

AN ACT TO *ADD* ARTICLE 13 TO CHAPTER 5 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING MINIMUM AND PREVAILING WAGE DETERMINATIONS, LEAVE REQUIREMENTS AND BENEFIT REQUIREMENTS FOR EMPLOYEES OF SERVICE AND OTHER CONTRACTORS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM.

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### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

**Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that there are no prevailing wages, or set benefits, established for employees of private contractors awarded service and other contracts by the government of Guam, *except* to the extent that the minimum wage law applies, and specifically to the extent that the Federal prevailing wage applies to construction contractors.

8 This lack of minimum standards sets an insecure and uneven playing 9 field for businesses wishing to do business with the government of Guam in 10 the service area. Moreover, and more critically, it forcefully depresses wages 11 and benefits among employees of firms doing business with the government 12 of Guam, as firms are compelled to reduce bids in order to remain 13 competitive with other bidders. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds this to be 14 inequitable and detrimental for the employees of these private firms.

Section 2. Article 13 is hereby *added* to Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam
Code Annotated to read as follows:

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### "ARTICLE 13.

#### WAGE AND BENEFIT DETERMINATION.

19 Section 5801. Wage Determination Established. In such 20 cases where the government of Guam enters into contractual 21 arrangements with a sole proprietorship, a partnership or a corporation 22 ('contractor') for the provision of a service to the government of Guam, 23 and in such cases where the contractor employs a person(s) whose 24 purpose, in whole or in part, is the direct delivery of service contracted

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by the government of Guam, then the contractor shall pay such employee(s) in accordance with the Wage Determination for Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands issued and promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor for such labor as is employed in the direct delivery of contract deliverables to the government of Guam.

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The Wage Determination most recently issued by the U.S. 6 7 Department of Labor at the time a contract is awarded to a contractor by 8 the government of Guam shall be used to determine wages, which shall be paid to employees pursuant to this Article. Should any contract 9 10 contain a renewal clause, then at the time of renewal adjustments, there 11 shall be made stipulations contained in that contract for applying the 12 Wage Determination, as required by this Article, so that the Wage 13 Determination promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor on a date 14 most recent to the renewal date shall apply.

15 Section 5802. Benefits. In addition the Wage to 16 Determination detailed in this Article, any contract to which this Article 17 applies shall also contain provisions mandating health and similar 18 benefits for employees covered by this Article, such benefits having a 19 minimum value as detailed in the Wage Determination issued and 20 promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor, and shall contain 21 provisions guaranteeing a *minimum* of ten (10) paid holidays per annum 22 per employee.

Section 5803. Department of Labor Monitoring and
 Penalizing Authority. The Guam Department of Labor, or its
 successor, shall monitor compliance with the provisions of this Article.

The Director of the Department of Labor, or that person's successor, shall investigate possible or reported violations of the provisions of this Article, and shall forward such findings to the Chief Procurement Officer of the General Services Agency, or that person's successor.

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The Department of Labor, or its successor, shall promulgate rules 5 and regulations, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, as 6 7 needed to ensure the equitable investigation of violations and the maintenance of due process, as well as the assessment of monetary 8 9 penalties in the event of a violation, providing that such monetary 10 penalties shall be limited to the assessment of daily penalties of no less 11 than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per day, and no more than One 12 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per day, until such time as a violation has 13 been corrected, as well as the payment of all back wages and benefits 14 due.

15 Section 5804. **Probation and Appeal.** A contractor who 16 violates the provisions of this Article, as determined by the process 17 authorized in § 5803 of this Article, may be placed on a probationary 18 status by the Chief Procurement Officer of the General Services Agency, 19 or its successor, for a period of one (1) year. During such probationary 20 status, a contractor shall not be awarded any contract by any 21 instrumentality of the government of Guam. A contractor who has been 22 placed on probationary status pursuant to this Article, or who has been 23 assessed a monetary penalty pursuant to this Article, may appeal such 24 penalty or probationary status to the Superior Court of Guam."

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### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 Section 1. Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that there are no 3 prevailing wages, or set benefits established for employees of private 4 contractors awarded service and other contracts by the government of Guam 5 except to the extent that the minimum wage law applies and specifically to

the extent that the federal prevailing wage applies to construction contractors. 1 This lack of minimum standards sets an insecure and uneven playing field for 2 businesses wishing to do business with the government of Guam in the 3 service area. Moreover and more critically, it forcefully depresses wages and 4 benefits among employees of firms doing business with the government of 5 Guam, as firms are compelled to reduce bids in order to remain competitive 6 with other bidders. I Liheslatura finds this to be inequitable and detrimental 7 for the employees of these private firms. 8

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Section 2. A new Article 13 is added to Chapter 5, Division 1, 5CGA to
 read:

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## "Article 13

#### WAGE AND BENEFIT DETERMINATION

Section 5801. Wage determination established. In such cases where 14 the government of Guam enters into contractual arrangements with a sole 15 proprietorship, a partnership or a corporation (hereinafter referred to as the 16 contractor) for the provision of a service to the government of Guam, and in 17 such cases where the contractor employs a person or persons whose purpose, 18 in whole or in part, is the direct delivery of service contracted by the 19 government of Guam, then the contractor shall pay such employee or 20 employees in accordance with the Wage Determination for Guam and the 21 Northern Marianas Islands issued and promulgated by the United States 22 Department of Labor for such labor as is employed in the direct delivery of 23 contract deliverables to the government of Guam. The Wage Determination 24 most recently issued by the United States Department of Labor at the time a 25

contract is awarded to a contractor by the government of Guam shall be used to determine wages which shall be paid to employees pursuant to this Article. Should any contract contain a renewal clause, then at the time of renewal adjustments shall be made to stipulations contained in that contract for application of the Wage Determination as required by this Article so that the Wage Determination promulgated by the United States Department of Labor on a date most recent to the renewal date shall apply.

8 Section 5802. Benefits. In addition to the Wage Determination detailed 9 in this Article, any contract to which this Article applies shall also contain 10 provisions mandating health and similar benefits for employees covered by 11 this article, such benefits having a minimum value of as detailed in the Wage 12 Determination issued and promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor and 13 shall contain provisions guaranteeing a minimum of ten (10) paid holidays 14 per annum per employee.

Section 5803. Department of Labor to monitor and assess penalties 15 for violations. The Guam Department of Labor, or its successor, shall 16 monitor compliance with the provisions of this Article. The Director of the 17 Department of Labor, or his successor, shall investigate possible or reported 18 violations of the provisions of this Article and shall forward such findings to 19 the Chief Procurement Officer of the General Services Agency, or his 20 successor. The Department of Labor, or its successor, shall promulgate rules 21 and regulations, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Act, as needed 22 to ensure the equitable investigation of violations and the maintenance of due 23 process, as well as the assessment of monetary penalties in the event of a 24

violation, providing that such monetary penalties shall be limited to the
assessment of daily penalties of no less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per
day and no more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per day, until such
time as a violation has been corrected, as well as the payment of all back
wages and benefits due.

Section 5804. Probation and appeal. A contractor who violates the 6 provisions of this Article, as determined by the process authorized in section 7 5803. of this Article, may be placed on a probationary status by the Chief 8 Procurement Officer of the General Services Agency, or its successor, for a 9 period of one (1) year. During such probationary status, a contractor shall not 10 be awarded any contract by any instrumentality of the government of Guam. 11 A contractor who has been placed on probationary status pursuant to this 12 Article, or who has been assessed a monetary penalty pursuant to this Article, 13 may appeal such penalty or probationary status to the Superior Court of 14 Guam." 15

### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Individuals appearing before the Committee to present oral and written testimony on the bill are as follows:

Monty McDowell, Director, Chamber of Commerce and General Manager of Advance Management Inc. (Oral testimony).

Jeff Jones, Director, Chamber of Commerce and Executive Vice President of Triple J Ent. (Oral testimony).

Mr. Monty McDowell, Director, Chamber of Commerce and General Manager of Advance Management Inc., testified before the Committee in support of Bill No. 323. Mr. McDowell said the bill allows standards for service providers of the government of Guam for wage standards and benefits packages for employees of those service providers. He said service providers currently bidding with the government of Guam bid with the least amount of money for their employees and very little in the way of a benefits package. He said the bill will allow GovGuam to have compassionate outsourcing and compassionate privatization.

Jeff Jones, Director, Chamber of Commerce and Executive Vice President of Triple J Ent., testified before the Committee in support of Bill No. 323. Mr. Jones said that it is important that this bill is passed as soon as possible so that we can move forward on implementing it with various contracts.

## **III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION**

The Committee on Rules, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, and Federal, Foreign and General Affairs finds that Bill No. 323 is a desirable measure that ensures that private sector employees who work for contractors of the government of Guam are treated fairly and equitably, and in this time of economic crisis, such a measure is crucial.

BENEFIT LEAVE REOUIREMENTS AND **REOUIREMENTS FOR EMPLOYEES OF SERVICE CONTRACTORS** AND **OTHER** OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM IN ORDER TO ENSURE EQUITABLE TREATMENT OF PRIVATE SECTOR EMPLOYEES AND A LEVEL PLAYING FIELD FOR ALL CONTRACTORS DOING BUSINESS WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM.

### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

Section 1. Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that there are no prevailing wages, or set benefits established for employees of private contractors awarded service and other contracts by the government of Guam except to the extent that the minimum wage law applies and specifically to the

extent that the federal prevailing wage applies to construction contractors. 1 This lack of minimum standards sets an insecure and uneven playing field for 2 businesses wishing to do business with the government of Guam in the 3 service area. Moreover and more critically, it forcefully depresses wages and 4 benefits among employees of firms doing business with the government of 5 Guam, as firms are compelled to reduce bids in order to remain competitive 6 with other bidders. I Liheslatura finds this to be inequitable and detrimental 7 for the employees of these private firms. 8

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Section 2. A new Article 13 is added to Chapter 5, Division 1, 5CGA to
 read:

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### "Article 13

#### WAGE AND BENEFIT DETERMINATION

Section 5801. Wage determination established. In such cases where 14 the government of Guam enters into contractual arrangements with a sole 15 proprietorship, a partnership or a corporation (hereinafter referred to as the 16 contractor) for the provision of a service to the government of Guam, and in 17 such cases where the contractor employs a person or persons whose purpose, 18 in whole or in part, is the direct delivery of service contracted by the 19 government of Guam, then the contractor shall pay such employee or 20 employees in accordance with the Wage Determination for Guam and the 21 Northern Marianas Islands issued and promulgated by the United States 22 23 Department of Labor for such labor as is employed in the direct delivery of 24 contract deliverables to the government of Guam. The Wage Determination

most recently issued by the United States Department of Labor at the time a 1 contract is awarded to a contractor by the government of Guam shall be used 2 to determine wages which shall be paid to employees pursuant to this Article. 3 Should any contract contain a renewal clause, then at the time of renewal 4 adjustments shall be made to stipulations contained in that contract for 5 application of the Wage Determination as required by this Article so that the 6 Wage Determination promulgated by the United States Department of Labor 7 on a date most recent to the renewal date shall apply. 8

Section 5802. Benefits. In addition to the Wage Determination detailed in this Article, any contract to which this Article applies shall also contain provisions mandating health and similar benefits for employees covered by this article, such benefits having a minimum value of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) per hour per employee and shall contain provisions guaranteeing a minimum of ten (10) paid holidays per annum per employee.

Section 5803. Department of Labor to monitor. The Guam Department of Labor, or its successor, shall monitor compliance with the provisions of this Article. The Director of the Department of Labor, or his successor, shall investigate possible or reported violations of the provisions of this Article and shall forward such findings to the Chief Procurement Officer of the General Services Agency, or his successor.

Section 5804. Penalties. Violation of the provisions of this Article on the part of a contractor shall constitute grounds to void such contract. A contractor who violates the provisions of this Article shall be placed on a probationary status by the Chief Procurement Officer of the General Services
