Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Bill No. 037 (COR) entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND §19103 OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING PARITY AND CONSISTENCY WITH OTHER FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS BY EXTENDING THE NURSING SCHOLARSHIP QUALIFICATIONS TO INCLUDE PERMANENT RESIDENT ALIENS" which I have signed into law as Public Law No. 26-09.

This legislation amends the code section providing for nursing scholarships at the University of Guam (UOG), so that individuals who have lived on Guam for at least One (1) year and are permanent resident aliens may qualify for a nursing scholarship.

It was pointed out at the public hearing on this bill that other scholarship programs at the UOG are offered to permanent resident aliens as well as to U.S. citizens, and that , considering our current nursing shortage, that the nursing program should also be available to this group.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** Section 19103 of Chapter 19, Division 3 of Title 17 of the

3 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

1 **“Section 19103. Selection of Trainees.** The program shall be
2 open to any student who has completed high school, or is otherwise
3 declared by the University of Guam as eligible for admission to the
4 program; who is a United States citizen or permanent resident alien; *and*
5 who has been a resident of Guam for *at least* one (1) year *prior to* the
6 beginning of the academic semester or term the student is admitted,
7 registered and enrolled in the program. The number of trainees who
8 may enroll in the program annually shall be limited *only* by the capacity
9 of the University of Guam and by funds made available to it by annual
10 appropriation. In the event of limited space and/or funds, priority shall
11 be given to students at the highest level of training and closest to the
12 completion of their program. No student may receive stipends beyond
13 the number of calendar years normally required to complete a training
14 program.”

15 **Section 2. Extension of Application Deadline.**

16 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, administrative rule, or
17 Board policy, the application deadline for enrollment in the Fall, 2001
18 semester for applicants affected by the change authorized by §1 of this Act
19 shall be the longer of, a period of fifteen (15) days beyond the date of
20 enactment of this Act *or* the actual deadline set by the University of Guam.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education held a public hearing on Thursday, April 19, 2001 at 1:30 p.m. at I Liheslaturan Guåhan Public Hearing Room.

II. Testimony

Dr. Roy T. Tsuda: Dr. Tsuda testified in favor of the passage of Bill No. 37. Dr. Tsuda emphatically stated that he saw "no rational basis for the exclusion of permanent resident aliene under the Nursing Training Program". Dr. Tsuda noted that permanent resident aliens had been eligible for all programs under the University's Student Financial Assistance (17GCA Ch.15). Since the Chapter was created. He advised the Committee that passage of Bill No. 37 will not only provide "parity and consistency" with other programs but will also provide fairness.

Dr. Arthur A. Jackson: Dr. Jackson testified in favor of the passage of Bill No. 37. Dr. Jackson pointed out that other scholarship programs on Guam as well as in the US mainland provide for the inclusion of permanent resident aliens. He also affirmed his support of Dr. Tsuda's testimony.

Dr. Maureen Fochtman: Dr. Fochtman testified in favor of the passage of Bill No. 37 by affirming her support of Dr. Tsuda's testimony. Dr. Fochtman noted that inclusion would help a great deal in the College's (College of Nursing) efforts to alleviate Guam's critical nursing shortage.

III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee finds that Bill No. 37 (COR) will allow permanent resident aliens to be eligible for the Nursing Training Scholarship program as authorized by 17GCA Ch.19. The Committee recognizes that it's not the norm just on Guam to include permanent residents in student financial aid offerings, but the norm throughout the entire nation as well. Permanent resident aliens, as with US Citizens in program, must complete nursing employment service credit on Guam to repay the cost of the education.

It is the recommendation of the Committee on Education that Bill No. 37 (COR) be reported out with the recommendation **TO DO PASS.**

The University of Guam and the College of Nursing support the addition of "permanent resident alien" as a qualifying criterion for the selection of trainees under the Nursing Training Program contained in Chapter 19 of 17 GCA. 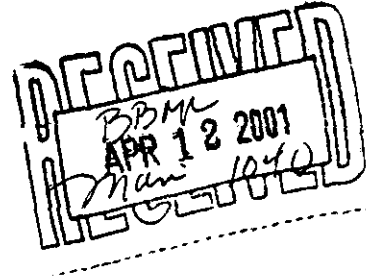
The proposed Bill is administrative in nature and does not entail a fiscal impact. It basically extends program eligibility to permanent resident aliens.

'Boil water' notice still in effect

RESIDENTS in Chalan Pago, Sinajana, Afame, and Hagatna must continue to boil their water, as Guam Waterworks Authority crews work to clean the contaminated water, said Ray Arceo, Acting waterworks spokesman.

"We are continuing the boil water notice," Arceosaid. "We are working hand in hand with the Guam Environmental Protection Agency to develop and implement more rigorous testing programs for both the bacteria and the chlorine residual levels island wide, particularly the Sinajana, Ordot and Hagatna areas, to include Afame."

According to news files, the Guam Environmental Protection Agency found traces of fecal coliform and E. coli bacteria in the water on March 13, and advised residents of the villages to boil their tap water before consuming it.

The source of the bacteria is still unknown, but Guam EPA officials suspect it came from the raw sewage overflow from the Chaot pump station in Sinajana, the news files state.


