Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 042 (LS) entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND §8134(a) OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO SURVIVOR ANNUITIES" which I have signed into law as Public Law No. 26-10.

Current law provides for survivor annuities for children of deceased Government of Guam Retirement Fund members who are under the age of 18 at the time of the death of the member. In fact, if the child is under the age of 18 at the time of the death of the parent, the child may continue to qualify as long as they are in school full time, up to the age of 24.

The change in this legislation authorizes children who are still attending high school at the time of the death of the member-parent, and who are over the age of 18, to also continue to qualify as long as they are in school full time, up to the age of 24. This would apply to that small group of high school students who turn 18 prior to their graduation and who lose a parent prior to their graduation.



# AN ACT TO AMEND §8134(a) OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO SURVIVOR ANNUITIES.

#### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Section 8134(a) of Article 1, Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam
- 3 Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:
- 4 "Section 8134. Survivor Annuities.

- (a) Payment to Surviving Spouse and Minor Children of a Member. Upon death of a member, while in service, having completed *at least* three (3) years of total service, *if* a surviving spouse or minor children survive the member, the following annuities shall be payable:
  - (1) If a spouse survives, an annuity shall begin as of the date of the death of the member. The annuity shall terminate upon the death of the surviving spouse or upon remarriage of a spouse under the age of forty (40) years, whichever event first occurs; provided, that if remarriage occurs at age forty (40) or over, this restriction shall not be applicable.
  - (2) If both the surviving spouse and minor child or children under age eighteen (18), or child or children over age eighteen (18) attending high school as of the date of the death of the member, survive the member, an annuity shall begin *immediately* upon death of the member. *Except* as provided for in Paragraph (4) of this Subsection, the allowance for a minor child or children shall be payable until the child's or children's:
    - (i) attainment of age eighteen (18) or graduation from high school, whichever occurs later;
      - (ii) marriage; or
      - (iii) death, whichever first occurs.

Except as provided for in Paragraph (4) of this Subsection, in the case of a child or children over age eighteen (18) attending high school as of the date of the death of the member, the allowance shall be payable until the child's or children's graduation from high school, marriage or death, whichever occurs first. The annuity of the surviving spouse shall terminate upon the death or upon remarriage of a spouse under the age of forty (40) years, whichever first occurs; provided, however, that if remarriage occurs at age forty (40) or over, this restriction shall not be applicable.

- (3) Except as provided for in Paragraph (4) of this Subsection, if a minor child or children under age eighteen (18) survive a member and no parent of such child or children is living, an annuity on account of any child or children shall be payable until the child's:
  - (i) attainment of age eighteen (18) or graduation from high school, whichever occurs later;
    - (ii) marriage; or
    - (iii) death, whichever first occurs.

Except as provided for in Paragraph (4) of this Subsection, in the case of a child or children over age eighteen (18) attending high school as of the date of the death of the member, the allowance shall be payable until

the child's or children's graduation from high school, marriage or death, whichever occurs first.

(4) Payment of the annuity or allowance for a minor child or children, or child or children over age eighteen (18) attending high school provided for under Paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Section may be continued *up to* twenty-four (24) years of age, *if* such minor child or children are full-time, undergraduate students in an accredited college or university, or educational institution."

**Section 2.** Any child who survives a member who, as of the date of the death of the member is a full-time student, is under the age of twenty-four (24) years, *and* has been continuously enrolled as a full-time student since the death of the member shall be eligible for a survivor annuity until determined ineligible according to the provisions of this Act.

**Section 3. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
