Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds

The *only* question of law and fact in determining guilt for unlawful solicitation under this Subsection shall be whether goods, merchandise or tickets were tendered or offered for sale, or whether a contribution was solicited, in violation of the restrictions set forth above.

(b) No person shall stand on or in proximity of any highway for the purpose of soliciting the washing, watching or guarding of any vehicle while parked, or about to be parked, on a highway. The *only* question of law or fact in determining guilt for unlawful


