**AN ACT TO ADD §834 TO ARTICLE 1 OF TITLE 1 OF

PORT.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds

that the late Senator Jose D. Leon Guerrero served the people of Guam honorably in both the Guam Congress and First Guam Legislature. After serving in both in the Guam Congress and the Guam Legislature, he also served in other capacities such as: Administrative Assistant for the Department of Finance, Assistant Director of Commerce, Director of Commerce, Chief of Customs and Director of the Commercial Port. His leadership and dedication to serving the people of Guam also extended into his involvement in numerous civic and community based organizations.

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to commemorate and honor the memory and contributions of the late Jose D. Leon Guerrero by renaming the Port Authority of Guam to the "Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port."

Section 2. Section 834 is hereby added to Chapter 8, Article 1 of Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

1 **“Section 834. Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port.** The Port
2 Authority of Guam, located at Apra Harbor, shall hereafter be known as the “Jose D.
3 Leon Guerrero Commercial Port.” Any provisions in the laws of Guam referring to
4 the Port Authority of Guam are hereby deemed to read the “Jose D. Leon Guerrero
5 Commercial Port.” *I Maga’lahen Guåhan*, and the General Manager of the Port
6 Authority of Guam shall cause to be erected appropriate nameplates or signs
7 designating the Port Authority of Guam as the “Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial
8 Port.” Furthermore, at such ceremony as *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* and the General
9 Manager of the Port Authority of Guam deem appropriate, the “Jose D. Leon
10 Guerrero Commercial Port” shall be officially named and a plaque bearing the name,
11 picture and brief history of the contributions made by the late Jose D. Leon Guerrero
12 shall be affixed within a suitable spot at, in or around the port authority building.




I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs held a public hearing on Friday, March 2, 2001 at 2:00 p.m. at the Conference Room, Office of Senator Mark Forbes, I Liheslaturan Guahan. Public Notice was advertised on the Pacific Daily News on Wednesday, 2/21/01, Thursday, 3/1/01 and Friday, 3/2/01.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals appearing before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill are as follows:

Manny Duenas, Nephew of the Late Mr. Jose D. Leon Guerrero, (Oral testimony).
Francisco P. Camacho, General Manager, Port Authority of Guam, (Written testimony).
Michael Henderson, Public Information Officer, Port Authority of Guam, (Oral testimony).
Kenneth T. Jones, Jones & Guerrero Company, Inc., (Written testimony).
Antonio M. Palomo, private citizen, (Written testimony).
Elaine Cruz Jones, private citizen, (Written testimony).
Andrew C. Villagomez, Mayor of Mongmong-Toto-Maite, (Written testimony).

Ruth Leon Guerrero, daughter of the Late Mr. Jose D. Leon Guerrero, testified before the Committee **in favor** of Bill No. 6. Leon Guerrero orally presented her written testimony, in which she said that "the family appreciates the privilege of saluting this inspiring man in order to acknowledge his contributions, work of visions, and sacrifice as a pioneering leader who served the people of Guam before and after World War II."

Manny Duenas, nephew of the Late Mr. Jose D. Leon Guerrero, testified before the Committee **in favor** of Bill No. 6. Duenas said it is an esteemed privilege to have the Port named after his uncle. Despite those who are against the bill, Duenas said he feels that this tribute is worth for someone who has contributed a great deal to the organization.

Michael Henderson, Public Information Officer of the Port Authority of Guam, testified before the Committee on behalf of Francisco P. Camacho, General Manager of the Port, **not in favor** of Bill No. 6. Henderson orally presented Camacho's written testimony, in which Camacho said the name change would create problems for the Port. Camacho suggests naming the main cargo facility of the Port after Leon Guerrero.

Sen. Forbes said that there's nothing wrong with honoring an individual, and that a change isn't a bad thing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs finds that Bill No. 6 was created in honor of the late Jose D. Leon Guerrero, a former Executive General Manager and a contributing member of the Board of Directors at the Port Authority of Guam. Mr. Leon Guerrero was also an Assemblyman for the District of Santa Cruz and Mongmong, Toto, and Maite; a Councilman for Inarajan for the Guam Congress, and a Congressman of the First Guam Legislature. This act serves to rename the Port Authority of Guam with the respect and honor that is overdue to the Late Mr. Jose D. Leon Guerrero, which he has spent his expertise and wisdom in the development and growth of the Port Authority of Guam and the commercial advancement within the Port Authority's jurisdiction.

Accordingly, the Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs, to which Bill No. 6 was referred does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to I Mina' Bente Sais Na Liheslaturan Guahan **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 6** "An act to add §834 to Article 1 of Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated, Relative to renaming the Commercial Port of Guam as the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port."



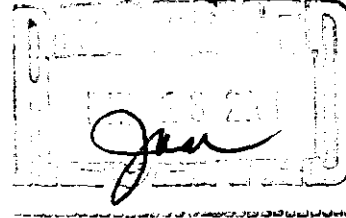

Hafa Adai Senator Forbes,

As you know, the Port Authority of Guam presented official testimony seeking to change the language of Bill No. 6, "An Act to add Subsection 834 to Article 1 of Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Renaming the Commercial Port of Guam as the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port." At that hearing you indicated that despite our objections, the bill would be reported out of committee as is.

This move would create some very serious problems for those who work and conduct business at the Port Authority of Guam. We are presenting the signatures of more than 350 of our employees, tenants and customers who do not wish to have the name of the Port Authority of Guam or the Port of Guam changed. I think you will agree that this is a very strong message that the people who make their living from the Port, and who are experts in the shipping industry, do not support the current wording of this Legislation.

We are also including a letter from the American Association of Port Authorities that reaffirms our contention that there are no other Ports in the world named after an individual. Sea vessels rely on international admiralty charts, which all list our only Port as the Port of Guam. Likewise, all manifests for cargo destined for our island are marked with Port Authority of Guam or the Port of Guam for clearance into a U.S. Port of entry.





Once again, we do wish to honor Mr. Leon Guerrero by naming our main cargo facility after him. We strongly urge you to incorporate the following language, which would only re-name the cargo terminal, prior to reporting this bill out of committee: "**Section 834. Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Terminal.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commercial port terminal facilities located at the Port Authority of Guam, Apra Harbor, Piti, Guam shall hereafter be known as the "Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Terminal." The Board of Directors of the Port Authority of Guam may cause to be erected appropriate signage designating the new name of the commercial port terminal facilities in addition to conducting those activities appropriate for commemorating and recognizing the historical contributions of Jose D. Leon Guerrero."

We do want to work with the committee to make this bill acceptable to everyone involved. Please do not hesitate to contact me should you need any further information.

**TESTIMONY ON BILL NUMBER 6 BEFORE THE COMMITTEE
ON RULES, GOVERNMENT REFORM AND REORGANIZATION,
FEDERAL, FOREIGN AND MILITARY AFFAIRS**

HAFADA AND GOOD AFTERNOON CHAIRMAN FORBES AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE, THE FAMILY OF JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN. THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY THIS AFTERNOON ON BILL NUMBER 6, "AN ACT TO ADD SUBSECTION 834 TO ARTICLE 1 OF TITLE 1 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO RENAMING THE COMMERCIAL PORT OF GUAM AS THE JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL PORT."

LET ME BEGIN BY STATING THAT THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM DOES NOT RECOGNIZE THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF MR. LEON GUERRERO IN ESTABLISHING THE CURRENT FACILITIES ON CABRAS ISLAND, AND WE DO SUPPORT HONORING HIM BY NAMING SOME OF THESE FACILITIES AFTER HIM. WE DO, HOWEVER, HAVE SOME PROBLEMS WITH THE CURRENT WORDING OF THE BILL.

TO BEGIN WITH, THE TITLE OF THE BILL CALLS FOR THE RENAMING OF THE "COMMERCIAL PORT OF GUAM." FURTHER IN THE BILL, REFERENCE IS MADE TO RENAMING THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM AS THE "JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL PORT." THIS IS JUST A TECHNICALITY AND CAN EASILY BE FIXED.

THE PORT BELIEVES THAT RENAMING THE AUTHORITY AND THE ENTIRE PORT MAY NOT BE APPROPRIATE FOR SEVERAL REASONS. THE FIRST AND MAIN REASON IS THAT THE PORT IS RECOGNIZED ON INTERNATIONAL ADMIRALTY CHARTS AS THE PORT OF GUAM, APRA HARBOR. CHANGING THE NAME WOULD REQUIRE CHANGES TO THE INTERNATIONAL CHARTS AND THAT WOULD CAUSE CONFUSION SINCE THERE IS NO MENTION OF GUAM IN THE PROPOSED NAME CHANGE. FURTHER, MARKETING OF THE PORT INTERNATIONALLY WOULD ALSO BE DIFFICULT SINCE THE NAME "JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL PORT" WOULD HAVE NO MEANING TO ANYONE NOT FROM GUAM.

WE ARE UNAWARE OF ANY PORT IN THE WORLD NAMED AFTER AN INDIVIDUAL. IN ALMOST EVERY CASE, THE PORT, AS A WHOLE, IS NAMED AFTER THE LOCATION - SUCH AS THE PORT OF TACOMA OR THE PORT OF SAN DIEGO OR THE PORT OF SINGAPORE. THE GOVERNING BODY IS ALWAYS THE PORT AUTHORITY OF THE LOCATION OR PORT DISTRICT.

MANY PORTS HAVE INDIVIDUAL TERMINALS WITHIN THEIR JURISDICTIONS, AND THESE ARE OFTEN NAMED AFTER THE COMPANY OPERATING THEM. IN THE PORT OF LONG BEACH FOR EXAMPLE, THERE ARE SOME 33 TERMINALS. THEY ARE NAMED AFTER THE COMPANIES THAT LEASE AND OPERATE THEM SUCH AS HANJIN OR MAERSK OR SEALAND. LIKEWISE, MATSON OPERATES THE SAND ISLAND TERMINAL IN THE OAHU PORT DISTRICT IN HAWAII.

THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM CURRENTLY ONLY HAS ONE CONTAINER TERMINAL THAT IS OPERATED BY THE GOVERNMENT. NAMING IT AFTER ONE OF THE PORT'S FOUNDERS IS, IN THE PORT'S OPINION, A GOOD IDEA.

THE CURRENT WORDING OF THE BILL CALLS FOR THE RENAMING OF THE ENTIRE AUTHORITY. WE BELIEVE THAT THIS WOULD CREATE A LOT OF PROBLEMS WHEN DEALING WITH OFF-ISLAND BUSINESSES. IF THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM WERE TO CONTACT OFF-ISLAND BUSINESSES AS THE "JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL PORT AUTHORITY", IT WOULD CAUSE A LOT OF CONFUSION AND AGAIN ANYONE FROM OFF-ISLAND WOULD HAVE NO REFERENCE AS TO WHERE WE ARE FROM.

WE PROPOSE NAMING THE CURRENT MAIN TERMINAL, WHICH ENCOMPASSES PIERS F-3 THROUGH F-6, ALL OF THE CURRENT WAREHOUSES AND THE 26.5-ACRE CONTAINER YARD, THE "JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO CARGO TERMINAL." WE ALSO RECOMMEND CHANGING THE WORDING OF THE BILL TO KEEP THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM AS THE NAME OF THE GOVERNING BODY.

WE HAVE ATTACHED A MAP OF THE PROPOSED TERMINAL AREA FOR THE COMMITTEE'S REVIEW. THE PORT WILL SUPPORT THE MEASURE TO RENAME THE FACILITY, BUT NOT THE AUTHORITY AS A WHOLE.

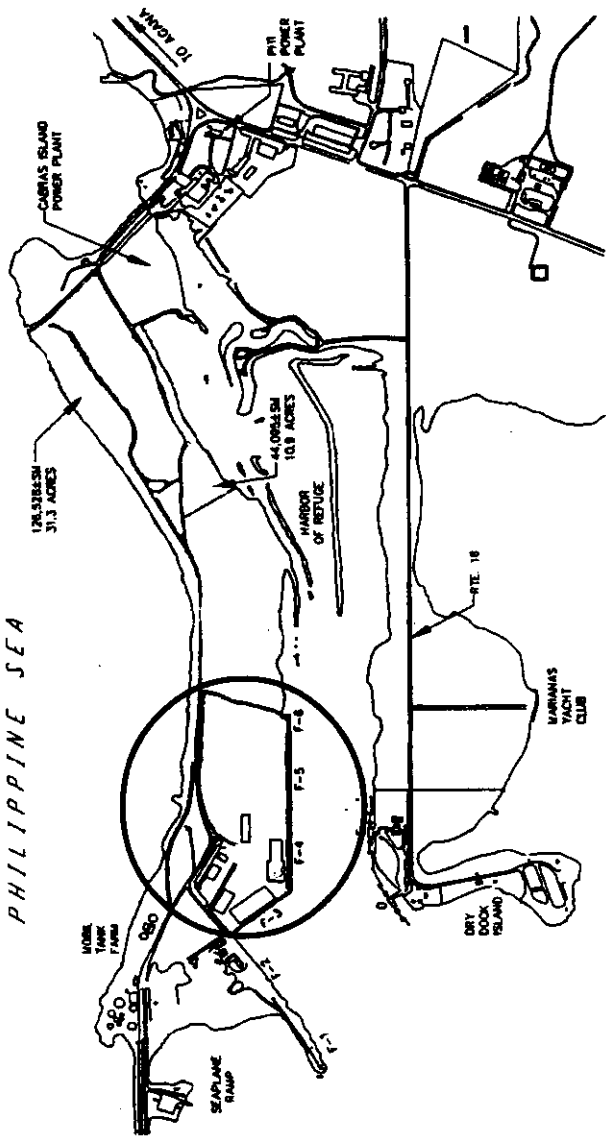

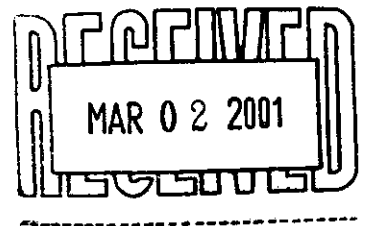
Dear Mr. Chairman and distinguished committee members:

As you know, the Port Authority of Guam presented official testimony seeking to change the language of Bill No. 6, "An Act to add Subsection 834 to Article 1 of Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Renaming the Commercial Port of Guam as the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port." At that hearing you indicated that despite our objections, the bill would be reported out of committee as is.

This move would create some very serious problems for those who work and conduct business at the Port Authority of Guam. We are presenting the signatures of more than 350 of our employees, tenants and customers who do not wish to have the name of the Port Authority of Guam or the Port of Guam changed. I think you will agree that this is a very strong message that the people who make their living from the Port, and who are experts in the shipping industry, do not support the current wording of this Legislation.

We are also including a letter from the American Association of Port Authorities that reaffirms our contention that there are no other Ports in the world named after an individual. Sea vessels rely on international admiralty charts, which all list our only Port as the Port of Guam. Likewise, all manifests for cargo destined for our island are marked with Port Authority of Guam or the Port of Guam for clearance into a U.S. Port of entry.





Once again, we do wish to honor Mr. Leon Guerrero by naming our main cargo facility after him. We strongly urge you to incorporate the following language, which would only re-name the cargo terminal, prior to reporting this bill out of committee: "**Section 834. Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Terminal.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commercial port terminal facilities located at the Port Authority of Guam, Apra Harbor, Piti, Guam shall hereafter be known as the "Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Terminal." HABA ADAI AND GOOD AFTERNOON CHAIRMAN FORBES AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE, THE FAMILY OF JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN. THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY THIS AFTERNOON ON BILL NUMBER 6, "AN ACT TO ADD SUBSECTION 834 TO ARTICLE 1 OF TITLE 1 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO RENAMING THE COMMERCIAL PORT OF GUAM AS THE JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL PORT."

LET ME BEGIN BY STATING THAT THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM DOES RECOGNIZE THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF MR. LEON GUERRERO IN ESTABLISHING THE CURRENT FACILITIES ON CABRAS ISLAND, AND WE DO SUPPORT HONORING HIM BY NAMING SOME OF THESE FACILITIES AFTER HIM. WE DO, HOWEVER, HAVE SOME PROBLEMS WITH THE CURRENT WORDING OF THE BILL.

TO BEGIN WITH, THE TITLE OF THE BILL CALLS FOR THE RENAMING OF THE "COMMERCIAL PORT OF GUAM." THE COMMERCIAL PORT HAS NOT BEEN IN EXISTENCE SINCE 1975 WHEN THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM WAS CREATED AS AN AUTONOMOUS AGENCY OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM. FURTHER IN THE BILL, REFERENCE IS MADE TO RENAMING THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM AS THE "JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL PORT." THIS IS JUST A TECHNICALITY AND CAN EASILY BE FIXED.

THE PORT BELIEVES THAT RENAMING THE AUTHORITY AND THE ENTIRE PORT MAY NOT BE APPROPRIATE FOR SEVERAL REASONS. THE FIRST AND MAIN REASON IS THAT THE PORT IS RECOGNIZED ON INTERNATIONAL ADMIRALTY CHARTS AS THE PORT OF GUAM, APRA HARBOR. CHANGING THE NAME WOULD REQUIRE CHANGES TO THE INTERNATIONAL CHARTS AND THAT WOULD CAUSE CONFUSION SINCE THERE IS NO MENTION OF GUAM IN THE PROPOSED NAME CHANGE. FURTHER, MARKETING OF THE PORT INTERNATIONALLY WOULD ALSO BE DIFFICULT SINCE THE NAME "JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL PORT" WOULD HAVE NO MEANING TO ANYONE NOT FROM GUAM.

WE ARE UNAWARE OF ANY PORT IN THE WORLD NAMED AFTER AN INDIVIDUAL. IN ALMOST EVERY CASE, THE PORT, AS A WHOLE, IS NAMED AFTER THE LOCATION - SUCH AS THE PORT OF TACOMA OR THE PORT OF SAN DIEGO OR THE PORT OF SINGAPORE. THE GOVERNING BODY IS ALWAYS THE PORT AUTHORITY OF THE LOCATION OR PORT DISTRICT.

MANY PORTS HAVE INDIVIDUAL TERMINALS WITHIN THEIR JURISDICTIONS, AND THESE ARE OFTEN NAMED AFTER THE COMPANY OPERATING THEM. IN THE PORT OF LONG BEACH FOR EXAMPLE, THERE ARE SOME 33 TERMINALS. THEY ARE NAMED AFTER THE COMPANIES THAT LEASE AND OPERATE THEM SUCH AS HANJIN OR MAERSK OR SEALAND. LIKEWISE, MATSON OPERATES THE SAND ISLAND TERMINAL IN THE OAHU PORT DISTRICT IN HAWAII.

THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM CURRENTLY ONLY HAS ONE CONTAINER TERMINAL THAT IS OPERATED BY THE GOVERNMENT. NAMING IT AFTER ONE OF THE PORT'S FOUNDERS IS, IN THE PORT'S OPINION, A GOOD IDEA.

THE CURRENT WORDING OF THE BILL CALLS FOR THE RENAMING OF THE ENTIRE AUTHORITY. WE BELIEVE THAT THIS WOULD CREATE A LOT OF PROBLEMS WHEN DEALING WITH OFF-ISLAND BUSINESSES. IF THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM WERE TO CONTACT OFF-ISLAND BUSINESSES AS THE "JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL PORT AUTHORITY", IT WOULD CAUSE A LOT OF CONFUSION AND AGAIN ANYONE FROM OFF-ISLAND WOULD HAVE NO REFERENCE AS TO WHERE WE ARE FROM.

WE PROPOSE NAMING THE CURRENT MAIN TERMINAL, WHICH ENCOMPASSES PIERS F-3 THROUGH F-6, ALL OF THE CURRENT WAREHOUSES AND THE 26.5-ACRE CONTAINER YARD, THE "JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO CARGO TERMINAL." WE ALSO RECOMMEND CHANGING THE WORDING OF THE BILL TO KEEP THE PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM AS THE NAME OF THE GOVERNING BODY.

WE HAVE ATTACHED A MAP OF THE PROPOSED TERMINAL AREA FOR THE COMMITTEE'S REVIEW. THE PORT WILL SUPPORT THE MEASURE TO RENAME THE FACILITY, BUT NOT THE AUTHORITY AS A WHOLE.

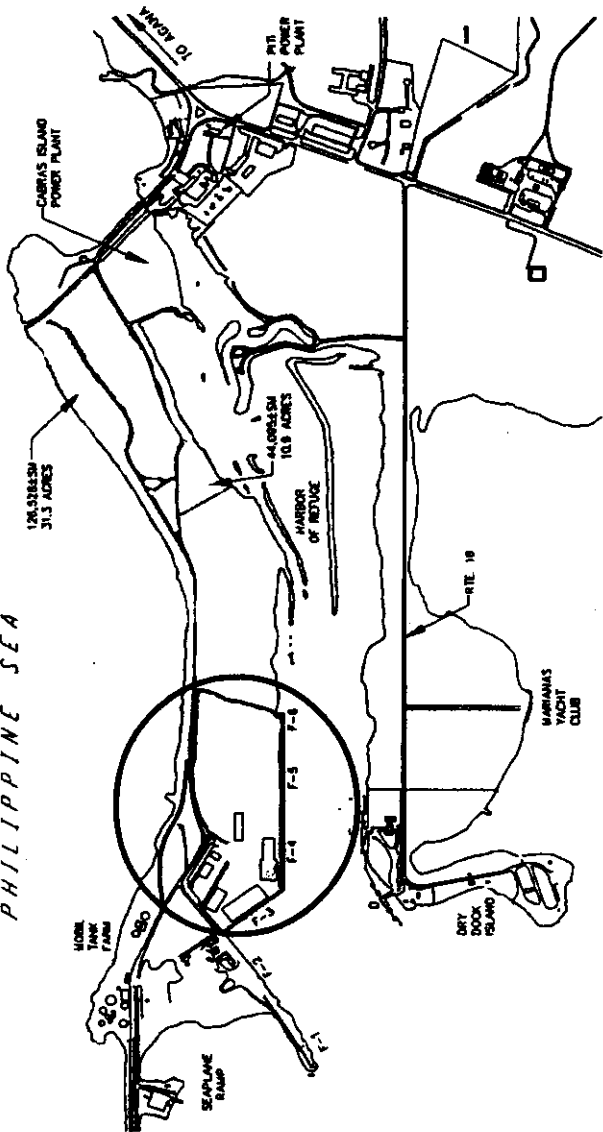

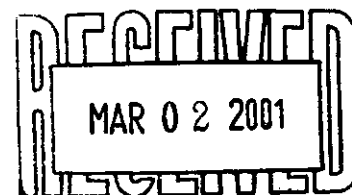
Dear Mr. Chairman and distinguished committee members:

Dear Mr. Chairman and distinguished committee members:

My name is Kenneth T. Jones Jr. of Jones and Guerrero Company, Inc. and I welcome the opportunity to voice my support to rename the Commercial Port of Guam in honor of the late Jose D. Leon Guerrero. Fifty-seven years of living and working on Guam put me in touch with people from every walk of life, and high on my list of esteemed persons is Jose D. Leon Guerrero. The lifeline of our business operations through the decades has been our freight that passes through Commercial Port into our warehouses. When "Shorty" Guerrero was at the helm at the port, his hands-on leadership expedited the efficient and rapid dispatch of our freight, and, if any unforeseen problems cropped up, the only thing necessary was a telephone call to Mr. Guerrero and the problem was solved.

Examples to justify honoring this man are too numerous, but I would like to single out one very significant event in our lives. In the aftermath of Typhoon Karen, J&G found itself with a newly arrived shipment of kerosene, rice, sugar and cooking oil, staples the people badly needed. I wanted to distribute the goods to every village on the island, and, I wanted to make sure that the people who needed them most received them. The job called for a man who was totally honest, unselfish, hardworking and wholly sensitive to peoples' feelings. To me that special person was "Shorty" Guerrero. As a favor I asked him if he would be in charge of distributing the foodstuffs to the villagers. There was not the slightest bit of hesitation to his acceptance. He rode in the front seat of every truck bringing goods to the villages, and, with the help of each parish priest, food and kerosene made its way into the hands of the needy.

It is fitting that Mr. Guerrero be honored in this very distinguished manner, because, a man as respected as he is for his dedication to his island and his people merits our gratitude and our commemoration.

I am here to endorse passage of Bill No. 6, a measure to honor the late Jose D. Leon Guerrero by naming the Port Authority of Guam after this illustrious leader.

Mr. Leon Guerrero was among those unique individuals who guided the destiny of Guam for at least half a century, from the 1930s when he was an active member of the House of Assembly, predecessor of the Guam Legislature. He was a strong proponent for the establishment of civil government in Guam and the extension of United States citizenship to the people of Guam. He was a member of the First Guam Legislature, the legislative body that initiated some of the fundamental laws that we still follow today.


For many years, Mr. Guerrero was director of the Department of Commerce when there were only a handful of executive departments — not more than nine, I believe. One of the major divisions of the Department of Commerce was the Commerce Port of Guam, now a separate entity named Port Authority of Guam. He guided this major function of government from its infancy in the 1950s to its maturity in later years.

Mr. Guerrero was a friend and advisor to all our early governors, from Carlton Skinner, Ford Q. Elvidge, Richard Barrett Lowe, and Joseph Flores.

Mr. Guerrero was a true pioneer in our government and certainly deserves this recognition.

I ask you and all members of this legislature to pass this legislation. It would be a recognition of Mr. Guerrero's immense contribution to the betterment of our government and the welfare of our people.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs held a public hearing on Friday, March 2, 2001 at 2:00 p.m. at the Conference Room, Office of Senator Mark Forbes, I Liheslaturan Guahan. Public Notice was advertised on the Pacific Daily News on Wednesday, 2/21/01, Thursday, 3/1/01 and Friday, 3/2/01.

Ruth Leon Guerrero, daughter of the Late Mr. Jose D. Leon Guerrero, testified before the Committee **in favor** of Bill No. 6. Leon Guerrero orally presented her written testimony, in which she said that "the family appreciates the privilege of saluting this inspiring man in order to acknowledge his contributions, work of visions, and sacrifice as a pioneering leader who served the people of Guam before and after World War II."

Manny Duenas, nephew of the Late Mr. Jose D. Leon Guerrero, testified before the Committee **in favor** of Bill No. 6. Duenas said it is an esteemed privilege to have the Port named after his uncle. Despite those who are against the bill, Duenas said he feels that this tribute is worth for someone who has contributed a great deal to the organization.

Michael Henderson, Public Information Officer of the Port Authority of Guam, testified before the Committee on behalf of Francisco P. Camacho, General Manager of the Port, **not in favor** of Bill No. 6. Henderson orally presented Camacho's written testimony, in which Camacho said the name change would create problems for the Port. Camacho suggests naming the main cargo facility of the Port after Leon Guerrero.

Sen. Forbes said that there's nothing wrong with honoring an individual, and that a change isn't a bad thing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs finds that Bill No. 6 was created in honor of the late Jose D. Leon Guerrero, a former Executive General Manager and a contributing member of the Board of Directors at the Port Authority of Guam. Mr. Leon Guerrero was also an Assemblyman for the District of Santa Cruz and Mongmong, Toto, and Maite; a Councilman for Inarajan for the Guam Congress, and a Congressman of the First Guam Legislature. This act serves to rename the Port Authority of Guam with the respect and honor that is overdue to the Late Mr. Jose D. Leon Guerrero, which he has spent his expertise and wisdom in the development and growth of the Port Authority of Guam and the commercial advancement within the Port Authority's jurisdiction.

**AN ACT TO ADD §834 TO ARTICLE 1 OF TITLE 1 OF
THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO
RENAMING THE COMMERCIAL PORT OF GUAM AS
THE JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERCIAL
PORT.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds

that the late Senator Jose D. Leon Guerrero served the people of Guam honorably in both the Guam Congress and First Guam Legislature. After serving in both in the Guam Congress and the Guam Legislature, he also served in other capacities such as: Administrative Assistant for the Department of Finance, Assistant Director of Commerce, Director of Commerce, Chief of Customs and Director of the Commercial Port. His leadership and dedication to serving the people of Guam also extended into his involvement in numerous civic and community based organizations.

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to commemorate and honor the memory and contributions of the late Jose D. Leon Guerrero by renaming the Port Authority of Guam to the "Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port."

Section 2. Section 834 is hereby added to Chapter 8, Article 1 of Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

1 **“Section 834. Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port.** The Port
2 Authority of Guam, located at Apra Harbor, shall hereafter be known as the “Jose D.
3 Leon Guerrero Commercial Port.” Any provisions in the laws of Guam referring to
4 the Port Authority of Guam are hereby deemed to read the “Jose D. Leon Guerrero
5 Commercial Port.” *I Maga’lahen Guåhan*, and the General Manager of the Port
6 Authority of Guam shall cause to be erected appropriate nameplates or signs
7 designating the Port Authority of Guam as the “Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial
8 Port.” Furthermore, at such ceremony as *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* and the General
9 Manager of the Port Authority of Guam deem appropriate, the “Jose D. Leon
10 Guerrero Commercial Port” shall be officially named and a plaque bearing the name,
11 picture and brief history of the contributions made by the late Jose D. Leon Guerrero
12 shall be affixed within a suitable spot at, in or around the port authority building.
