It is recommended that i Liheslaturan Guåhan reconsider the amendment made in Section 2 of Bill No. 87, which is not practical or reasonable for the handling of funds for which the government is responsible.





**AN ACT TO AMEND §22205 OF TITLE 5 OF THE

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the
3 Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (“DVR”) is supported primarily by
4 Federal funds, requiring strict adherence to Federal reporting requirements.
5 *Prior to* enactment of the Central Accounting Act, these Federal requirements
6 were met effectively by the DVR staff.

7 Subsequent to the reorganization entitled, “*The Department of Integrated*
8 *Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID)*,” the reporting has been
9 centralized at the Department of Administration (“DOA”) pursuant to the
10 Central Accounting Act of the government of Guam. Centralized accounting
11 has resulted in problems with the reporting, and as a result, DVR has been
12 deemed by the Federal government to be a “high risk grantee,” due to their
13 failure to submit the required reports, or to report in compliance with all
14 mandates.

15 It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to ensure prompt and
16 complete Federal reimbursement of local fund expenditures by DVR, by
17 returning the authority and mandate of DVR accounting *directly* to DVR,
18 which has the ability and experience to, by way of a separate accounting
19 system, comply with the Federal reporting requirements.

20 **Section 2.** Section 22205 of Article 2, Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 5 of
21 the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

22 **“Section 22205. Exceptions.** The provisions of this Act shall
23 *not* apply to the accounting operations of the Guam Waterworks
24 Authority, the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Telephone Authority,

1 the Guam International Airport Authority, the Guam Housing and
2 Urban Renewal Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation, the Guam
3 Economic Development Authority, the Judicial Branch, the Legislative
4 Branch, the Guam Community College, the Department of Education,
5 the University of Guam, the Guam Mass Transit Authority *and* the
6 Division of Vocational Rehabilitation.”

7 **Section 3.** Section 2 of Public Law Number 26-02 is hereby *repealed and*
8 *reenacted* to read as follows:

9 **“Section 2. Appropriation Authorization.** To provide for
10 expenditures incurred in fighting, controlling and extinguishing the fire
11 at the Department of Public Work’s Dededo Solid Waste Transfer
12 Station on or about March 11, 2001, and for providing for emergency
13 services to care for citizens who may have had to be evacuated as a
14 result of said fire, the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars
15 (\$100,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
16 Department of Military Affairs, Office of Civil Defense, for the purpose
17 of reimbursing agencies and departments which may have incurred
18 expenditures as a result of the declaration of emergency. Any
19 unexpended amount from this appropriation shall be available for the
20 purposes of funding expenditures incurred in fighting, controlling and
21 extinguishing the fire at the Ordot Dump on or about May 14, 2001, and
22 for providing for emergency services for citizens who may have had to
23 be evacuated as a result of said fire.”

24 **Section 4.** Section 21 of Public Law Number 25-176 is hereby *repealed*
25 *and reenacted* to read as follows:

1 **"Section 21. Appropriation to the Guam Visitors Bureau.**

2 The sum of Two Hundred Eighty-five Thousand Dollars (\$285,000.00) is
3 hereby appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Guam
4 Visitors Bureau for the following:

5 (a) Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) shall be used
6 for the specific purpose of supplementing Guam's participation in
7 the 2001 IJSBA U.S. Pro Watercross Racing Tour and the 2001
8 IJSBA Skat-Trak World Championships;

9 (b) One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00)
10 shall be used for the specific purpose of professionally producing
11 a promotional video of the Guam Smokin' Wheels Off-Road Races;
12 *and*

13 (c) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for the
14 specific purposes of designing the renovation, improvement and
15 upgrade of the Joseph Flores Memorial Park (Ypao Beach Park).
16 The government of Guam shall *not* enter into any contracts
17 involving a public-private partnership, nor renovate, improve or
18 upgrade the Ypao Beach Park, without the *prior* approval of *I*
19 *Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Any contracts which attempt to form a
20 public-private partnership, or renovate, improve or upgrade the
21 Ypao Beach Park, shall be void *ab initio*.

22 The funds appropriated herein shall be used for the purpose
23 described and shall *not* be used for any other project of the Guam
24 Visitors Bureau.

1 Within ninety (90) days following the completion of the programs
2 outlined in Subsections (a), (b) and (c), the Guam Visitors Bureau shall
3 submit a report to *I Maga'Lahen Guahan*, the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan*
4 *Guahan* and the Chairman of the Legislative Committee having
5 oversight of the Tourist Attraction Fund, a complete accounting of
6 expenditures incurred. Any unexpended funds shall be returned to the
7 Fund."

8 **Section 5. Ordot Dump Fire Appropriation.** There is hereby
9 appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund the sum of One Hundred
10 Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) to the Department of Military
11 Affairs, Office of Civil Defense, for the purposes of: (i) funding expenditures
12 incurred in fighting, controlling and extinguishing the fire at the Ordot Dump
13 on or about May 14, 2001; (ii) for providing for emergency services for citizens
14 who may have had to be evacuated as a result of said fire; *and* (iii) for daily air
15 quality testing and monitoring as may be necessary.

16 **Section 6. Reporting Requirement.** *I Maga'lahen Guahan* shall
17 prepare, or have prepared, a report *no later than* thirty (30) days after the
18 enactment of this Act on all transfers, expenditures and reimbursements by all
19 and any agency(ies) or department(s), directly related to the fighting,
20 controlling and extinguishing of the fire at the Ordot Dump.

21 **Section 7. Prior Expenses Incurred for Ordot Dump Fire.**
22 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the appropriations made in §3 of
23 this Act may be used to cover any Ordot Dump fire emergency expenses
24 incurred *prior to* the enactment date of this Act.

24 enactment of this Act on all transfers, expenditures and reimbursements by all
25 and any agency or department, directly related to the fighting, controlling and
26 extinguishing of the fire at the Ordot Dump.

2 appropriations made in Section 3 of this Act may be used to cover any Ordot
3 Dump fire emergency expenses incurred prior to enactment date.

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 87 is **substantially the same** as Bill No. 54, for which the Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs held a public hearing on Monday, April 23, 2001 at 2:00 p.m. at the Conference Room, Office of Senator Mark Forbes, and on Friday, May 11, 2001 at 10:00 a.m. at the Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guahan. Public Notice was advertised on the Pacific Daily News on Wednesday, 4/18/01 and Saturday, 4/21/01.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals appearing before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill are as follows:

Albert San Agustin, Administrator, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, (Oral & Written testimony)
Rita Sotomayer, Administrative Service Officer, D.I.S.I.D. (Oral testimony)

Albert San Agustin, administrator of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, D.I.S.I.D., testified before the Committee **in favor of the bill**. San Agustin said that the Department of Administration has lagged significantly in its financial reports to RSA, resulting in a jeopardizing of federal reimbursement funds of about \$4 million. DOA has also submitted financial reports containing **numerous errors**, according to San Agustin, who recommends that DVR be allowed to submit its own reports to RSA.

Rita Sotomayer, Administrative Service Officer of D.I.S.I.D., testified before the Committee on the bill. Sotomayer said that the Department has met with DOA several times, along with people from Region 9, to get DOA to become more timely and accurate in its financial reports for DVR. However, DVR isn't DOA's priority. Since DOA doesn't keep up with federal rules, they don't complete the reports correctly, Sotomayer said.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs finds that Bill No. 87, is needed to allow the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation to submit financial reports to the federal government correctly and in a timely fashion, thereby ensuring that federal funds continue to come to Guam for this important program. It will also remove red tape from the division so that it can purchase items for its clients that are direly needed.

Accordingly, the Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs, to which Bill No. 87 was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Sais Na Liheslaturan Guahan **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 87**, "Act to amend 5 GCA, Chapter 22, Article 22, §22205 to exempt the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation from Central Accounting."

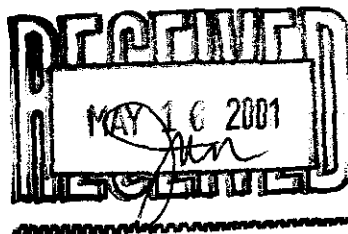

Bill #54

The Central Accounting Act (P.L. 13-96) empowered the Director of Administration to establish and administer a central accounting agency for the efficient management of a system of accounts. He shall maintain all federal grant award funds including maintenance of encumbrances and expenditure, and obtain reports as are required for the effective administration of a central accounting system.

In order to accomplish P.L. 13-96, The Director of Administration centralized the supporting accounting technicians from the various line agencies to the Dept. of Administration. However, DVR accounting staff was exempted from the transfer of its staff to the DOA. This act was to ensure the accounting and reporting integrity of fiscal reports to RSA.

The use of indirect service charges were authorized to DOA in the provision of payroll, personnel, and related services.

Subsequently, DOA assumed the position that financial reports to the federal government remain the responsibility of DOA.

Generally, DOA accounting system are behind 1-2 months and updated before the beginning of the ensuing fiscal year. However, for the period of 1992-1995, financial reports to RSA lagged significantly behind and remained unaudited annually pursuant to federal requirements. This situation became the basis for Guam as a high risk grantee under RSA.

The RSA in 1995 financed four (4) officials from GovGuam to Washington, D.C. to resolve the financial reporting requirements. The direct result brought all RSA reports up to date as of 1995.

Unfortunately, DOA continued to send delayed reports which put Guam DVR in jeopardy of RSA reimbursement funds to the tune of four (4) million dollars.

In order to maintain DVR's relationship with RSA, DVR fiscal staff started to submit its expenditures report directly to RSA. The DVR submission became the foundation for draw down and reimbursement of local funds from RSA.

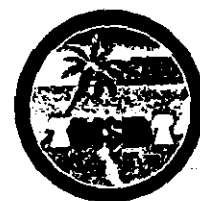
DOA, however, reminded DVR that DOA was the official agency to report financial reports to RSA and that GovGuam would not be held responsible for financial errors. DVR deferred to DOA.

Because of the negative publicity, DOA submitted its updated financial report with the knowledge that it contained numerous errors. DVR initiated its own financial report to RSA as an alternative for RSA to consider.

DOA is willing to concede that DVR submit its own financial report on the condition that DVR staff learn the oracle system. We accept the challenge of submitting our own fiscal report, but we find the learning of the oracle to be counter productive.

We support the fiscal intent of Bill #54 on the premise that the submission of fiscal reports by DOA to RSA as a non-priority item. The accounting staff at DOA are constantly reassigned to greater priorities. Bill #54 will also address the high risk issue.


