



1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** Section 22102 of Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 19 of the
3 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

4 **“Section 22102. Purpose.** The Agency for Human Resources
5 Development will be responsible for the coordination of manpower
6 needs, assessment and employment programs funded under the
7 provisions of local and Federal statutes. This responsibility shall *not* be
8 construed to deny any other entity of the government of Guam from
9 carrying out its regularly assigned functions.

10 The Agency may be responsible, *if mutually selected* by the
11 Workforce Investment Board and *I Maga’lahen Guåhan*, for the
12 administration of workforce development programs pursuant to the
13 Workforce Investment Act of 1998, more commonly known as ‘WIA,’
14 and Welfare-to-Work, more commonly known as ‘WtW.’

15 The administration of WIA and WtW shall be in accordance with
16 applicable local and Federal statutes, policies, regulations and
17 guidelines. The Director shall be responsible for compliance with all
18 Federal requirements pertaining to the methods and standards of
19 administration required for receipt from the Federal government of
20 funds for WIA and WtW, and such administrative costs as are provided
21 in connection therewith.

22 The Agency for Human Resources Development is also authorized
23 to seek, apply and otherwise obtain funds from the Federal government,
24 and from private and other sources for use in manpower and other

1 programs which fall within the purpose and functions of the Agency as
2 provided herein."

3 **Section 2.** Section 22105 of Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 19 of the
4 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

5 "Section 22105. **Employment.** The Director, *subject* to the
6 approval of *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*, may employ a Deputy Director and
7 Private Secretary. All employees of the Agency for Human Resources
8 Development, *except* the Director, Deputy Director, Private Secretary,
9 provisional employees and others hired by contract, shall be members of
10 the classified service of the government of Guam.

11 The employees of the Agency shall be members of the
12 Government of Guam Retirement Fund, *subject* to provisions of 4 G.C.A.
13 §8105. The Agency shall contribute to the Government of Guam
14 Retirement Fund on the basis of annual billings as determined by the
15 Board of Trustees of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund for the
16 employers' share of the cost of the retirement benefits applicable to the
17 Agency's employees and their beneficiaries. The Agency shall
18 contribute to the Workers' Compensation Fund on the basis of annual
19 billings, as determined by the Workers' Compensation Commissioner,
20 with the benefits payment made from such fund on account of the
21 employees of the Agency. Employees of the Agency shall also be
22 eligible to participate in any government of Guam health and life
23 insurance or prepaid health plan."

24 **Section 3.** Section 22107 of Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 19 of the
25 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

1 **"Section 22107. Effective Date and Transfer.** On the effective
2 date of this Act, all working capital, accounts payable and receivables,
3 and all books, records, applications, assets, liabilities, agreements,
4 privileges and employees of the Agency for Human Resources
5 Development presently existing pursuant to Executive Order Numbers
6 77-6, 83-14, 83-19 and 99-13, shall be transferred to the Agency for
7 Human Resources Development established under this Chapter.

8 Any person accepting employment under this Section, *excluding*
9 the Director, Deputy Director and Private Secretary will receive *not less*
10 *than* the rate of compensation that person was receiving immediately
11 before the transfer date. The other employment benefits and rights shall
12 be governed under §§22104 and 23015 of this Chapter."

13 **Section 4.** Section 22110 of Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 19 of the
14 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

15 **"Section 22110. Guam Workforce Investment Board.** The Guam
16 Workforce Investment Board shall have the same authority and
17 functions with respect to programs administered pursuant to this
18 Chapter, as that provided in the Workforce Investment Act, Public Law
19 Number 105-220."

20 **Section 5.** Section 22111 of Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 19 of the
21 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *repealed*.

22 **Section 6.** Section 22112 of Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 19 of the
23 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

24 **"Section 22112. Administrative Limitations and Appropriations.**

1 The sum of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) is hereby authorized to be
2 appropriated from the General Fund to the Agency for Human
3 Resources Development for the purpose of administering job training
4 and employment-related services, consistent with those authorized
5 under WIA and WtW. These services, *however*, shall be restricted to
6 those individuals in need of, but who do *not* meet Federal eligibility
7 standards and requirements for, job training and employment-related
8 services pursuant to provisions of Public Law Number 105-220. The
9 Agency for Human Resources Development is authorized to expend *not*
10 *more than* ten percent (10%) of this appropriation for administrative
11 purposes.”

2 **Section 1.** Section 22102 of Chapter 22, Division 2 of Title 19 of the

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs held a public hearing on Tuesday, February 6, 2001 at 10:00 a.m. at the Conference Room, Office of Senator Mark Forbes, I Liheslaturan Guahan. Public Notice was advertised on the Pacific Daily News on Friday, 01/26/01, Saturday, 02/03/01, Monday, 02/05/01 and Tuesday, 02/06/01.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals appearing before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill are as follows:

Sheila Torres, Director, Agency for Human Resources Development (Oral and written testimony)

Ms. Sheila Torres presented written testimony to the committee, which she also gave orally. She also presented the committee with figure sheets on the subject of personnel staffing and appropriated funding for the agency.

Sen. Brown asked Ms. Torres if the Administrative Secretary described in the bill is an authorized position that is funded and germane to Bill 18. Sen. Brown inquired of Ms. Torres the breakdown of funding for the Administrative Office positions.

Ms. Torres provided a breakdown of the funding percentages of the agency, GovGuam shares and Federal Program shares. She said that WIA is an annual funded program that requires the government share to be sufficiently funded prior to the renewal of this federally funded program.

Senator Forbes inquired about statistical percentages of the WIA in regards to job performance success and the rate of achievable goal outcomes. Sen. Forbes asked if AHRD has tracked the longevity of worker placement by the agency.

Ms. Torres said that the appropriation from the federal government is not measured by job performance indicators, such as the longevity of worker placement, and said that the WIA does not mandate this requirement for a full term contract.

The committee further inquired about the performance of AHRD in regards to worker placement of unemployed residents of Guam and probed on the impact from non-resident job-seekers. The committee was informed that although residents may not find the proper job here on Guam, the acquired skills are of reciprocal value in the United States.

Sen. Forbes asked Ms. Tores if there is an accountability of tracking the funding for the agency for the first sixty-five (65) days and at which he was assured by Ms. Torres that there is accountability within the agency.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs finds that Bill No. 18 is of critical importance in which the intent is to provide sufficient funding to meet the criteria for federal funding under the WIA and WTW contracts, both which are annually funded programs. In addition to changing the name of the program, which was previously called the Job Training Partnership Act to current Workforce Investment Act and Welfare to Work, Bill 18 also clarifies the job classification of a secretary to private secretary for the purposes of consistency in the staffing patterns as required by law. The committee further finds that because of the time sensitivity of this measure, that the thoroughness of evaluating the program for accountability on its funding is of importance given that the federal government doesn't require a job performance evaluation unlike the government of Guam on the appropriated local funding of this program.

Accordingly, the Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs, to which Bill No. 18 was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Sais Na Liheslaturan Guahan **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 18** "An Act to Amend Various Statutes Relative to the Agency for Human Resources Development in Order to Conform with the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (WIA) and the Welfare-to-Work Act (WTW)."

TESTIMONY ON BILL 18

“AN ACT TO AMEND VARIOUS STATUTES RELATIVE TO THE AGENCY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT IN ORDER TO CONFORM WITH THE WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT OF 1998 (WIA) AND THE WELFARE TO WORK ACT (WTW)

Buenas yan Good morning!

Chairman and members of Committee on Rules, General Government Operations, Reorganization and Reform and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs

My name is Sheila Torres, Director of Agency for Human Resources Development (AHRD). I support Bill 18. The Agency administers the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 and the Welfare to Work program authorized under the Social Security Balanced Budget Act of 1997. The goals of the programs are; to increase the employment, retention and earnings of participants, acquire occupational skills and work ethics to attain long-term unsubsidized employment, improve the quality of the workforce, reduce welfare dependency and gain self-sufficiency.

WIA replaced the Jobs Training Partnership Act. WIA mandates that services be delivered through a one-stop system. The services will include core, intensive and training. There are three funding streams; youth, adult and dislocated worker. The act will pave the way to enhance existing federal programs. The key principles are; streamlining services, empower individuals, provide universal access, increased accountability and flexibility.

Section 1 of bill 18 designates the Agency to administer the WIA and WTW programs and to comply with federal and local statutes.

Section 4 amends the Guam Job Training Coordinating Council to the Guam Workforce Investment Board, the act also mandates that a board is created and comprised of majority private sector and other agency partners that provide employment and training services.

Section 6 provides for local funding to be appropriated to provide services for non-eligible WIA or WTW participants.

In closing the Act provides powerful tools to steer the direction of programs to achieve desired outcomes. The Guam Workforce Investment Board will need the assistance of the community to develop a comprehensive workforce development system. To fail to meet this challenge is not only a lost opportunity but may endanger future public and political support for employment and training programs and most of all not provide the people of Guam a better life.

AN ACT TO AMEND VARIOUS STATUTES RELATIVE TO THE
AGENCY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT IN ORDER
TO CONFORM WITH THE WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT OF
1998 (WIA) AND THE WELFARE-TO-WORK ACT (WTW).

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 **Section 1. Amendment of purpose of agency.** §22102 of Title 19, Guam Code
3 Annotated, is amended to read:

4 “§22102. Purpose. The Agency for Human Resources Development will be responsible
5 for the coordination of manpower needs, assessment and employment programs funded under the
6 provisions of local statutes and of federal statutes. This responsibility shall not be construed to
7 deny any other entity of the government of Guam from carrying out its regularly assigned
8 functions.

9 The Agency may be responsible, if mutually selected by the ~~{Private Industry Council}~~
10 Workforce Investment Board and the Governor, for the administration of ~~[the service-delivery~~
11 ~~area] workforce development~~ programs pursuant to ~~[Job Training Partnership Act of 1982, more~~
12 ~~commonly known as JTPA]~~ the Workforce Investment Act of 1998, more commonly known as
13 WIA, and Welfare-to-Work, more commonly known as WtW. The administration of ~~{JTPA}~~
14 WIA and WtW shall be in accordance with applicable local and federal statutes, policies,
15 regulations and guidelines. The Director shall be responsible for compliance with all federal
16 requirements pertaining to the methods and standards of administration required for receipt from

1 the federal government of funds for ~~{JTPA}~~ WIA and WtW and such administrative costs as are
2 provided in connection therewith.

3 The Agency for Human Resources Development is also authorized to seek, apply, and
4 otherwise obtain funds from the federal government and from private and other sources for use
5 in manpower and other programs which fall within the purpose and functions of the Agency as
6 provided herein.”

7 **Section 2. Amendment of reference to an employment position for consistency.**
8 §22105 of Title 19, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

9 “§22105. Employment. The Director, subject to the approval of the Governor, may
10 employ a Deputy Director and a Private Secretary. All employees of the Agency for Human
11 Resources Development, except the Director, Deputy Director, Private Secretary, Provisional
12 Employees and others hired by contract shall be members of the classified service of the
13 government of Guam.

14 The employees of the Agency shall be members of the Government of Guam Retirement
15 Fund subject to provisions of 4 GCA §8105. The Agency shall contribute to the Government of
16 Guam Retirement Fund on the basis of annual billings as determined by the Board of Trustees,
17 Government of Guam Retirement Fund, for the employers’ share of the cost of the retirement
18 benefits applicable to the Agency’s employees and their beneficiaries. The Agency shall
19 contribute to the Workers’ Compensation Fund on the basis of annual billings as determined by
20 the Workers’ Compensation Commissioner with the benefits payment made from such fund on
21 account of the employees of the Agency. Employees of the Agency shall also be eligible to
22 participate in any government of Guam health and life insurance or prepaid health plan.”

23 **Section 3. Inclusion of provisions of Executive Order No. 99-13.** §22107 of Title
24 19, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

25 “§22107. Effective Date and Transfer. On the effective date of this Act, all working
26 capital, accounts payable and receivable, all books, records, applications, assets, liabilities,
27 agreements, privileges and employees of the Agency for Human Resources Development

1 presently existing pursuant to Executive Order Numbers 77-6, 83-14, ~~and~~ 83-19, and 99-13
2 shall be transferred to the Agency for Human Resources Development established under this
3 Chapter.

4 Any person accepting employment under this section, excluding the Director, Deputy
5 Director and Private Secretary will receive not less than the rate of compensation he was
6 receiving immediately before the transfer date. The other employment benefits and rights shall be
7 governed under §§22104 and 23105 of this Chapter.”

8 **Section 4. Change of name of Council.** §22110 of Title 19, Guam Code Annotated,
9 is amended to read:

10 “§22110. ~~{Guam Job Training Coordinating Council}~~ Guam Workforce Investment Board.
11 The ~~{Guam Job Training Coordinating Council}~~ Guam Workforce Investment Board shall have
12 the same authority and functions with respect to programs administered pursuant to this Chapter,
13 as that provided in the ~~{Job Training Partnership Act of 1982, P.L. 97-300}~~ Workforce
14 Investment Act, Public Law 105-220.”

15 **Section 5. Deletion of former Private Industry Council.** §22111 of Title 19,
16 Guam Code Annotated, is repealed.

17 **Section 6. Change of references.** §22112 of Title 19, Guam Code Annotated, is
18 amended to read:

19 “§22112. Administrative Limitations and Appropriations. The sum of One
20 Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the General
21 Fund to the Agency for Human Resources Development for the purpose of
22 administering job training and employment related services consistent with those
23 authorized under ~~{FFPA}~~ WIA and WtW. These services, however, shall be restricted
24 to those individuals in need of, but who do not meet federal eligibility standards and
25 requirements for, job training and employment related services pursuant to provisions
26 of ~~{P.L. 97-300}~~ Public Law 105-220. The Agency for Human Resources Development is

- 1 authorized to expend not more than ten percent (10%) of this appropriation for
- 2 administrative purposes."
